To Whom Shall We Go

Subject: Trying to Get Around Immersion

Phillip, following the instruction of an angel, went down south of Jerusalem, and there was told by the Spirit to join himself to a chariot that an Ethiopian eunuch, was riding and reading from Isaiah the 53rd chapter, Phillip asked the man if he could understand what he was reading, and the eunuch, being an honest man, admitted that he didn't. Phillip was invited by the eunuch to get into the chariot with him, and teach him. Luke records that Phillip began at the same scripture and preached unto him Jesus (Acts 8:35)

This is all that is said of Phillip's sermon to the eunuch, just that he preached Jesus unto him. We can know some of the things that were included in this sermon from the results that the sermon had on the eunuch.

As they were traveling along they came unto certain water, and the eunuch said, "see, here is water, what doth hinder me to be baptized?" Why do you suppose the eunuch asked such a question? Was it because Phillip taught him that it was a non-essential? Is it not true that you reap what you sow, and that a seed bears after its own kind? Now, if a person was to pick up a Bible for the first

time and read this story, what impression would be left upon that one's mind concerning baptism? Does it sound like it was performed by a little water poured or sprinkled on the eunuch's head? Luke tells us that they both, went down into the water and he baptized him (Acts 8:38). He, who? Who baptized whom? Who was wanting to be baptized? Phillip baptized the eunuch.

I have two popular commentaries in my study that express the views of many toward baptism. One tries to take away the forcefulness of this record by saying that when Luke said "they went down both into the water," that "into" might mean "unto". Well, let's look at this moment. After Phillip baptized the eunuch, what did they do? They came "up out of the water" (Acts 8:39). Do you mean they came out of something they never entered? Again, if the word "into" might mean "unto", then the word "unto" might mean "into". We are going to get them in the water yet, watch it! The 36th verse says "They came 'unto' (into) certain water. Sound silly? It is!

Another commentator doesn't deny that they both went down into the water, but states that "the impromptu character of the baptism suggests something simpler than immersion, most likely sprinkling or pouring." This I would like to know! Since both men went down into the water, what would simpler than immersion? They went down into the water, because it was necessary to do what they had in mind to do! It is not necessary or practical to go down into the water to sprinkle or pour water on one. The same reason that now keeps preachers who practice sprinkling or pouring out of the water would have kept Phillip and the eunuch out of it!

Baptism is immersion, that is all it means. Everywhere the word "baptism" is used, if it had been translated it would appear "immersion". Let no man make a fool of himself by trying to get around what is clearly taught in the Scripture.

Euline Green Honored in A.C.C. Release

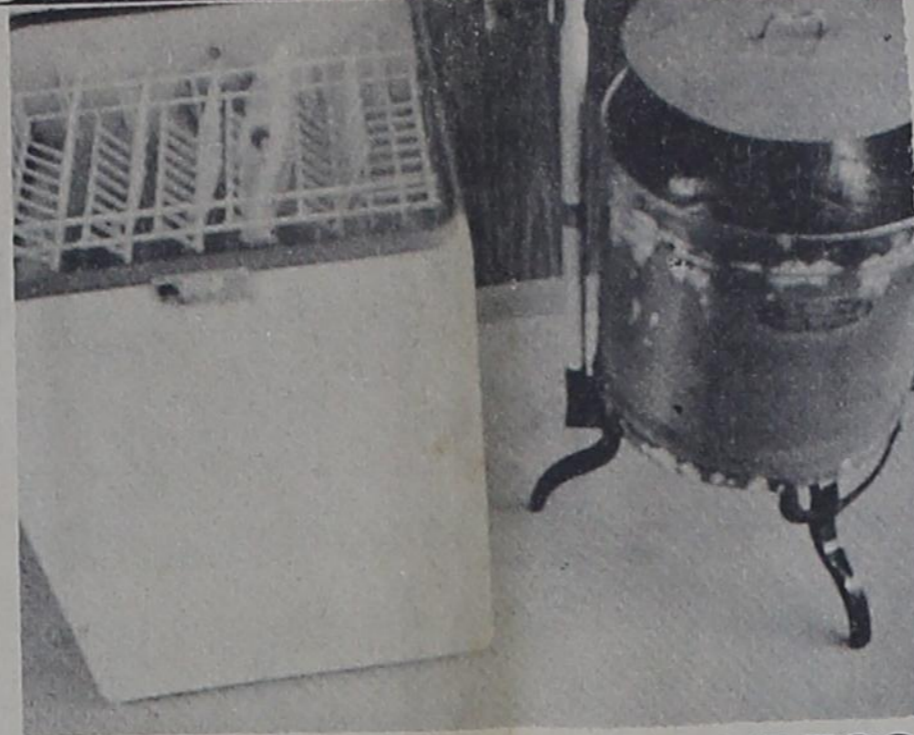
In a recent Abilene Christian College Release came the following article which is a tribute to one of the Gruver High School Graduates, Euline Green.

