

Tax Receipts Show Increase

State Comptroller Bob Bullock said Friday that May's statewide sales tax payments to cities, counties and transit authorities continued to follow this year's steady upward trend.

governments," Bullock said.

Briscoe County received a total payment of \$4,679.19, with \$ 2,316.15 of that going to the city of Quitaque. That is an increase of 26.34 percent over the same period
