Train To Estelline Returns Saturday

The Train To Estelline will make a return run Saturday, May 20, 1989, bringing excitement like the city of Estelline hasn't seen in several years.

The public is invited to be on hand as the train, carrying distinguished guests and celebrities, rolls into Estelline at 1:30 p.m. enroute from Ft Worth on a promotional run.

Once in Estelline, hundreds are expected to gather on the square as Mayor Tom Seay extends the formal welcome at 2 p.m. Noted author of *The Train To Estelline*, Jane Wood, will present the history of her novel.

Following the brief program and introductions,

Mrs. Wood will be on hand to autograph copies of her acclaimed best seller at a reception to be held in the Senior Citizens room at City Hall.

An arts and crafts show is planned to be set up around the square and at various businesses around town, as well as live entertainment by Country Fever of Memphis. Barbeque sandwiches and other concessions will be available on the square.

The train will depart at 7 a.m. from the Burlington Northern Railroad yard in North Ft. Worth and will be making stops along the way at Wichita Falls and Childress to pick up members of the media, mayors and other invited guests. Pass-

engers will unload at 1:30 p.m. in Estelline and will board at 4 p.m. for their return trip back to their destinations.

The list of special guests grows more everyday, but as of last week, a partial list includes actresses Nancy Stafford of the television series *Matlock* and the famous Jean Stapleton, New York movie producer, Harry Thompson, a movie director, Bob Summers of *Texas Weekly*, Ellen Temple, publisher and member of the State Historical Society, and her daughter, John Ford of *Country News*, and *The Country Reporter*, Tom Dodge, essayist for *KERA*, Educational T.V. in Dallas, Mr. and Mrs. Andy Thompson, Railroad Exec for Burlington Northern Railroad, and their children Devon and Erin, John Prock of *ABC's Texas Tales*, Bob Compton of *Dallas Morning News*, Larry Swindle of the Ft. Worth Star Telegram, Alex Burton of Channel 8-Dallas, members of the Texas Legislature, and many more members of the news media and mayors of the area. Quitaque Mayor Elgin Conner will board the train at Childress.

Everyone is encouraged to attend the Train To Estelline affair, spend the day, and visit with the special guests. Copies of the book will be available at various sites around Estelline.

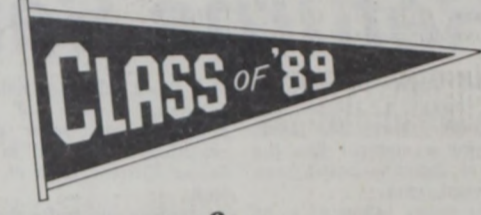

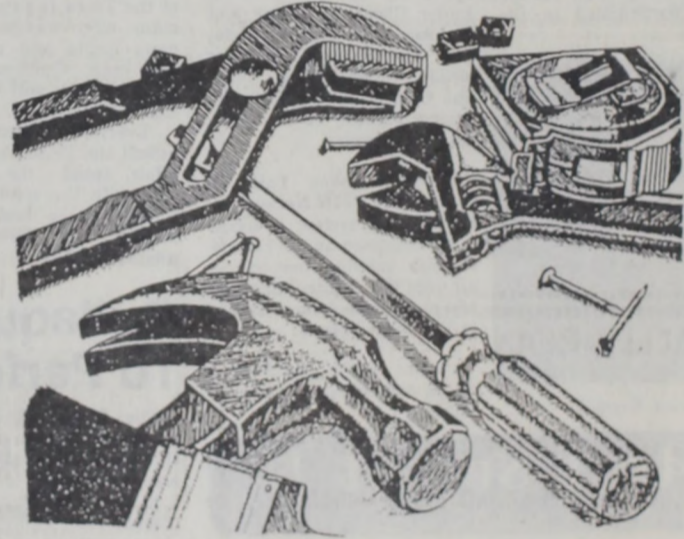

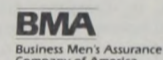

State Comptroller Bob Bullock said Friday that May's statewide sales tax payments to cities, counties and transit authorities continued to follow this year's steady upward trend.

"We've watched sales tax rebates across the state grow by more than eleven percent overall this year. More money is being pumped into our economy, which is great for the state and for local governments," Bullock said.

Briscoe County received a total payment of \$4,679.19, with \$2,316.15 of that going to the city of Quitaque. That is an increase of 26.34 percent over the same period last year.

The city of Turkey did not fare as well as others across the state. Hall County received \$17,608.56, with only \$1,753.86 going to Turkey. That is a 9.20 percent decline over the same period last year, when the city received a payment of \$1,931.66.
