





The eleven varieties were planted I October 15, 1960, and were harvested May 29 through June 1, 1961 at Halfway. The yields in the test were as follows: Rogers, 116,4 bushels; selection No. 48-59-38, a cross of Cordova and Kido, 115.4 bushels; Wintex, 114.7 bushels; Cordova,


