## Sid Bogan Finishes 50 Years As Mason

On Monday, November 24, the Quitaque Lodge No. 1248, A. F. & A. M. held an Open House meeting in the Lodge Hall to honor Sidney T. Bogan.

Mr. Bogan was presented with a 50-Year button and an Award from the Grand Lodge of Texas, and with a Shaeffer desk set from the local Lodge. He received the Foscione Degrees in July, August and September, 1919, in Turkey Lodge No. 1050. There was no Masonic Lodge in Quitaque at that time. About 1926 the Turkey Lodge surrendered its charter to the Grand Lodge.

In the summer of 1927 Masons of Quitaque were issued a Dispensation for a Lodge, and in December, 1927 meeting of the Grand Lodge a Charter No. 1248 was issued to Quitaque Lodge.

Brother Bogan was the first Worshipful Master, serving the first two terms. During the following years Sid served in practically every office in the Lodge and

During the first 50 years of Mr. Bogan's Masonic affiliation he probably conferred more degrees in his Lodge than any other Mason in the area, and today it is a rare occasion when he misses a meeting and is very active.

The Grand Lodge Award and button was presented by District Deputy Conn of Abernathy, the Shaeffer desk set by Worshipful Master James M. Davidson. The Crestados, the local singing group composed of Gail Tyler, Jolene Hall, Vanessa Robison and pianist Anna Jean Taylor, presented two beautiful numbers.

Approximately 75 people, including a number of visitors from area towns, attended the meeting.

Light refreshments of spiced tea and coffee were served. In 1967 was again elected as Worshipful Master.

Huffman coached at Lubbock High from 1931 until 1935, when he joined the Texas Tech coaching staff. His duties were freshman football coach, varsity basketball coach, and track coach. He interrupted his coaching duties for four years of duty in the Air Force and then returned to Red Ralderland. He left Lubbock in 1947 to coach New Mexico's Lobos, a post he held until 1952.

Then came the divorce from coaching. He threw himself enthusiastically into the work and made thousands of new friends. But when the chance to coach again was offered, he knew what the answer would be. He responded as eagerly as a drowning man will when offered a straw.

The new "marriage" has worked so well that Huffman is still on a honeymoon. He's one of the hardest workers on the entire coaching staff. He comes early, leaves late, and he's never too busy to talk with an old friend or a young athlete asking for advice. To many, Berl Huffman is the greatest living example of the Tech Tech spirit that has made the big West Texas college the envy of many an older, more sophisticated campus.

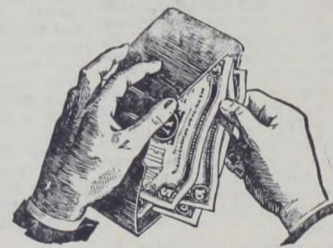

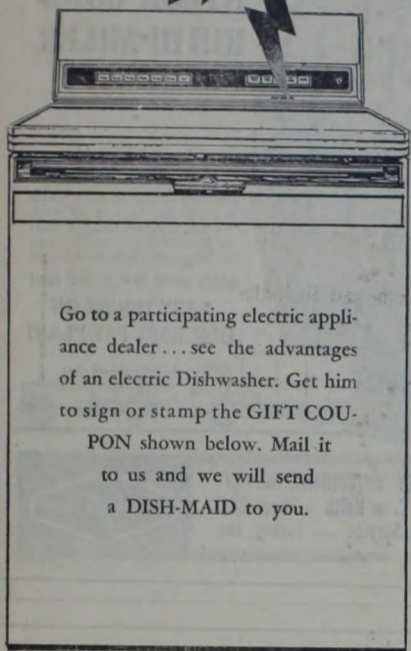

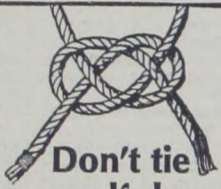
