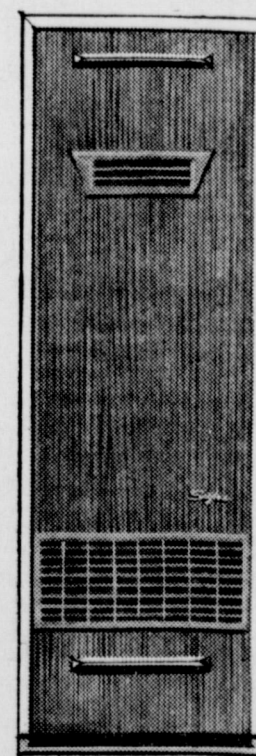

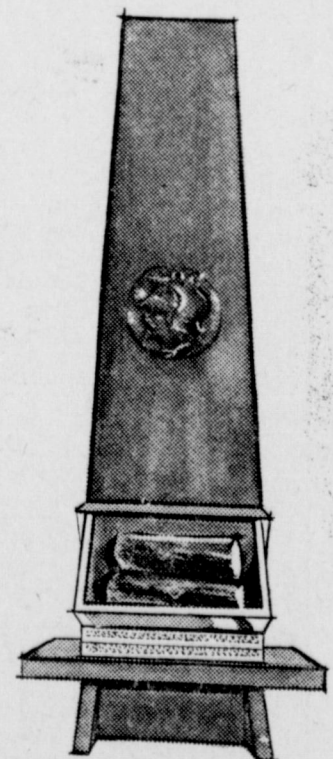

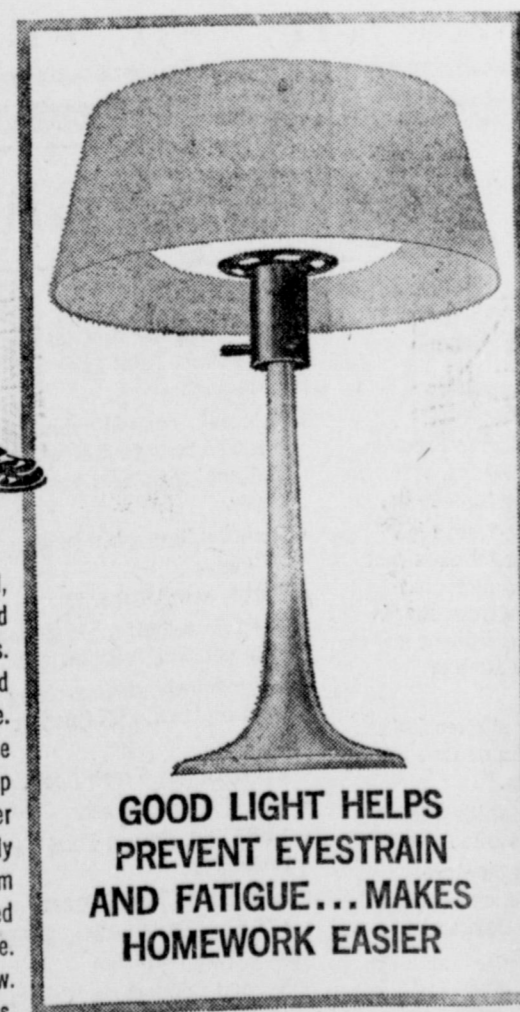

It should be properly shaded to shield the light source from the eyes. A diffusing bowl is recommended to soften the light and prevent glare. Check your children's study light now.
