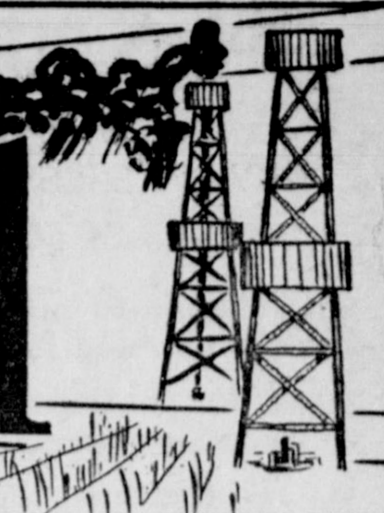

Dr. C. C. Collins, psychologist with the Wichita Falls State hospital, was guest speaker for the Lions club at their Tuesday noon meeting.

Claude McDonald gave the invitational address of Georgia Trammell, Bertha Barnett, Rosemary Clark and Jeri Goss, accompanied on the piano by Elaine Sawyer, presented the luncheon music.

Alan Berry, program chairman, had Gordon G. Clark introduce the speaker.

Dr. Collins said mental illness is on the increase. National records show somebody in one out of four families needs professional help.

Collins accounted for the increase in five ways: There are more people; new drugs are adding years to the life span; methods of screening patients are better; children who went through the recent World War are now reaching the age when their unsettled childhood is paying off in mental illness.

The speaker extended an invitation to all to visit the hospital. It has been expanded considerably in the past few years, and more doctors, nurses and attendants are employed.

A new medical and surgical clinic with the best and latest equipment has been constructed and put into service.

With the recent addition of a vocational rehabilitation director, the hospital now can help patients learn to take their place in the outside world and be useful again.

He called upon business people and neighbors to give recover mental patients the benefit of trust and encouragement.

Collins also told of a district clinic to be established in Wichita county, designed to aid adults and children who are mentally disturbed.

## Gas Goes Up \$.054

Lone Star Gas company's application for a rate increase of 54 cents per thousand cubic feet in each step of its rates for residential and commercial gas service was approved by the Iowa Park City Council at its meeting on May 10. The new rate will become effective July 1.

This increase to the average residential user will amount to slightly more than one cent daily, it was pointed out by Carl Walsh, local manager for Lone Star.

Increased cost of purchasing gas in the field is the primary cause for the rise in price, Walsh said. 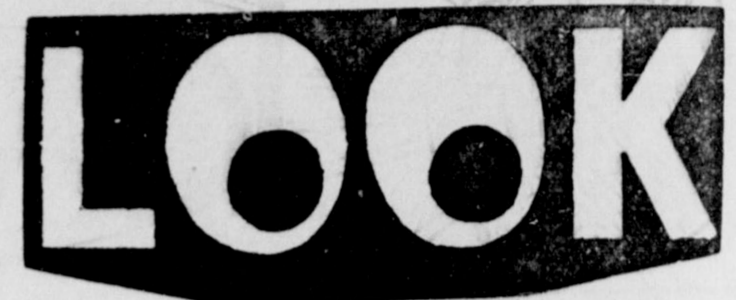

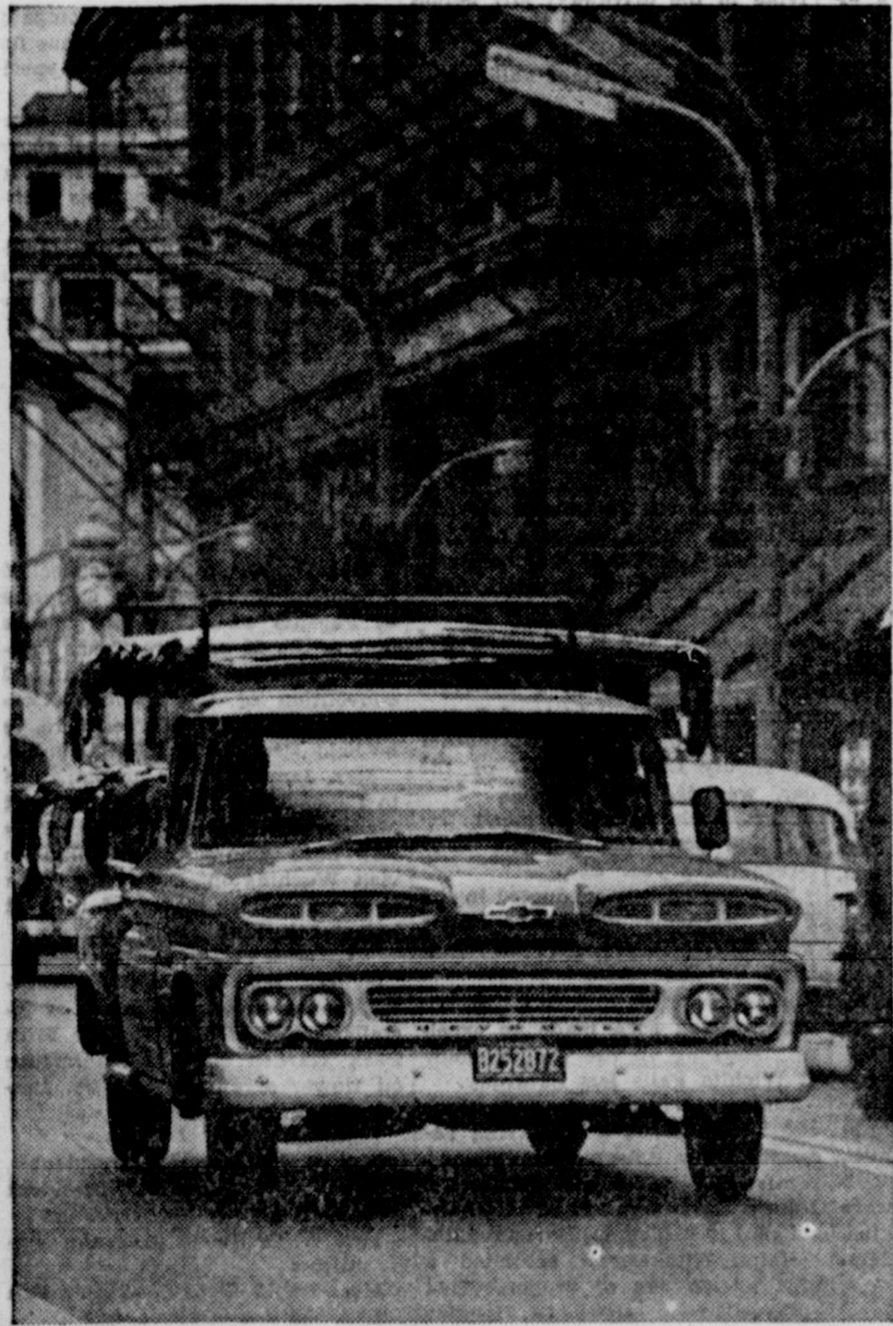
