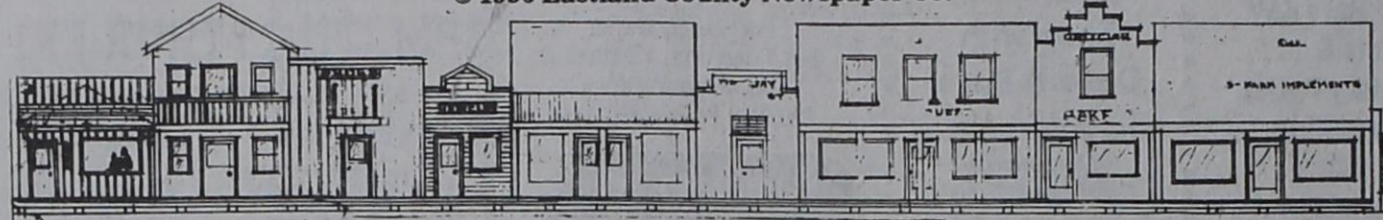

The great trouble was to start the ball in motion successfully; this, however, has been done and the Bell Plaine College is no longer an experiment.

AUSTIN — Federal judges last week annulled the March primaries in three Texas congressional districts where race was ruled to have been the main factor in drawing boundaries.

The panel of three judges — all appointed by Republican presidents — approved new, more compactly shaped districts. Redrawing those districts affected the shape and makeup of seven contiguous districts in the Houston area and six in the Dallas area.

So, the panel ordered special elections in those 13 districts set for Nov. 5, the same day as the general election for the rest of the state. The special elections will be open to all candidates of either party, and runoffs will be Dec. 10.

But, the redistricting plan did not sit well with House Speaker Pete Laney and Attorney General Dan Morales, both Democrats. The officials were contemplating an appeal to the U.S. Supreme Court last week to overturn the lower court decision.

Laney and Morales said voter confusion and unnecessary shifting of boundary lines will be key arguments if they appeal the order. Laney, who had a plan that would have changed the shape of only nine districts, said an early analysis of the court order is "more intrusive than necessary." Morales said only six districts need be changed.

Lt. Gov. Bob Bullock, a Democrat, had asked the judges not to take action and instead leave the matter to the 1997 Legislature. After the panel approved the new boundaries, Bullock praised their efforts. "The plan does not smack of politics or needlessly change boundaries that had already been set," he told the *Austin American-Statesman*.

Minimal changes were made to the two black majority districts in Dallas, but a largely Hispanic

district in Houston lost about 15 percent of its Hispanic voters and no longer has a Hispanic majority.

**Principals to Receive Cash**

Some Texas public school principals will be getting more than a jolt of self esteem for their role in improving their campuses. They will receive cash awards of up to \$5,000.

In the fall, principals of the state's most improved schools will receive checks — to use as they wish — based on the school's rating and the criteria being developed by a panel appointed by Gov. George W. Bush. The criteria are to be completed by Sept. 1.

"It's a check written to the principal. There are no strings attached," Criss Clout of the Texas Education Agency told the Associated Press.

Under the Principal Performance Incentives Program — part of the sweeping education bill passed by the 1995 Legislature — \$5 million will be disbursed. The program was tacked onto S.B. 1 by Rep. Kent Grusendorf, R-Arlington.

Some teachers, however, criticized the program because it left insolvent the Texas Successful Schools Awards System, another student performance-based program that did not focus on principals.

**Drivers Skirting Insurance Law**

Many Texas drivers are finding illegal ways to skirt a state law that requires them to carry liability car insurance all year.

The *Austin American-Statesman* analyzed state data and found that about 21 percent of drivers involved in accidents last year were not insured or their insurance status was unknown.

One way consumers avoid paying costly premiums is to purchase a six- or 12-month policy and then cancel it after a month — long enough to receive their proof of insurance card that allows them to renew their driver's license and vehicle registration or obtain an inspection sticker.

Another method cheaters use to acquire an insurance card is to purchase a one-month from businesses that advertise them in the telephone book.

Lack of enforcement is part of the problem. Lawmakers have rejected enforcement proposals as too expensive for the state, too burdensome on insurers and too heartless toward low-income drivers, the *American-Statesman* reported.

**Other Capital Highlights**

Bruce Casteel has been named senior captain (commander) of the Texas Rangers, succeeding Maurice Cook who retires at the end of the month. Casteel, 54, is a 23-year veteran of the 173-year-old elite law enforcement unit. He has served as assistant commander of the Rangers since 1992.

Texas Republican Party Chairman Tom Pauken was awarded \$180,683 by a Dallas County jury which concluded that a former business associate stole information from his firm, Texas Voter List, and sold it to Pauken's opponents in his unsuccessful 1991 race for the 3rd Congressional District seat.

