Graduate named for SPC Commencement

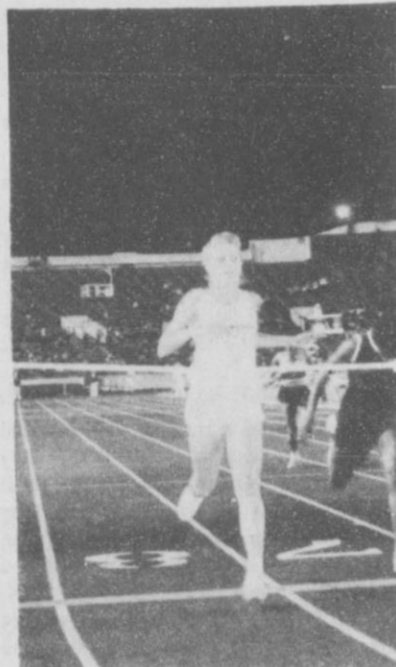
Durward Cator, Jr. of Gruver received an associate of arts degree in agriculture economics during South Plains College's recent commencement exercises.

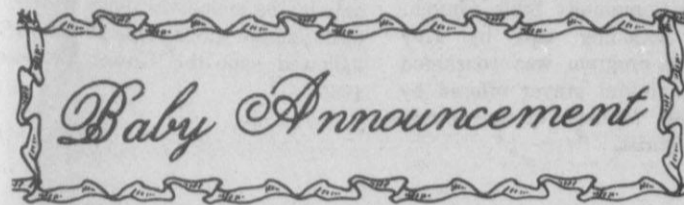

They had never had a patient who enjoyed the volumes of mail daily that Kip did. Each card and letter and call was a light in a dark time - to us as well as to Kip. Somewhere in southern California people know just how special and different folks are in the Texas Panhandle. One young hematologist is being tempted to move to Texas when his stint in the Navy is completed after seeing us through the last five months and being convinced that there is a better way in Texas!

We felt like royalty in our "coming home" reception. Frank & Kip were met at the airport by a welcoming party. Luke and I drove straight through which was another in a long list of memorable events. Luke's part in Kips' treatment was the most vital of all and he performed it without missing a beat at school, so his Freshman year at college has been successfully completed.

When we were within snelling distance of home (still in a foreign county) an officer of the roads stopped us to say our sticker was five months out of date and that we were exceeding the legal speed limit, "Thank you for your kindness and concern, sir."

But finally - what a sight for reddened sleepless eyes! Home! There were yellow ribbons in the trees and welcome home banners everywhere. Food, fruit baskets, and flowers awaited us. How truly overwhelming.

If you ever find yourself in a rut taking your dear good neighbors and friends for granted, you might try five months in a foreign land to remedy that.

Kip is now recuperating at home with weekly trips to Harrington in Amarillo for CBC's (complete blood counts) and platelet counts. His complete recovery will take time as he still tires very easily, but he has already climbed many mountains and crossed many valleys by the grace of God.

Thank you for helping to bear our burdens. "May our God supply your every need according to His riches in Christ Jesus."

Those present were reminded of the

importance and meaning of the day by the members of the Gruver Ministerial Alliance. Will Evans and David Gilbert, of the Gruver Cub Scouts Pack 550 raised the American Flag to half mast where it remained for the memorial period. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by the Reverend Jim Terry, Minister of the Gruver United Methodist Church; followed by Les Barkley singing "The Battle Hymn of the Republic" with those gathered joining on the chorus.

Word of remembrance and a reminder of the importance of this day in time and the legacy of the past as well as responsibility of the future were offered by the Reverend Jeff Burru, minister of the Gruver Community Bible Church. With the sounding taps by Troy Seagler, the program was concluded with a meaningful prayer offered by Harid Sneed, Minister of the Gruver Church of Christ.

