



Space Odyssey In Houston

Would the future's best stories be written in space? Or was there still enough to write about here on earth.

In the early morning hours, my husband and I sipped coffee on the balcony of our South Shore Harbour hotel room, and saw the lights of cars flickering on the Galveston Bay bridge. Chemical plants refineries in Texas City - self generated cities within themlves - lit the horizon.

Directly below balcony was a marina filled with luxury boats and yachts. Some boats were returning from an evening cruse - others making their way into Galveston Bay for early morning fishing.

Across Clear Lake was the Space Johnson NASA where we had Center, returned from earlier that evening. We came

Houston to participate in the 2003 Texas Press Associaon Convention - A Space NASA Family will rebound Odyssey - and all participants were invited to a tour of the Johnson Space Center and a reception at Space Center Houston.

As we set there, I reflected that visiting the Space Center was a long time O' Keefe. dream of mine.

Now finally, on our Space Center tour, I had stood

before the historic Mission (a registered Control historical landmark), where on July 20, 1969 - from approximately 384,401 km away - history making words echoed through the room.

"Houston ... the Eagle has landed."

For the first time, mankind set foot on a celestial body other than his

Then, on a winter morning in 2003, another significant event took place, which brought sadness and dismay rather than jubilation.

The NASA Space Shuttle Columbia disintegrated in a return flight to earth over northern Texas. All astronauts on board were killed.

In the aftermath of the tragedy, I wrote an article about a former Eastland resident, County Mulholland, who was working at Mission Control in Houston that morning.

The events surrounding the Columbia tragedy became very real to me, and I had contemplated what the mood would be at the Space only months Center following the disaster.

It did not surprise me that an atmosphere of remembrance, but also a definite feeling of pushing ahead and beyond the tragedy, prevailed.

Only days after returning from Houston, I learned that a Return to Flight team had been created in preparation for flights by the remaining Shuttles Endeavour, Atlantis, and Discovery.

Baird Receives ORCA Grant

The City of Baird has received a grant of \$250,000

awarded through the Office of Rural Community Affairs' Community Texas Development Program. Baird was the only entity within Callahan County that received an award from the TCDP last month.

The grant will go to the Community Development Fund, and will replace old, deteriorated sewer outfall line (source of infiltration, sewage spills and service interruptions) through the installation of 5,500' of 12" line, 1,700' of 10" line, boreencasement and 24 manholes.

The City of Baird provided a match of \$65,000.

ORCA announced it has awarded 206 grants totaling \$50,691,368 to rural cities and counties across the state for infrastructure, public facility improvements, housing unit rehabilitation and planning and capacity bulding activities. The awards are the result of biennial competitions for the Community Development, Housing Rehabilitation, and Planning and Capacity Building Funds, which are part of the agency's Texas Community Development Program (TCDP).


"These funds provide for the basic necessities that many of us take for granted," said Robt. J. "Sam" Tessen, MS, ORCA's Executive Director. "The monies are vital to rural Texas communities with limited funding options to cover

infrastructure needs. the ORCA's mission is to assist these communities in the most efficient, cost-effective means possible for the benefit of all Texans, and these federally funded grants help us to help "I have no doubt that the rural communities provide for basic human needs."

"TCDP funds are development tools for neighborhood stabilization, revitalization, economic development, and other critical community development needs," explains Orlia Cardenas, Director of ORCA's TCDP. "The program brings together residents, local officials, community development corporations, and community and business leaders in partnerships that benefit local communities."

The Community Development Fund is currently distributed on a biennial basis through annual competitions held in each of the twentyfour state planning regions. The Community Develop ment Fund principally addressses water, sewer, and

Dear Editor:

Have you ever wondered how it feels to be left in a strange place, with strange people? A place where you don't know anyone? A place where no wants you, and no one will speak to you? If they do speak to you, you don't understand them, but their tone of voice and their facial features are very unpleasant? If you try to make friends with them, they hit you and throw things at you? You are hungry and thirsty. These strange, very unpleasant people will not help you in any way. Can you imagine any of that? Well, if you can imagine that at all, that is what it is like when a dog or cat is dumped on a county road.

