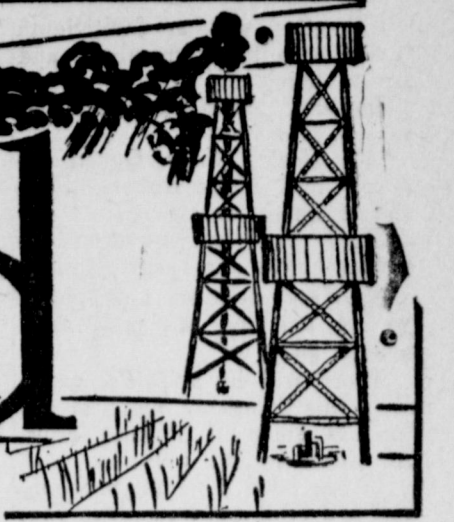

Council Calls 1c Sales Tax Election

The City Council voted Monday night to call an election for Nov. 23, 1968, for the purpose of voting on a 1 per cent sales tax. The following statement was released following the meeting:

"Because of the mounting cost of maintenance and operation of the city, we are in need of additional revenue to continue to provide all the services we have provided in the past. The City Council feels that the best method of deriving additional revenue would be for Iowa Park to have a 1 per cent sales tax as many other towns have, and because of this feeling we are calling an election for Nov. 23, 1968, to decide this issue. We feel that this is one of the fairest taxes and a needed source of additional revenue."

Voting place for Prec. 32 will be Kidwell school and for Prec. 33, Bradford school.

This probably means residents of the City who are registered to vote in the two Precincts mentioned.

C.H. Bentley Appointed Alderman

Charles Bentley was made an alderman Monday night at City Council meeting and was named Police Commissioner. He replaced Bill Kidd, who resigned recently.

Mrs. E. F. Soell and Mrs. James A. Sewell, representing the Iowa Park Garden club, met with the Council to request that group to declare Iowa Park a bird sanctuary. It was voted to pass such an ordinance.

City Sets Annexation Hearing

ORDINANCE NO. 122
This is an ordinance providing for a public hearing for annexation of the hereinafter described territory to the City of Iowa Park, Texas, and extending the boundary limits of said city so as to include said hereinafter described property within said city limits; and providing for a date, time, and place for a Public Hearing for all interested persons to be heard and giving notice of such public hearing by publication in a newspaper, providing said notice shall be published at least once in said newspaper not more than twenty (20) days nor less than ten (10) days prior to the date of the hearing, and providing for the effective date of this ordinance; and

Whereas, the Iowa Park Independent School District has requested of the City of Iowa Park, Texas, that said City annex the hereinafter described territory surrounding and upon which there will be constructed a high school, and extend the boundary limits of said city so as to include said school and school grounds, so that said school grounds, being the hereinafter described territory, shall be situated within said city limits; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Iowa Park, Texas:

Section 1. That the East boundary line of the land hereinafter described which adjoins or borders Johnson Road on the West and is in such close proximity to the West boundary line of the West city limits of said city and being within the extra-territorial jurisdiction of the City of Iowa Park, be annexed and included within and made a part of the City of Iowa Park, Texas.

That a public hearing for all interested persons to be heard on the question of annexing the hereinafter described territory be had, and notice of such hearing be published in a newspaper for not more than twenty (20) days nor less than ten (10) days prior to the date of hearing.

That the notice of said public hearing shall include a description of the territory to be annexed which is described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the East line of Section 20 of Tarrant County School Lands, Wichita County, Texas, which bears North 0 deg. 04' East 3263.0 feet from the Southeast corner of said Section 20, said point also being the point of intersection of the center lines of Johnson Road and Westridge Lane, the East one-half of Johnson Road from this point and Northerly and Westridge Lane lie within the city limits of the City of Iowa Park, Texas;

Thence North 00 deg. 04' East

along the center line of Johnson Road, 1317.9 feet to a point in the South right of way line of U. S. Highway 287, Business Loop 370;

