The principal service offered by the cattle motel is holding cattle for area buyers and the providing of a rest station on area sales and bring their purchases to the holding pens where they will be kept until a load is accumulated. The rest pens are used by truckers who pick up loads in Florida, Georgia, Alabama, Tennessee, Miss-issippi or Louisiana for ship-ment to Arizona and on to the West Coast. The rest stop breaks the trip for the driver and for the cattle. Feed and water is the cattle. Feed and water is provided during the stay, which usually is six to eight hours. Doctoring pens and chutes are provided for cattle which are hurt or need treatment in any way. Cattle are easily unloaded and are just as easily reloaded.
