## Carolyn Foster To Run For Hall County Tax-Assessor

Carolyn Foster of Memphis, Texas has announced her candidacy for Hall County Tax Assessor-Collector.

The following statements were made by Carolyn Foster:

On Monday, December 4th, I paid my filing fee to become a candidate for the office of Hall County Tax Assessor-Collector, subject to the Democrat primary to be held Tuesday, March 12th, 1996.

My family and I have been residents of Hall County for four generations. T.K. and Minnie Wilton were my great-grandparents. My father, G.W. Lockhart was the grandson of Mr. & Mrs. Wilton. My late mother, Janice, was the daughter of Millie Murphy and the late E. M. Murphy, a longtime residents of Hall County.

I graduated from Memphis High School in 1966 and have been a resident of Hall County my entire life. I married Billy Foster in 1966 and we have one son, Cody Foster. The Fosters were also early settlers of Hall County.

I worked for the First National Bank of Memphis from 1970 until 1987 at which time I began working for the Soil Conservation Service office in Memphis. I became the business manager and tax collector for the Lakeview I.S.D. in 1990, and began the work on my Texas State requirement to become a certified tax assessor/collector. I was employed as Hall County Deputy Tax Assessor/Collector in January of 1993. I completed my state certification for the Board of Tax Professional Examiners in October of 1993.

Having worked in the tax office of both a school district and a county, I fully understand the importance and responsibility of the position of Tax Assessor/Collector. I understand the necessity of continuing education, which is required to adapt to rapid changes in tax law at both the state and county level. However changes are not limited to tax statutes. They also include vehicle registration and title work and voter registration.

If elected I pledge to work with each and every citizen of Hall County in a fair and impartial manner. I look forward to visiting with each of you in the next few weeks to discuss any suggestion you may have with regard to the office and to solicit your vote.

December Immunization Clinics Available

Immunization Clinics offering vaccines that give protection against several childhood diseases are scheduled for December. Protection is against Polio, Diphtheria, Lock Jaw (Tetanus), Whooping Cough (Pertussis), Measles, Rubella, Mumps and HIB (Haemophilus Influenzae Type B).

The Texas Department of Health is charging money to help with the cost of keeping the clinic open. The amount of money charged will be based on family income and size, and the ability to pay.

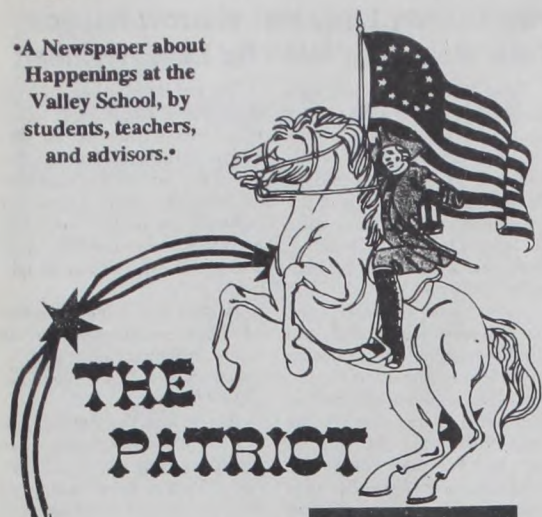

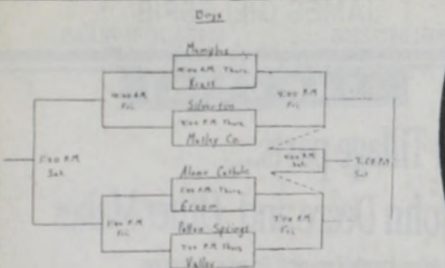
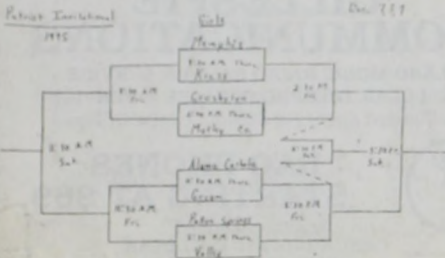
