AN OLD DOCUMENT.

ENTRUSTED—In this way, in days of old, I have had the honor and pleasure of addressing you, both by hand and from the stump; and twice honored with a horse! Whether all be honored so highly on the sea coast, remains to be seen. Here, out of, in my hands, and the variation of my political creed. I find that I spring from the old doctine, Virginia; therefore it is being more than natural, that I will have fully imbibed the principles of the old Democratic stock, of Madison, Madison and Monroe; those principles, which guided them and followers, and have led our way up step by step to our state of freedom, prosperity and wealth, in principle and measures have with the approbation and approval of all great, good, "honest and true" of our beloved country, until we arrived at a height as never was reached in so short a space of time, by any other nation since the creation

of the world! No funds, nor the wealth of a State can be better laid out and expended than in the im-

provement and culture of the intellect of her children. The act relative to and establishing biennial sessions will be done, on and repealed, no doubt. 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A DARWINIAN THEORY.
