Several interested citizens met Monday night at the Community Monday night at the Community Center in Quitaque to discuss projects and events for the upcoming Sesquicentennial in 1986. The State of Texas will be 150 years old. Preparation has begun all over the state to promote the birthday celebra-

tion.
Janice Henson presided over the meeting and presented sev-eral things that the community can do. Some events decided on were Tree Planting on Arbor Day, January 17; Independence Day Observance, March 2; a Sesquicentennial poster contest; a special edition of the Valley Tribune (everyone is being asked to start now to go through old newspapers, letters, anything that has happened in the Quitaque area over the last 150 years and take them to the Valley Tribune); revitalization of Main Street and a clean-up of the town; collecting taped remines-censes of the whole community

and the area's eldest settlers: a Fourth of July celebration for the entire community. A museum project was adopted for the Sesquicentennial year. The edi-tor of the Valley Tribune has had or or the valley Tribune has had numerous suggestions for a museum in Quitaque through personal contact or through letters. A committee will be appointed to look into this project.

Quitaque, together with Silverton, is planning a County-wide celebration for August 9, 1986, to be held at the courthouse in Silverton.
