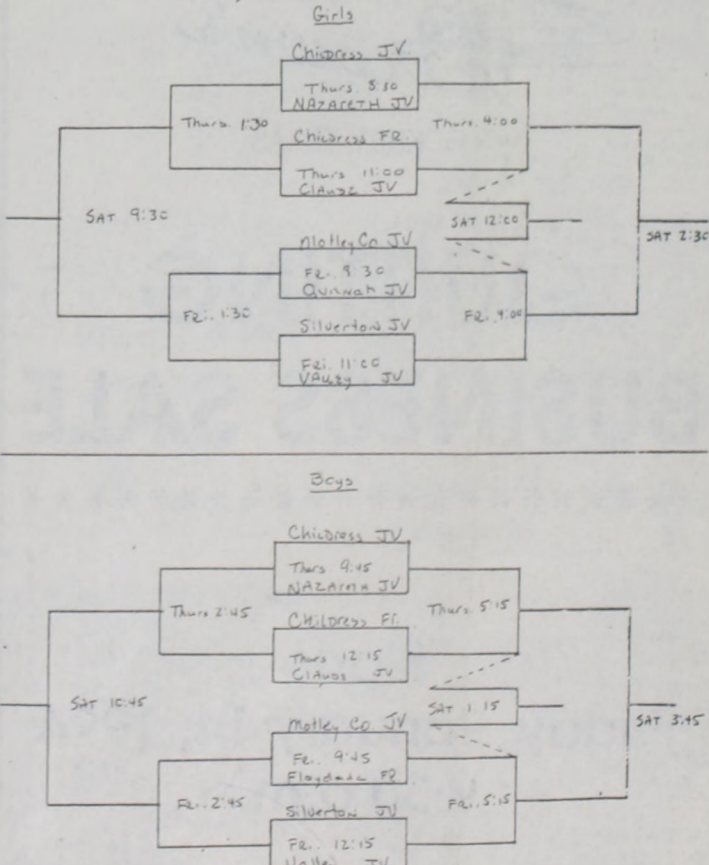

Funeral services for A. Howard Colvin were held on Monday, December 27, 1993, at the Mc Gorry Brothers Funeral Home in Lakewood Ohio. The Rev. Dana Fleming of the Lakewood United Methodist Church and Father Al Meyers of St. Christopher Church co-officiated. Interment will be in Beaumont, Texas at a later date.

Mr. Colvin passed away on December 22, 1993, at Lakewood Hospital. He had been ill for several weeks.

He was born in Turkey, Texas on November 25, 1923. He served in the 71st Infantry, 44th Division of the U.S. Army in World War II. While he attended the University of Texas at Austin, he met and later married Juanita Fremrin of Beaumont, Texas on June 1, 1949. Mr. Colvin practiced law for the State of Texas after he passed the State Bar in 1957. In 1959 he went to work for the Federal Bureau of Investigation and this work took him and his growing family in succession from Austin to Omaha, Nebraska; Newark, New Jersey; and finally to Cleveland Ohio. In 1979, Mr. Colvin retired from the FBI. He enjoyed reading, photography and travelling. In his retirement he enjoyed attending Army reunions and family reunions as well as keeping in touch with other retired FBI agents through the Society of Former FBI Agents.

He was preceded in death by his wife; his brother Roy Colvin, (also of Turkey, Texas) and his son Phillip L. Colvin.