I live about 1 1/2 miles down a dirt road. People are always dumping animals down it. I talked with someone once about it. They said, "Well at least if I dump them, they have a chance." Let me

tell what I have observed that a dumped animal has a

chance to do. Last week, someone dumped a litter of 2 puppies and the mama on our road. The mama appears to be a part border collie. She looked really good when she was first dumped out there. She is still there. She and her puppies are right where her owner left her. She is hungry, hot and certainly thirsty. She is protective of her puppies, but at some point, she will weaken and a coyote, bobcat, or something else will get one. She has the chance to see her pups get run over by a vehicle. Hopefully, it will die on impact. Otherwise, it will lay there suffering. It will be in pain, and hot and hungry and thirsty. The group will have the chance to drink foul water, making them weaker and sicker. She, herself, has a chance to get run over. If she does, the puppies really die even slower. She has a chance to eat frogs, toads, and lizards. Once in a while, some one will come by and throw her scraps, but that really just prolongs her agony. She is still waiting in the same spot where her owner left her. She looks worse every day. Her hair is dusty from people passing her by, and her coat is full of stickers and burrs. When she lays down in the shade, she is uncomfortable. Last night it rained on them.

This is not the first time that I have seen this. Last year a litter of 4 puppies were dumped near my house. One by one they were all run over except 1. He finally made it into my yard after several months of living under a culvert. He growled and snapped at me. I was forced to get someone to come and shoot him. It was not my fault or his fault or even the shooter's fault, but the person who dumped him into a living nightmare.

Two years ago, a small dog with several puppies were dumped on a curve near a house on a dirt road. A group of teenage boys told me they were trying to run over a puppy a day until they were all gone. One by one the puppies disappeared. The mama dog went into heat, and then she disappeared.

Those of us who live on county roads are faced with a no win situation. We can ignore the animal. We can shoot the animal. We can take it to town and re-dump it, and let the city take up the expense of keeping and killing it. If we take it to the pound ourselves, we then are charged the kill fee even though it is not our animal.

I hope that this hit's home for just one person who dumps animals. The animal has no chance. It lives in hell, then it dies. Please be kind enough to spare animals the agony of being dumped.



Shuttle Disaster Still Felt Here

Official word from NASA is expected soon on the cause of the Space Shuttle Columbia explosion near (or over) Eastland County on Feb. 1.

They may never know the exact reason for the malfunction of the Shuttle as it returned to orbit. Seven astronauts were lost in this disaster.

Eastland County people were affected in various ways by this tragedy, and will probably always be. For this was not just a local story - but a world-wide story that will go down in history.

At the newspapers we still learn of people who have personal ties to the story. One of these is Evelyn Kirk of Cisco, who shared some information with

us. A cousin of hers, Hazel B. Kelley-Wilson of Amarillo, is the head of a company founded by her late husband. Jack. B. Kelley. Her son, Ken Kelley, is President of Jack B. Kelley Inc., which delivers fuel to NASA.

This is a large company with branches all across the United States.

The Jack B. Kelley Inc. Newsletter of Feb., 2003 (Published before disaster) is filled with photos and biographies of the Columbia's Astronauts, each a very special person.

The lead to the story is titled "Star of Amarillo: Commander Rick Husbands." Rick Husbands, a resident of Amarillo, was also a friend of the Kelleys and other personnel of the company.

NASA had sent VIP Hazel Kelley-Wilson and others to the January 16 launch of Columbia. The story said that Columbia would carry a research module holding more than 80 experiments.

During the planning stages of the mission, Commander Rick Husbands invited the Jack B. Kelley Company to send some memorabilia into space in honor of their involvement in the space program. The company flag, symbolizing Jack B. Kelley's 50-yr involvement in the space program, was sent to accompany Husbands and the crew on their 15-day mission.

Hazel Kelley-Wilson and other representatives of the company attended launching.

The Lite Lines March Newsletter of Jack B. Kelley Inc. tell of the return to earth of shuttle.

"Columbia's return was set for the morning of Feb. 1. Never before in NASA's history had there been complications during a shuttle re-entry, the astronaut crew was as good as home.

"At the Kennedy Space Center in Florida around 9 a.m.(est) families of the astronauts, dignitaries, politicians and representatives of the Israeli government were on hand to witness the shuttle's landing.