Texas Insurance Commissioner Elton Bomer approved a new computerized "bulletin board system" that will match homeowners having trouble finding insurance with companies that will sell them coverage. The Market Assistant Program begins in October.

Victor Morales, Democratic candidate for the U.S. Senate, last week challenged incumbent U.S. Sen. Phil Gramm to promise voters that he would serve a full, six-year term if re-elected instead of running for president in the year 2000. Gramm's spokesman said the senator would only promise to work hard in 2000 to re-elect Bob Dole as president.

**'Twister' To Show At Majestic Theatre For Another Weekend**

The spectacular movie "Twister" is being held over for the third weekend at the Majestic in Eastland, according to Ed Allcorn, Manager of the Theatre.

Allcorn reports that over 2400 people have seen this film during its two weekends at the local Theatre — and some of them more than once. So if you missed this interesting picture, now is your chance to take time out

and see it.

This is only the second movie Allcorn has ever held over for three weeks at the Theatre. The other was "Dances With Wolves."

"Twister" opened in big-city theatres last May, and was first at the box office for several weeks.

Its next showing at the Majestic will be Friday, August 16 through Monday, August 19. Curtain

## Logsdon To Host Church Ministry Conference

Hardin-Simmons University's Logsdon School of Theology will host its first Big Country Church Ministry Conference, Oct. 11-12.

Theme will be "Sharing the Load: Blessing the Gifts of Your People."

The program, open to all ministers, will be geared toward pastors, including those serving small congregations.

Program personalities will include: Dr. William (Bill) Hendricks, Brite Divinity School at Texas Christian University, Fort Worth; Dr. Michael Whitehorn, vice president for student development at HSU; Dr. Herb Pedersen, director of the missions division for the Baptist General Convention of Texas, Dallas; Dr. Don Mattingly, minister of education and outreach, and Dr. Jeff Reid, associate pastor, both of Pioneer Drive Baptist Church, Abilene.

"Each speaker has a background in small congregations," said Dr. Ronnie Prevost, coordinator.

Pastors from throughout the Big Country are invited and to bring their wives and children, Dr.

Prevost said.

Highlights will include insights on 1) Biblical basis for shared ministry; 2) barriers to shared ministry; and 3) tools for discovering gifts.

The cost of the conference, which includes meals and the program, is \$70 for an individual, \$80 for a pastor and his wife and \$90 for an entire family. Special activities, including attendance at the football game of HSU Cowboys and Mississippi College at 2 p.m., on Saturday, will be available for family members, said Dr. Prevost.

"The only additional expenses will be housing and we have arranged for a block of rooms at the Days Inn in Abilene for \$38 a night (plus tax)," said Dr. Prevost.

### House Prepares For August Recess

Despite very long hours and some heated debate, the House of Representatives made significant breakthroughs this week in ending gridlock and passing important legislation with strong bipartisan support.

### Health Insurance Reform Bill is Passed: Self-Employed Deductibility Raised to 80%

On Thursday, August 1, the House passed the Health Coverage Availability and Affordability Act, legislation that begins to reform the nation's health care insurance system. The bill passed by a vote of 421-2.

In an effort to achieve health insurance reform, the Congress focused on

so-called "portability" reform, a guarantee that employees would not lose their health insurance because of a job change or unemployment.

Under the House and Senate agreement, insurance companies would generally be prohibited from denying health coverage to workers who change or lose their jobs, and it would prevent insurers from excluding coverage for pre-existing conditions for more than one year.

I am particularly pleased to report that self-employed individuals will be able to deduct 80% of health insurance costs.

For many years I have supported legislation that would provide farmers and other self-employed individuals with the abil-

ity to deduct 100% of their health insurance costs. Increasing the deductibility from 30% to 80% will mean a great deal to farmers in particular.

As a result of this legislation, taxpayers will now be permitted to deduct, as an itemized medical deduction, qualified long-term care expenses, including premiums for such care. In addition, terminally ill and chronically ill individuals will be permitted to receive life insurance benefits prior to death without paying any taxes on such benefits.

### House Passes Minimum Wage/Tax Cut Bill

In another overwhelmingly bipartisan vote of 354-72, the House approved a bill increasing the minimum wage from \$4.25 an hour to \$5.15. Taken as a whole, I was particularly supportive of the various tax changes in the bill.

I supported this bill, which passed by a vote of 328-101, after I was successful in adding a provision that allows Texas to implement the welfare reform plan passed by the Texas Legislature.

