SPOTLIGHT on SPORTS

Friday night the Iowa Park Hawks of 1952 traveled to Munday to battle with the Moguls. The Munday band gave a fine performance before the opening kickoff.

On the first kickoff of the new season the Moguls started the scoring when Gene Hayie took the kick, dropped it, picked it up again and came roaring down the left side of the field. He traveled about 70 yards for a touchdown without a hand being laid upon him. The try for extra point was short and wide to the right.

Munday kicked off to the Hawks and they were able to do almost anything in the middle of the field. From their spread formation they ran and passed at will. They moved to the Mogul 13 yard line when Lee Roy Weiss tossed a pass to Howard Klinkerman. Interference was detected and the Hawks had scored a touchdown. That tied the score at 6.

Shortly before the half ended, Weiss sailed a long pass down the field that Larry Lee captured and ran over for a touchdown. Lee was in the clear and scored standing up untouched, making the score 12 to 6 at the half.

In the third quarter the game was much the same. The Hawks moved up and down the field, and three times penetrated the Mogul 10 yard line, but the big Munday line withstood the Hawks and took over on down.

In the fourth stanza the Moguls put on a sustained 78 yard drive to score a touchdown that tied the score at 12. Then on the extra point try, Charles Ratliff passed to Tommy Ratliff for the game winning tally.

Friday night in Valley View the Hawks will tangle with the Warriors, who bowed to Holliday last Friday night.

Gun Hobby Turned Into Bullet Factory

The Sisk Bullet Shop, located at the old Brubaker Lumber site, is owned by Ralph E. Sisk, a native of Wichita county. He was born to the late Mr. and Mrs. J. B. Sisk in the Allendale community, who had come here in 1889. The Sisk family moved to Iowa Park in 1910.

Ralph married Miss Nell King, a teacher in the Allendale school, on Sept. 15, 1918. He worked in the oilfield as a trucker and always carried a gun with him.

Ralph wasn't satisfied with the large caliber rifles and bullets he had to use in shooting game. He met a Capt. Watkins in the army who had invented a .22 center fire rifle, and Ralph made the bullets to fit this rifle.

The depression came along and Mr. Sisk started making his hobby into a sideline. He ran an ad in a sporting magazine in July 1932 for \$4.50 and he sold \$8 worth of bullets from the ad. The business has now grown into a full time job.

He maintained his shop at his home on North Wall until 1948 when he moved the shop into its present quarters on South Bond. The business employs four workers.

Mr. Sisk has a trophy room with a display of animals killed with Sisk bullets: deer from South Texas and Colorado; elk from Colorado; antelope from Wyoming; javania from Laredo; and several coyote hides. There is also an accuracy display from all over the United States.

Sisk bullets are widely advertised and as a result orders come from all parts of America, Canada, Alaska and Mexico. Most of the business is mail order.

For the past 10 years Mr. and Mrs. Sisk have taken hunting trips to various places in Colorado, Wyoming, New Mexico and Texas. Mrs. Sisk has killed several deer, antelopes and coyotes on these excursions. She is bookkeeper for the firm and is proud of what Ralph has chosen to make his life work.

The Sisks have one son Ralph Jr. of Wichita Falls, and two daughters: Betty of Denver, Colo., and Ann of Dallas.