Thence North 62 deg. 22' West along the South right of way line of said U. S. Highway right of way 47.8 feet to the beginning of a 1.153 degree curve to the left;

Thence Northwesterly along the south south right of way line of said Highway right-of-way 1.153 degree curve, 1425.74 feet to a point in the south right of way line of said highway right-of-way;

Thence leaving said point in said Highway right-of-way South 00 deg. 04' West 1810.80 to a point;

Thence South 89 deg. 56' East along and parallel with the South boundary line of a 50.89 acre tract of land conveyed by Gladys Johnson, et vir, et al to the Iowa Park Independent School District; said tract being out of the northeast corner of Section 20, Tarrant County School Lands and more particularly described in a warranty deed recorded in Volume 1032, Page 541 of the deed records of Wichita County, Texas, a distance of 1352.97 feet past the Southeast corner of said 50.89 acre tract, continuing East a distance of 30 feet to a point in the West boundary line of the City Limits of Iowa Park, Texas, where the center lines of Westridge Lane and Johnson Road intersect, the place of beginning.

Section 2. That the public be informed as provided by law that the City intends to annex the above described territory, and extend its boundary limits so as to include said above described territory within said City Limits; that a public hearing be had on said annexation ordinance in the City Council's Chambers of the City of Iowa Park, Texas, on the day of October 14, 1968, at 7:30 o'clock P.M.; that the City Clerk shall cause notice of such public hearing to be published in the Iowa Park Herald newspaper in Iowa Park, Texas, for not more than twenty (20) days nor less than ten (10) days prior to the date of said public hearing.

Section 3. That this Ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage as the Charter in such cases provide.

Fire Prevention

Fire killed over 1000 people a month in this country last year and nearly a third of these were children. More than \$2,100,000,000 worth of property went up in smoke during 1967. Tragedy of these figures, Fire Chief Pete Snook points out, is that the greatest part of this loss of lives and property is avoidable. If simple rules of fire safety were observed the record could be far different. Fire Prevention Week, Oct. 6 through 12 re-emphasizes that Fire Hurts; that fighting fires is Everyone's Job, during this week and throughout the year.

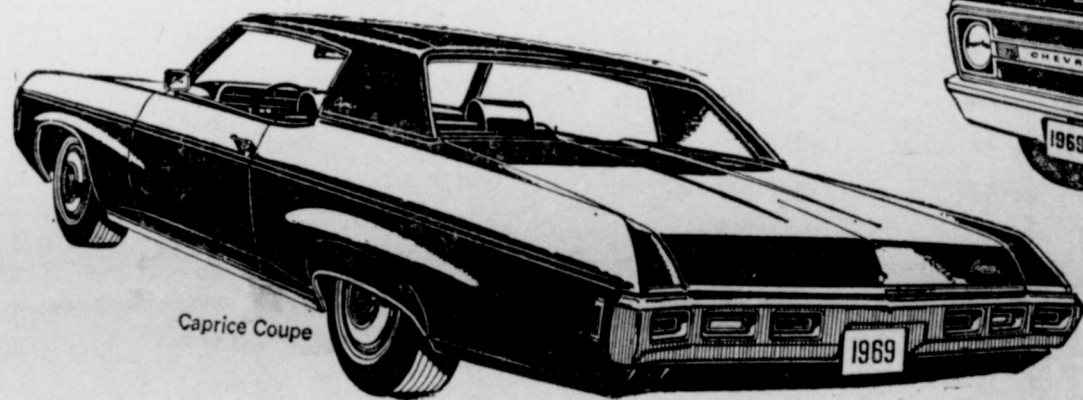

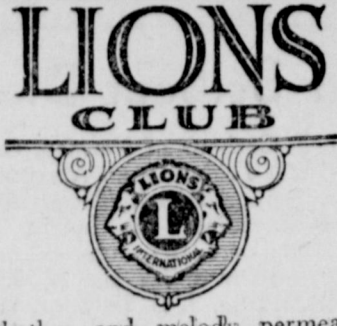