Each of those attending was given a "Gruver Cemetery Veterans' Memorial Map, 1986" with the graves of the 82 servicemen resting here marked on the map. The maps were typed and printed by Mrs. Aubry Peddy. Additional copies may be at the Gruver City Hall and the Gruver Library.

TSTI To Offer Feedmill And Elevator technology Course

In an effort to provide competent, trained professionals to the cattle feeding and grain elevator industries, Texas State Technical Institute (TSTI) will offer a Feedmill and Elevator Technology course.

The course, set to begin September 8, was developed by TSTI at the urging of the cattle feeding and grain industries because of difficulty in finding trained people to operate feedyard feedmills and grain elevators, according to Charlie Ball, executive vice president of the Texas Cattle Feeders Association.

"More than 23% of all fed cattle in the nation (6 million head) are produced in Texas and the neighboring states of Oklahoma and New Mexico," Ball says. "With the concentration of cattle feeding in the Texas Panhandle and surrounding states, there is a need for highly skilled feedmill operators."

"Feedyards process a tremendous amount of grain daily, requiring skilled, well trained people," continues Ball. "But there presently is no structured training program for feedmill and grain elevator operators. Thus, we asked TSTI to initiate this course."

Ball points out, since TSTI is a vocational school, many others beside recent high school graduates may be interested in the course. "With the recent financial difficulty many area farmers have experienced," he says, "there's a potential pool of people who already have many of the mechanical skills needed to become a feedmill or grain elevator operator."

The course will train students in the operation of feedmill and grain handling equipment, dust control techniques and hazards, electrical/electronic weighing controls, hydraulic and pneumatic systems and advanced trouble-shooting, according to Jim Lutes, course instructor and program coordinator at TSTI. Coursework will include training in equipment maintenance, electrical systems, welding and mechanics as well

as industrial management and computer operation. Lutes says.

Two training options will be offered, he says. One is a certificate program lasting four quarters or 12 months. The other option, which will allow students to obtain an Associate of Applied Science degree, will last six quarters or 18 months.

Museum Selects Queen

Mrs. Maude Alexander is the 1986 Hansford County Pioneer Queen.

A diminutive dynamo of 86 years' might well describe the Stationmasters House Museum's 1986 Pioneer Queen selection—Maude Allen Alexander (Mrs. Harley) of Gruver.

The Museum Board could not have made a better selection to serve as their first Pioneer Queen as she has been a life-long resident of the area—moving to Hansford County in 1921 before there even was a Gruver town (established in 1928).

Born 23 September 1899, she and her family came to Sherman County in 1902, settling in the Spurlock Community until 1907 when they moved to Stratford, Texas. Her father, Alfred Wagner Allen, was a farmer; her mother, Mary Kelley Allen, a teacher. Maude was the second of five children.

Maude received her schooling at Stratford, graduating from Stratford High School, and attended college in Clarendon. She was one of those wonderfully qualified teachers (pre TCAT) who was responsible for the education of those six to 18 in a one-room school house. Maude taught one year in the Stevens School in Sherman County.

In 1919, she and Harley Alexander were married and established their home six miles west and four miles north of what is now Gruver in 1921. They had four children—Mary, now Mrs. David Long of Guymon, Oklahoma; George, who dies in 1935; Frances, Mrs. William (Buddy) Murrell of Gruver; and David who died in 1961 following a diving accident.

They built a lovely home in Gruver and moved here in 1959. The Alexanders have been an integral part of the community all of their lives. They had children in the Gruver schools from 1956 to 1972; and great grandchildren from 1978 to the present. As Maude says, "The Gruver Schools are a part of me" and we might add the Alexanders

are a part of the Gruver schools.

Maude and Harley became world-wide travelers after their family was grown and visited all of the continents of the world (some twice or more)—coming within 3,500 miles of the North Pole at Point Barrow, Alaska, and approximately 3,500 miles of the South Pole when they visited New Zealand—just to mention a wee bit about their travels.