Hunting Season Opens

Hunting season has opened in the State of Texas and the Panhandle.

Geese: November 1 through January 14, 1964. Sunrise to sunset each day. Bag and possession limit five a day. You may have two Canada Geese or sub-species, or one Canada Goose and one white-fronted goose. You can not have in possession or killed more than one white fronted goose.

Deer: November 16 through November 29. One per season in Panhandle Area. Doe killed by permit only.

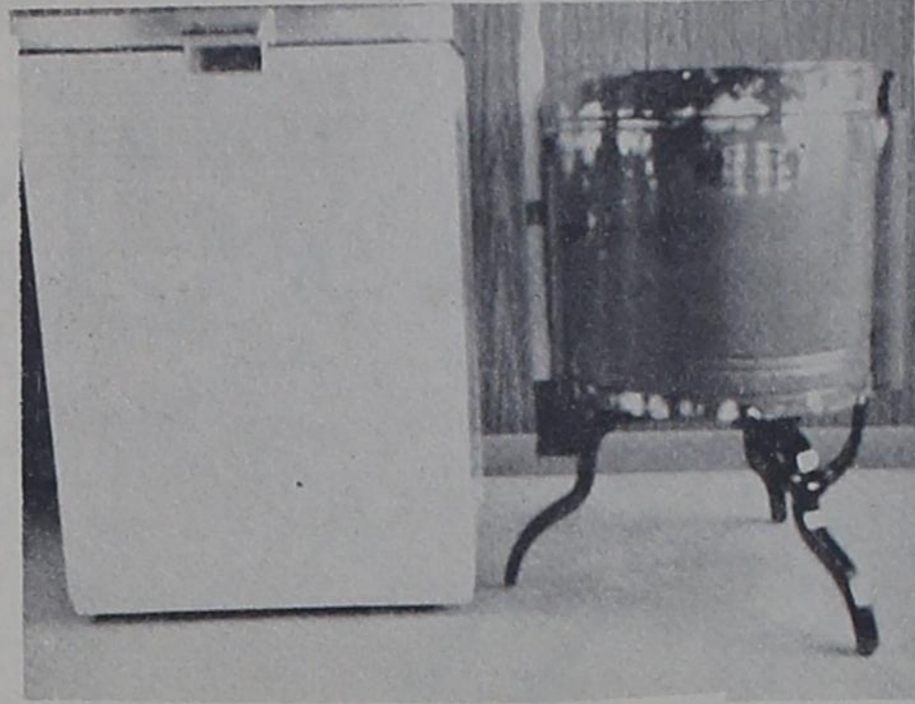
Turkey: November 16 through November 29. Two Turkey gobblers per season.

Quail: November 16 through January 31, 1964. Bag and possession limit. Twelve quail per day. Thirty six in possession.

Pheasant: December 1 through December 7. Bag and possession limit. Two cock pheasants per day. Four in possession.

Duck and Coots: December 1 through January 4, 1964. Bag and possession limit. Four per day. Eight possession. Open day noon to sunset. There after sunrise to sunset.

The average Gruver housewife might not be seriously interested in buying the earlier model, unless she happens to be attracted to antiques; but most of us would agree that in a demonstration of the two the earlier one would certainly provide the greatest entertainment. A reading of the descriptive material will incite chuckles of amusement and will also sharply call attention to the fact that manufacturers of dish-abilities and intelligence of the weaker sex in pretty low esteem. Did any woman ever really need this bit of instruction? "Work handle back and forth with quick and jerky motion, using most force on back stroke, as in manner a person would row a boat. Vary occasionally by

using a quick short stroke. When fully drained throw in a dipper of clean water to draw off clinging suds. Follow directions closely in the stroke of the lever. At first you may make mistakes, but when you become accustomed to the machine you will see that the whirlpool dishwasher takes its place along with the sewing machine and other labor saving devices."

There was nothing included in available material which indicated the price of this dishwasher; so while we may well believe that the homemaker would be anxious to own one, we can not know how long she would have to save her egg and butter money to purchase it. For that matter the price of the dishwasher would not help us a great deal--for neither are we very well informed as to the price of butter and eggs in 1914.

Even attitudes seem to have changed to some dishwashers have indeed come a long way in 50 years. For instance, the parts list includes such items as (1) One can--or body complete; (2) One propeller; (3) One handle; (4) Three legs (2 plain, 1 with handle socket.)

In the descriptive brochure emphasis is placed upon benefit to hands and complexion--and although one may wonder why--the greatest stress seems to be placed on complexion. But benefit from the standpoint of health is not to be overlooked either. The dish-ran (which, of course, will no longer be a necessary item in the household fortunate enough to boast of

this "modern" appliance) is branded as a filthy breeder and carrier of disease germs. We may be sure that the homemaker of 1914 gave serious attention to all of these still important details.

