## City Planning

Proposed plans for the 20-year expansion of Iowa Park were discussed at an open meeting of the Planning Commission here last Thursday night.

Chairman Donald Hill explained that under the 3-to-1 federal fund program, where the government allows \$3 for every \$1 spent for capital improvements during the past three years, Iowa Park is eligible for more than \$1,000,000.

Hill said members of the planning commission have recommended rehabilitation and repair of the downtown business district as first step in the program. He said comprehensive plan books are available at City Hall and Library and encouraged citizens to study them.

Mayer E. F. Soell explained the development plan that has been presented to City Council and outlined its six divisions—base studies, land use and street plan, community facilities and capital expenditures, subdivision regulations zoning ordinance, and updating information and continued planning.

## Election Tuesday

Voters of Texas will go to the polls next Tuesday to approve or disapprove Nine Constitutional Amendments.

Proposition 1 is called the "Deadwood Amendment" because it will repeal obsolete and unnecessary sections of the Constitution.

Proposition 2 if passed will make possible spending \$3,500,000,000 to develop water supply for the state. It has been estimated the Texas water plan will cost \$9,000,000,000.

Proposition 3. Raising salaries of Lieutenant Governor, Speaker of the House and Senators and Representatives.

Proposition 4. Exempting property of nonprofit water supply companies from taxation. Example: a water supply company owned co-operatively by people in FHA financed housing facilities built in sparsely settled areas.

Proposition 5. Raising State welfare ceiling from \$60,000,000 to \$80,000,000 annually.

Proposition 6. Removing constitutional limits on interest rates to be charged on public debt. There now is a 4 percent limit on bonds. This proposal would cancel that restriction and allow bonded indebtedness to pay much higher interest rates.

Proposition 7. Broadening authority for making assistance payments to survivors of public officers, employees and agents.

Proposition 8. Authorizing an additional \$200,000,000 in bonds to finance student loan program at institutions of higher learning.

Proposition 9. Providing for annual session of the Legislature.

## City Council

It was voted during the City Council meeting Monday night to raise commercial water deposit rates on new meters. This will not apply to meters now in service, but only to those which will be applied for in future.

Three levels of deposits are: \$20 for cleaners, garages, construction companies, drug stores, markets, motor companies, variety stores, tool and machine companies, oilwell and equipment supply companies.

\$30 for trucking companies, ice cream stores, service stations, elevators or grain companies, cattle operations.

\$40 for food stores, apartment houses, car washes, laundries, chain stores, trailer courts and mobile home parks, restaurants, cafes, cafeterias, rest homes or nursing homes, coin-operated laundries, funeral homes.

Deposits on businesses not listed will be according to judgment of city secretary.

Extensive discussion was entered into considering changes in the Building Code for the city. Further study was requested.

During the session it was voted to renew the certificate of deposit in amount of \$20,000 and to transfer \$10,000 from the water and sewer operating fund to the general fund.

Joe Baxter Cleaners was awarded contract for cleaning uniforms of policemen.

Housing code ordinance was passed upon second reading.

**ORDINANCE NUMBER 143**

An ordinance providing for the calling and holding of an election by vote of the qualified voters of the City of Iowa Park relative to the adoption of a locally administered "Neighborhood Renewal Agency" for the benefit of the City, particularly to renew and restore and otherwise control deterioration in the City of Iowa Park, Texas, in accordance with the provisions of Article 4.05 of the Election Code of the Civil Statutes of the State of Texas as heretofore and hereafter amended. Whereas, time in its passage has wreaked deterioration and depreciation in business houses

and homes of the City; and, Whereas, in older portions of the City, particularly the central business section of the City, aging of the buildings has become critical and extremely detrimental and destructive to the business life of the City and to the comfort, health, welfare, safety and morals of homelife in other older portions of the City, and, Whereas, there is available to the residents and citizens of this City, Federal funds to which our residents and citizens have contributed for just such use, and, Whereas, the residents and citizens of this City are as much entitled to the use of these funds as any other of the many cities of the United States who have made and who are making progressive use of such funds, and, Whereas, there is included in the Comprehensive Plan prepared for this City by the consultants who have recently delivered the same to our City, plans encouraging the application for and use of such funds for the purpose of renewing the business houses and homes of the City, and, Whereas, it is the belief of the City Council that the need for such funds is urgent and beneficial to the City, we do hereby certify to you that in order for such funds to be available for renewal to our community, there must be passed an ordinance authorizing an agency under the direction of the City Council to perform the duties of City Government in this respect.

Now, therefore, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Iowa Park, Texas, that an election shall be called on the 13th day of September, A.D. 1969, at Elvyle Kidwell Elementary School, 1200 North Third Street, and W. R. Bradford Elementary School, 800 South Texowa Street, in the City of Iowa Park, Wichita County, Texas, for the submission of the question: "Do the qualified voters of said City, voting at an election held in regard to the adoption of a local 'Neighborhood Renewal Agency' for the benefit of such City in accordance with the provisions of Article 4.05 of the Election Code of the Civil Statutes of the State of Texas, wish to adopt a locally administered 'Zoning Ordinance'?" Notice of such election shall be given by causing a substantial copy of this ordinance calling for the election to be published on the same day of two successive weeks in the Iowa Park Herald, and the date of the first publication to be given at least 21 days prior to the date set for such election.

Statutes of the State of Texas, and as hereafter and hereafter amended, wish to adopt a locally administered 'Neighborhood Renewal Agency?' Notice of such election shall be given by causing a substantial copy of the ordinance calling for the election to be published on the same day of two successive weeks in the Iowa Park Herald, and the date of the first publication to be given at least 21 days prior to the date set for such election.

tions within the City and have projected needs and recommendations for some twenty (20) to thirty (30) years for correcting of undesirable conditions and abusive land uses and control, and.

Whereas, It is deemed advisable for the present and future benefit of the City of Iowa Park to enact a "Zoning Ordinance," the same being a land use ordinance for the purpose of promoting the health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the community; lessening congestion in the streets, securing safety from fire, panic and other dangers; providing adequate light and air; preventing the over-crowding of land; avoiding undue concentration of population; facilitating the adequate provision of transportation, water, sewerage, schools, parks and other public requirements; conserving the value of buildings and encouraging the most appropriate use of land throughout the community; and promoting the development of the community in accordance with a comprehensive plan.

R. Bradford Elementary School, 800 South Texowa Street in the City of Iowa Park, Wichita County, Texas, for the submission of the question: "Do the qualified voters of said City, voting at an election held in regard to the adoption of a 'Zoning Ordinance' for the benefit of such City in accordance with the said provisions of Article 4.05 of the Election Code of the Civil Statutes of the State of Texas, wish to adopt a locally administered 'Zoning Ordinance'?" Notice of such election shall be given by causing a substantial copy of this ordinance calling for the election to be published on the same day of two successive weeks in the Iowa Park Herald, and the date of the first publication to be given at least 21 days prior to the date set for such election.

The ballot at such election shall have printed on it the following:  
 [ ] FOR the adoption of a Zoning Ordinance within the City.  
 [ ] AGAINST the adoption of a Zoning Ordinance within the City.

The election shall be conducted in the manner provided by law for other municipal elections, and if a majority of the votes cast in such election be in favor of the adoption of a "Zoning Ordinance," the same shall be effected in the City of Iowa Park, Texas, immediately after passage.

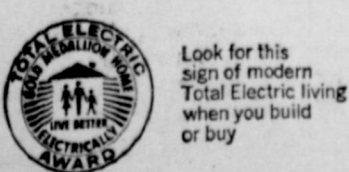
