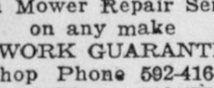

cannot carry indefinitely the burden of solving all the problems of the world, particularly in those nations which choose to be what they call neutral or uncommitted.

"I believe the American people can maintain a strong national defense, do everything we need to do in aiding other nations, and continue to grow and progress with a sound economy without continuing to add to the national debt.

"I believe the idea of states rights carries with it states responsibilities and that the best way to combat the creeping paralysis of concentration of authority in the Federal Government is for the states and local communities to solve their own problems. I oppose Federal aid to education and socialized medical service. I support a farm program based on sound economics with a minimum of government control and a maximum of individual freedom in order that American farmers may again enjoy freedom of choice and decision.

"I favor in the right of workers to organize, choose their own bargaining agents and negotiate with management in an atmosphere of mutual respect and freedom without undue pressure or intervention from government representatives.

"I favor maintaining the present oil depletion allowance as essential to a strong and healthy oil industry which is so vital to the national defense.

"I favor retention of the Connally amendment to the treaty establishing a world court which reserves to this country the right to determine what cases shall be submitted to this international tribunal.

"I am a lifelong Democrat and have consistently supported party nominees. I will be anxious to discuss these and other issues of personal or national importance at any time."

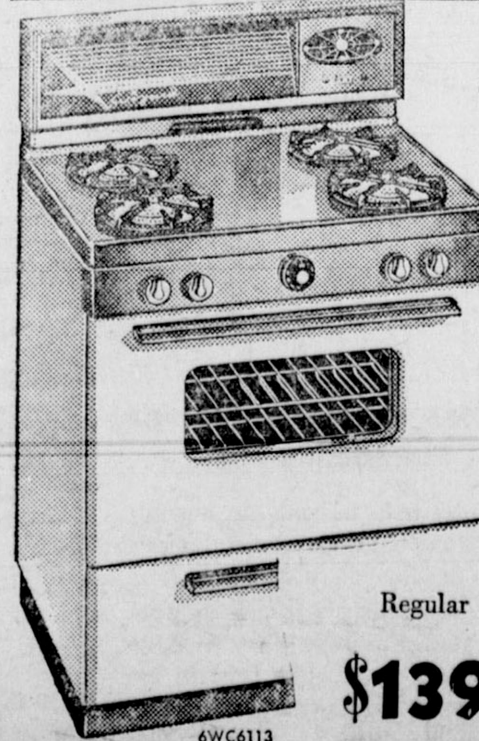

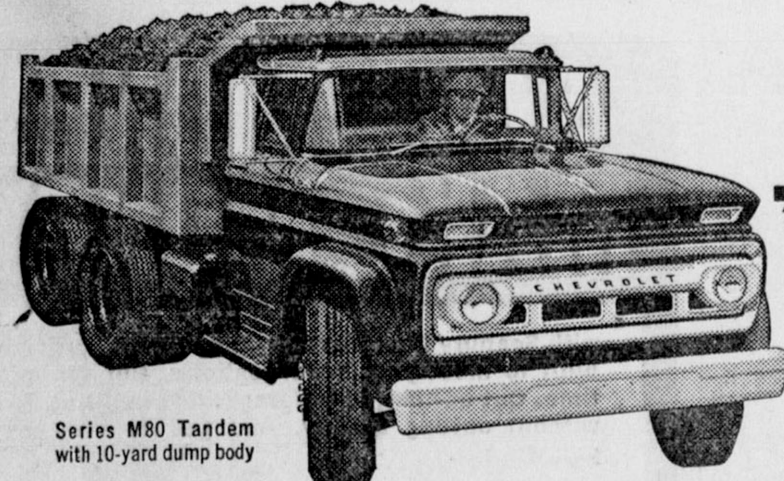

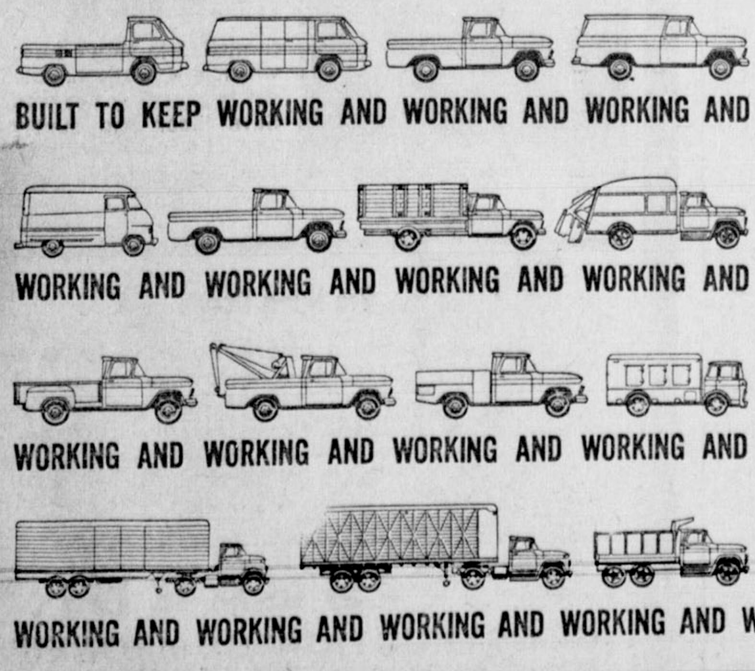