The pictures of the modern kitchen in which the newest invention was to be installed are revealing, to say the least. Moreover, they serve to make those of us who live in 1963 more fully aware of the greater advantages which we now enjoy.

Included in the directions for operation are remarks which lead one to believe the inventor was not only a man, but a man who held the

gree during these last 50 years. Conservatism apparently was considered a virtue back in 1914 rather than a quality deserving of contempt. The suggestion is made that the water for rinsing the dishes would become "sudsy" and could be used for washing the pots and pans.

The housewife of today might consider this appliance to be more beneficial to her figure than to her complexion, since operation of it would involve a goodly amount of daily exercise. But in 1914 the final words of advertising appeal were these: "The Whirlpool sanitary dish-

washer and urier is the last link in the chain of labor saving devices for the home."

Now there we might find a thought provoking nugget. Progress is relative--and a chain is no newer than its newest link. What is the last link? When will it be produced by some enterprising individual with an inventive mind?

But that is another story--one which may be written by someone when 50 more years have brought even greater progress in the field of labor saving devices for the homes of America and all other countries of the world.

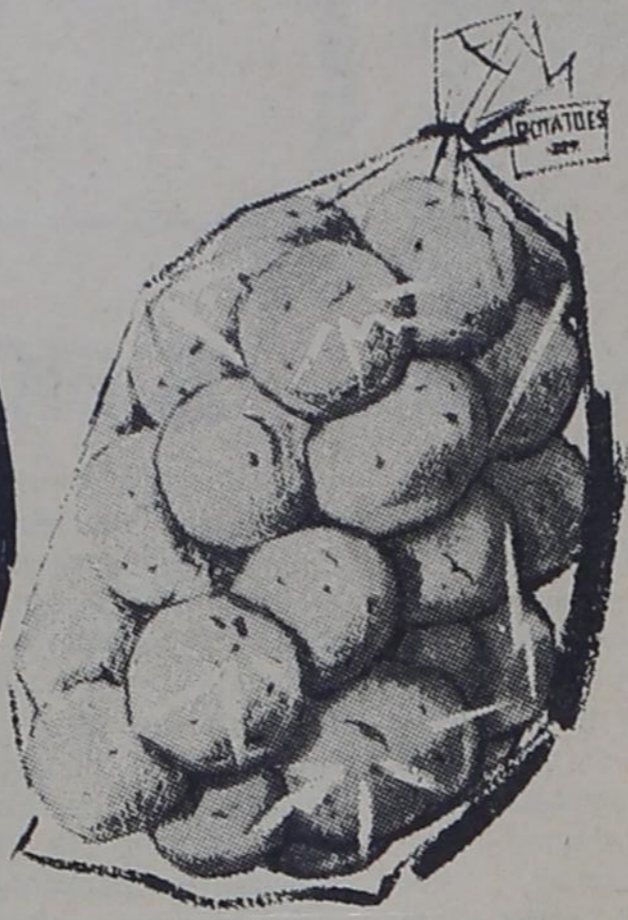

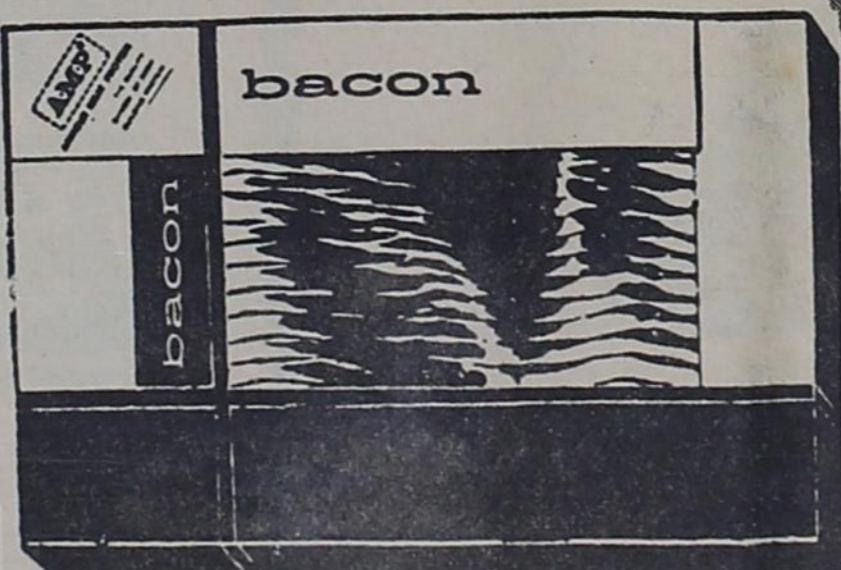