Maude continues to live in their lovely Gruver home following Harley's death in 1972. Her green thumbs are very evident in the beautiful gardens with their wonderful roses and a potpourri of other beautiful flowers—all of which would make the editors of Better Homes and Gardens green with envy. Her lovely flowers are shared generously with the whole community—appearing frequently at her beloved Gruver United Methodist Church, at parties and showers, gracing the tables at Hansford Manor where she is a regular visitor—always spreading their fragrance and beauty so generously everywhere.

Mrs. Alexander is a member of the Gruver United Methodist Church; the Gruver Music Club; a staunch supporter of the Gruver Library; and attends the meetings of the Gruver Golden Agers as well as being a very positive member of the Gruver PTA.

Queen Maude states firmly, "I like where I live"—and we would add—we like where she lives, too, for she adds much to the heritage of our Hansford County. She is a faithful friend; a bit of perpetual motion whether for labor or fun; a compendium of geographic knowledge having traveled world-wide with her constant and loving companion, and one who has cut a wide swath wherever she has trod—a true pioneer! No ruling on PCB site until further testing

The Environmental Protection Agency will not rule on the proposed PCB dumpsite on the Texas-Oklahoma border 13 miles south of Guymon, until further testing on dust control, clay around the monofill and protection for the water is done.

American Natural Resources Company, a subsidiary of Coastal Corp., applied for a monofill to dispose of PCB, but has been met with opposition from residents in the area.

"The testing will probably not be done for another six months, so it will be in the fall when they decide," stated CAPP (Citizens Against Poisonous Pollutants) member Barbara Stavio.

"We have visited with the state attorney general of Texas and there may possibly be a suit filed against the E.P.A.," quoted Stavio.

The suit would concern the fact Texas agencies have no authority to decide on the issue.

Dr. Thomas Hale, director of Pediatric Clinical Pharmacology at the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center said if the PCBs are deposi-

ted here, we can expect them in our environment for the rest of our lives.

His report stated, "Because our environment here in the Panhandle is considered rather stable, due to limited rainfall, once PCBs are introduced we can expect to spend our lives, and that of our children living with persistent and increasing quantities of the ultrastable compounds in our body tissues.

"By a process of biomagnification, we should expect that our body burden of PCBs will continue to increase. Science does not know the final result of life-long exposure to these compounds, but experience suggests that the organ systems most sensitive to PCB poisoning are our reproductive organs and the liver. Once introduced into the human body, only extreme fasting will reduce the body burden of PCBs, and then only to a limited degree."

CAPP has now almost 2500 members in its organization. The committee is preparing to send out its first newsletter in June.

Money may not be "the root of all evil," but it evidently is the root of much family stress.

In one 1985 study, researchers found that the number one worry of 660 families from various income brackets was money, finances or budgeting. A 1984 Gallup Survey also showed that 65 percent of a nationally representative sample was worried about having enough to pay bills at least some of the time.

Of course, some families have cause to worry about the very real economic problems they face because of unemployment, a family farm debt crisis or reduced financial status as a single parent or retiree.

But other financially stable families seem to worry about money too. Why? Some financial experts point to the fact that even though income levels are at an all time high, and inflation is relatively low, family purchasing power eroded during the 1970's. Even we have seen a modest increase in real purchasing power recently, many families feel they can "never get ahead."

Psychologists have also observed that

in our society each generation expects a higher standard of living than the generation before. When this expectation cannot be met, stress sets in.

Many families simply do not know how to manage their money so they can meet their expectations. Often, they learn to budget by trial and error -- if at all.

Budgetless families frequently don't have money set aside for inevitable emergencies like a broken washing machine or a medical bill.

They may overuse credit and spend a significant part of their income on finance charges. No matter what size the income, trying to stretch it to meet all the demands of the family gets to be a trial.

Yet there are many resources available, right here in our community, to help families learn important money management skills.

Educational Programs conducted by the Texas Agricultural Extension service serve people of all ages, regardless of social economic level, race, color, sex, religion, handicapp or national origin.
