

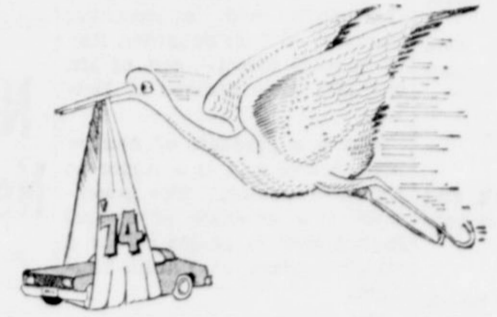
She is a graduate of Baylor University School of Dental Hygiene and is currently an associate professor of dental hygiene at the University of Pennsylvania School of Dental Medicine.

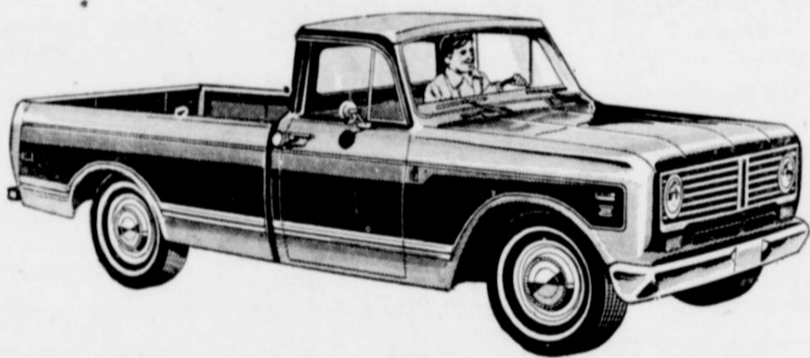

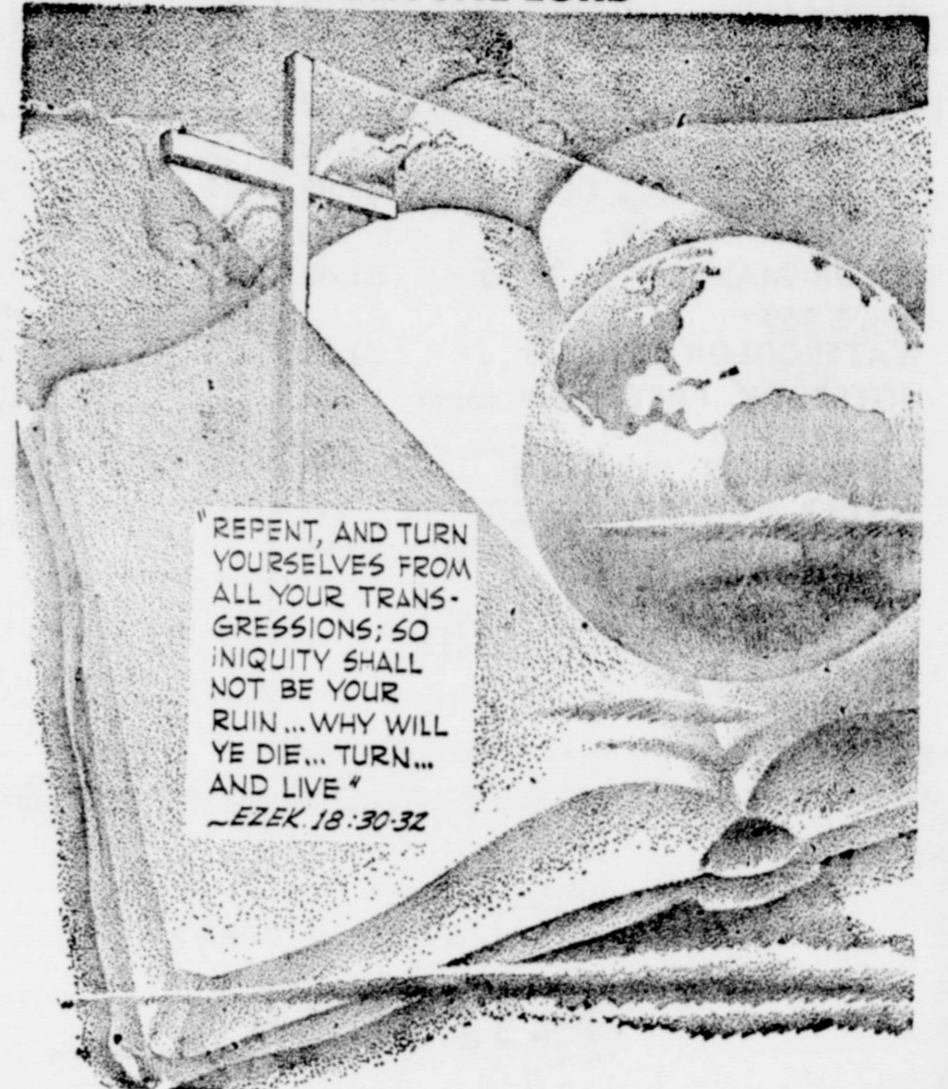
