

All Eligible Voters Urged To Go To Polls and Vote in Elections May 4

As you know, political parties will conduct primary elections on May 4th to determine party candidates to local, district and statewide offices.

In the statewide elections, Omer Burselson is unopposed in his race for Congress, 17th Congressional District. Three have filed in the race for State Senator 30th Senatorial District - Ray Farabee, Charles Fennell and Mrs. Mary Kirchhoff. Lynn Nabers is unopposed for State Representative 55th District.

In district elections, Cora Mae Payne is unopposed for the position of District Clerk.

Several county elections will be held Saturday. Filing for the office of County Judge, A. E. Dyer Jr.; County Clerk, Beatrice Deal; County Treasurer, Hazel Reynolds, and three filings for County Superintendent, incumbent L. C. Cash, E. L. "Chief" Reese and Robert F. Joy, Jr.

Garvin Jones is unopposed for Justice of the Peace Precinct

1, as is Walter Francisco for Justice of the Peace, Precinct 8. Lowell Johnson has filed for re-election to the position of County Commissioner, Precinct No. 2.

Primary elections will be held in the Community Building, instead of the American Legion Hall, due to conflicting activities. Polls will be open from 8 a. m. to 7 p. m.

The May 4th Democratic Precinct Convention will be held at the County Courthouse in Baird at 2 p. m. In order to participate in the Convention, you must be a qualified Democratic voter, and must have voted in the 1974 primary election. The main purpose of the Convention is to elect delegates and alternates to the Democratic County Convention, to be held one week later in Baird.

Every eligible voter is urged to vote in the vitally important election to be held Saturday, May 4th, and to attend the Precinct Convention.

Baird Bands To Close Year's Work With Concert Tuesday Night

BAIRD — The public is cordially invited to attend a concert of the High School Band, the Stage Band and Junior High Band Tuesday evening, May 7th at 7:30 in the high school auditorium. Admission is free.

The Junior High band, made up of 31 students in the 5th and 6th grades, will begin the concert and will play several selections, including Greensleeves, Stage Coach Trail and Festival March.

BAIRD — The annual Callahan County Sheriffs' Posse Rodeo, which is scheduled to begin Thursday, May 2 through May 4, will feature some of the world's top-name cowboys. Two of the RCA current world champions are expected to be among the top cowboys returning to Baird.

Calf roper (Ernie Taylor of Hugo, Okla., and bareback bronc rider Joe Alexander of Cord, Wyo., have indicated early that they plan to compete at Baird. Alexander won \$666 of his 1973 total of \$37,021 by winning his specialty at last year's Baird rodeo. Marvin Shoulders of Henrietta, Okla., who also plans to enter here, was the bull riding winners of last years rodeo. Both Alexander and Shoulders are current leaders in their events.

Thursday, Friday and Saturday night performances will feature saddle and bareback bronc riding, bull riding, steer wrestling and calf roping, said rodeo chairman Easy Parsons.

Contestants will add their \$20.00 entry fees to a \$1,500 purse. Last year at the rodeo, with 398 entries, prize money topped \$9,200.

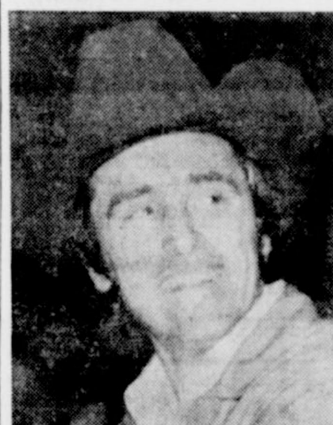
