
There's no substitute for the beauty of a natural Christmas tree if it's wisely purchased and safely used, says Bill Smith, forestry specialist for the Texas Aricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University.

Texas imports nearly five million Christmas trees annually, some as far away as Western Canada, points out Smith. As a result, the trees are stored in boxcars that undergo temperature extremes.

"Those exposed to warm temperatures for a period of several weeks may already have dried out by the time they're put on our Texas markets," Smith notes.

To keep a Christmas tree fresh and green, he suggests these guidelines:

1. Buy your tree early. This will enable you to be selective in purchasing a reasonably fresh tree. Check for signs of needle.
