Water Development Board Begins Study

The Texas Water Development Board has begun a detailed study of the water resources in all or parts of Briscoe, Hale, and Swisher counties. This area is one of ten areas in the state which have been identified by the Board and the Texas Water Commission as an area that is either experiencing critical ground-water problems within the next 20 years. Ground-water problems in Briscoe, Hale and Swisher counties are related mainly to declining water levels.

Major topics to be addressed in the study include the occurrence and availability

of ground and surface water, identification of present and potential water resource problems, projection of area water supply and ground-water quality for the next 20 years, and estimation of future demands that will be placed on those resources.

An advisory committee of local citizens who are knowledgeable on the subject, will be formed to work with the Board and participate in the study. The advisory committee will provide information from those most affected by the condition of the aquifer.

At the conclusion of the study, a report containing the Board's findings will be submitted to the Texas Water Commission. This process could result in the creation of an underground water conservation district for the area. Such a district would provide locally-controlled management of the ground-water resources of the area.

School Board Election Set

The Board of Trustees of the Turkey-Quitauque ISD has called an election to be held on May 7 to elect three members to the board. Positions to be filled are currently held by Jim Saul, Thelma Gafford, and Larry Curry.

Curry has resigned his position on the Board after serving one year of a three year term of office. He is moving to Memphis at the end of the current school year and will be unable to serve on the Board of Trustees.

On May 7, voters will elect one member to serve two years of the unexpired term vacated by the resignation of Curry. The two remaining positions will be filled by members elected to serve three year terms of office.

The deadline for filing is 5:00 p.m. March 23. Applications for filing are available at the school business office. The election will be conducted along with city elections in Turkey and Quitauque.

Agriculture Week March 21-26

March 21, 1988, is the first day of AGRICULTURE WEEK. During this week, agriculture will be honored throughout the nation. In Texas, Farmers and Ranchers will be recognized with a press conference and dinner. Numerous farm organizations and commodity groups will join together to recognize Texas farmers and ranchers at the Lubbock County Fair Grounds in Lubbock, on Monday, March 21. The press conference will start at 4:30 p.m. with a barbeque meal to follow.

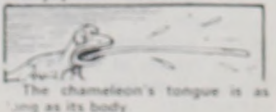
Barbeque Supper Very Successful

An update on the amount of money raised will follow in this newspaper.

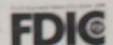

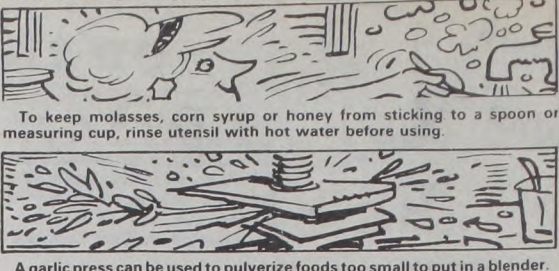
