TOP BULL FIGHTER FOR BAIRD RODEO



The Twentieth Century Club ness, the Council voted to raise water rates from \$2.75 for a minimum of 1500 gallons to \$4.00. All over 1500 gallons at \$1.00 per thousand was an increase from the previous rate of .75 per 1000. The City also voted to bill the minimum rate regardless if the water customer uses any water or not. The bills are delinquent after 30 days, and are subject to being disconnected, with a \$4.00 connection charge if the customer's water service is discontinued. Also, a higher deposit will be required.