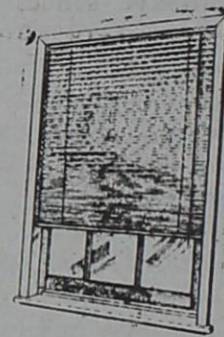

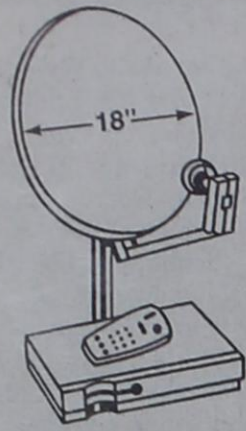

**National School Lunch Program**

**Letter to Households (Multi-child) National School Lunch Program/School Breakfast Program**

**Parent/Guardian:**  
The Baird school serves meals each school day. Children may buy lunch for \$1.25 and breakfast for 50¢. Children may also get meals free or at a reduced price.

If you now get food stamps or AFDC for your children, your child can get free meals. If your total household income is the same or less than the amounts on the Income Chart below, your children can get free meals or reduced-price meals. A foster child may get free or reduced-price meals regardless of your income. The reduced price is 40¢ for lunch and 30¢ for breakfast.

**To get free or reduced-priced meals for your children, you must complete an application and return it to the school. We cannot approve an application that is not complete.**

**How To Apply:**  
If you now get food stamps or AFDC for the child you are applying for, the application must have the child's name, a food stamp or AFDC case number for that child, and the signature of an adult household member. If you are applying for a foster child, the application must have the child's name, the child's "personal use" income, and an adult signature. If you do not list a food stamp or AFDC case number for the child you are applying for, then the application must have the child's names, the amount of income each person got last month and

where it came from, the signature of an adult household member, and that adult's social security number or the word "none" if the adult does not have a social security number.

**Verification:** Your eligibility may be checked at any time during the school year. School officials may ask you to send papers showing that your children should get free or reduced-price meals.

**Fair Hearing:** You may talk to school officials if you do not agree with the school's decision or the results of verification. You may also ask for a fair hearing. You may do this by calling or writing:

**Reporting Changes:** If your child gets free or reduced-price meals because of your income, you must tell the school if your household size decreases or your income increases by more than \$50 per month or \$600 per year. If your child gets meals because you get food stamps or AFDC, you must tell the school when you are not getting AFDC or food stamps for them. You may then fill out another application giving income information.

**Confidentiality:** School officials use the information on the appli-

cation only to decide if your child should get free or reduced-price meals. Free and reduced-price eligibility information may be subject to release to other federal, state and local education, health, or other means programs. Some programs already identified are the National Assessment of Educational Progress and officials collecting data for allocation and evaluation purposes.

**Reapplication:** You may apply for meals anytime during the school year. If you are not eligible now but have a change in status, like a decrease in household income, an increase in household size, become unemployed or get food stamps or AFDC for your child, you may then complete an application.

**Handicapped:** Meal substitutions at no additional cost for children who meet the definition of "handicapped" will be served, provided a physician has submitted a statement attesting to this fact and prescribing a substitute.

**In the operation of the child feeding programs, no child will be discriminated against because of race, sex, color, national origin, age or handicap. If you believe you have been discriminated against, write immediately to the Secretary of Agriculture, Washington, D. C. 20250.**

**BAIRD INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT**

Recently the State Auditor published a report entitled "Savings Profile System". Although John Sharp, State Comptroller, questioned the methods used by the state auditor the proposed budget for the Baird ISD 1996/97 budget took into consideration most of the suggestions. The areas where expenses are being trimmed are administrative, maintenance, and extra-curricular. The budget for teaching supplies and materials has been maintained. The budget for expanding technology has been cut significantly during '95 and in the proposed budget for 1996/97. Technology is one area that is regrettable because we will just get further behind.

As patrons look at the proposed budget a logical question would be "If you are cutting all these expenses why is the budget only slightly less than last years budget?" The state legislature has mandated teacher pay raises (95/96 & 96/97) that offset the reduction in expenditures. The proposed budget for 96/97 is \$54,000 less than 1995 with a mandated increase is teacher salaries of over \$90,000.

The state aid to Baird ISD is based on local tax effort. This budget year is the last of the biennium and the next two school years (97/98 & 98/99) state funding will be determined by the local effort in 1996/97. If we do not maintain our present tax rate per \$100 of evaluation BISD would be forced to increase taxes in the next two years to make up for lost state aid.

The Baird ISD is a community service and makes every effort to provide the highest quality education for the least dollars. The budget is a difficult item to understand if you do not work with it every day. Interested patrons are invited to the superintendent's office for a review of the budget proceeds and

**Go Baird!**

An estimated one in 20 adults and three in 20 children unconsciously grind their teeth at night. It is the sound of bruxism. While the noise may disturb spouses or children, it has a far more distressing effect on the sleeper.  
Nocturnal grinding can exert thousands of pounds of pressure per square inch on the surfaces of teeth. It can be rough not only on teeth but on the supporting bone, the gums and jaw joint.
