The opposition to the Hogg amendments appears to be the Hogg amendments. Hogg himself rather than his amendments.

The railroad attorneys with one accord proclaim that the Hogg amendments are in violation of the national constitution. Why, of course!

Kansas has queer laws. They permit saloons to run in defiance of law and then permit Mrs. Nation and a lot of cranky women to go over the state smacking the saloon fixtures.

The Dallas News wants to know why the Filippino amigos are being sworn to support the constitution of the United States if, as the administration contends, the constitution has never gone there.

It is said that Speaker Pinion of the Texas Legislature is a blood relation of the great Napoleon. His photo shows a likeness to the great commander, which perhaps gave rise to the report of his kinship.

The democratic contention is that whoever the flag goes it carries. Consultation with it. If this doctrine is not correct the President and congress are usurpers because outside of the constitution they have no right to send an army to foreign countries.

The Missouri house of representatives adopted a resolution of sympathy for the Filippino in their struggle for liberty, which caused the Johnson County Review to remark that such unpatriotic acts will never make any votes for the democratic party.

A railroad attorney at Austin said that if the roads were prohibited from giving passes to members of the legislature many of them would not go to the legislature. If there is any argument in this it means that the State should pay the members of the legislature to make them independent of the railroad companies. The pass business is wrong in principle and every member of the legislature knows it.

About the biggest fraud now before congress, next after the ship subsidy bill is the Great bill which proposes to break up the manufacture of alcohol. It is a demand of the bootleggers for congress to squelch opposition to them. If people want to eat they let them do so. The matter is purer than most butter made and besides is cheaper. That is what is the matter with Hanna, no we mean the drink.

The flag of the United States is an emblem of justice and power, all of which is guaranteed by the constitution. If the flag flies where the constitution cannot follow, then the President and congress are not bound by the constitution. If Porto Rico and the Philippines are not United States territory then in the name of common sense to whom do they belong. The glorious tariff of our country and expansion are getting gloriously mixed as THE STAR predicted two years ago. One or the other must be abandoned by the republican party unless they are strong enough to override the constitution.

To the legislature of Texas: The United States has never had but one constitution and except the war amendments, it has not been changed for a century. The talk of Texas outgrowing a constitution made twenty-five years ago is an "irresolute dream". Tinkering with the constitution should be stopped. Doubtless with very few exceptions, it would have been better had the constitution never been amended. A new constitution would, no doubt, be subjected to the same vicious attacks as the old one has been by the constitutional tinkermasters. Let the constitution alone.

A bill has been introduced into the legislature cutting the mileage of members to three cents by the nearest traveled route regardless of whatever. The author of that bill either never expects to go the legislative arena or he expects to ride on a free pass. Such a law would make a member from this district to draw about \$14 mileage and it would cost him \$20 to go and return from Austin. Until the people of Texas see fit to pay members of the legislature enough to keep them from going broke every time they go to the legislature the law railroad passes and all should remain as is. The writer knows thereof he speaks, having been there.

Queen Victoria was a lover of peace and hated war, yet she requested a military funeral and her request was complied with. Perhaps the magnificent naval display and military pageant at her funeral will do much to counteract her advocacy of peace while living. It seems strange indeed that the good queen should be buried with all the pomp and splendor usually accorded a successful military hero. The whole business seems out of place somehow.

It is said that David B. Hill, of New York, will not be a candidate for president in 1904. Hill is one of the shrewdest politicians in this country and he has no doubt taken the best course to secure the nomination. Hill has no desire to collide with Bryan's boom just now, but prefers to let the third term boom for Bryan play out and then Hill might come in. The democratic party might do a great deal worse than nominate Hill.

An old miner mentioned the fact a few days ago that Texas has, practically, no mining laws. That as he now stands no indication whatever is offered to miners to seek for the minerals abounding in the state. The legislature should investigate and see if the administration there might be in the law to the end that mining will be encouraged. The state is full of mineral and oil and people should be encouraged to hunt for them. The statement from Austin a few days ago that the Beaumont oil well was probably the property of the state, as it was not yet to be school land and owned by the state, brought forcibly to our mind what the old miner said: That Texas has no mining laws.

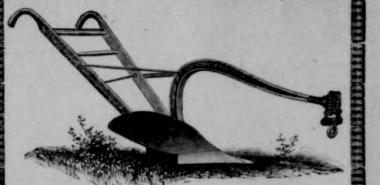