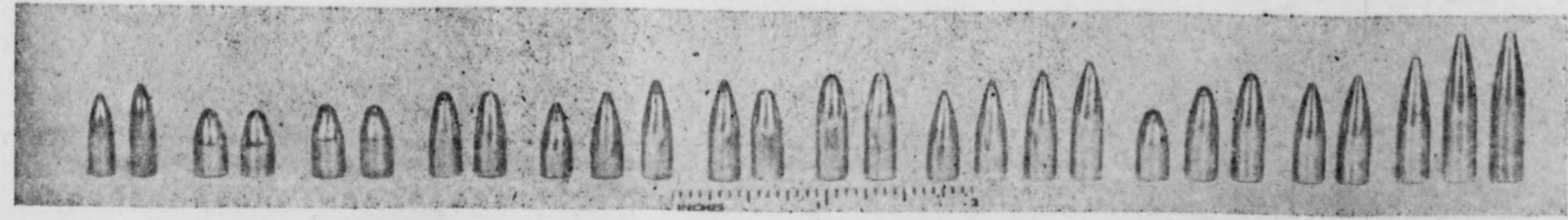

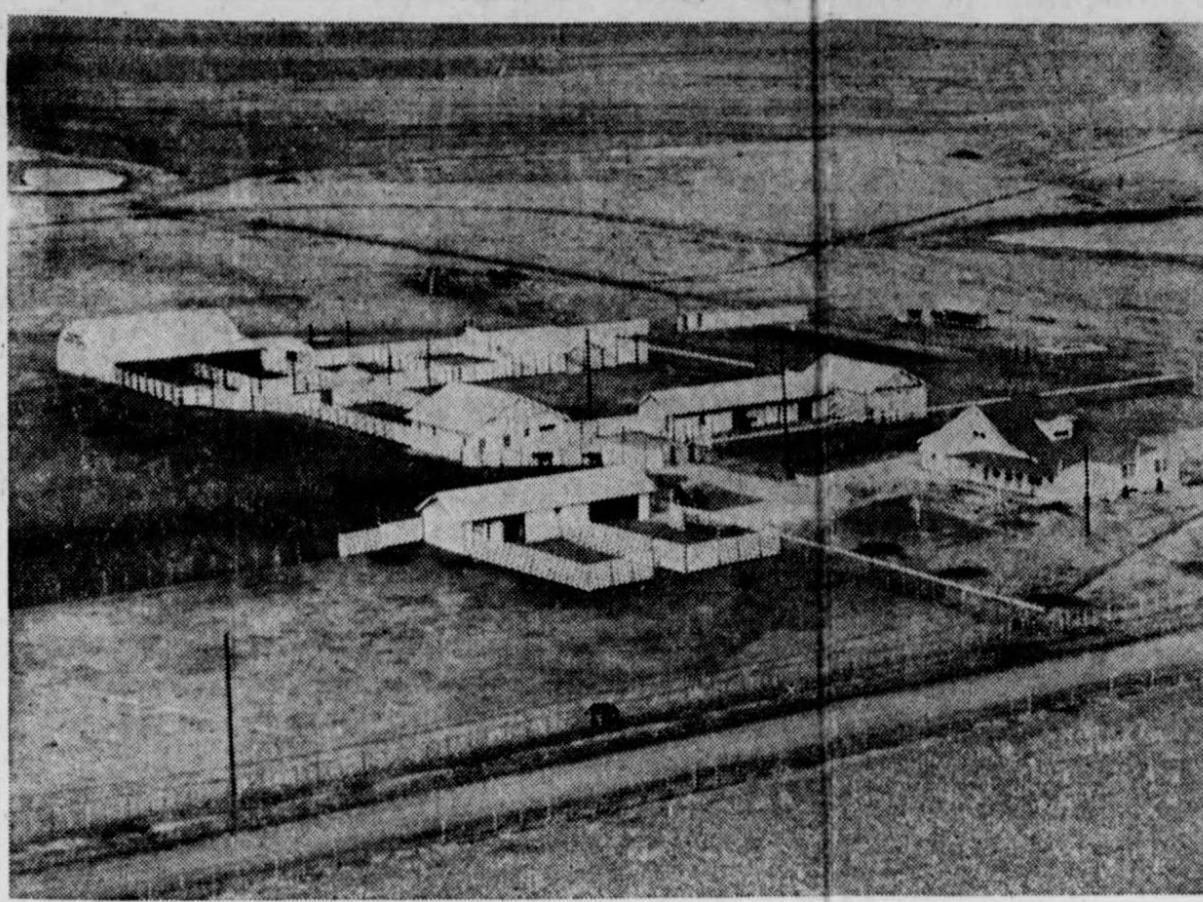
