BAIRD — Congressman Geo. Bush of Houston has announced the appointment of J. Brice Jones of Baird as his co-chairman for the Bush for U. S. Senate campaign in Callahan County.

"Interest in the campaign is building," Bush said, "and one reason is the participation of people like Brice Jones in Callahan County.

Bush has actively sponsored legislation concerning urban affairs, rural job development, bilingual education, setting priorities in federal spending, Congressional ethics, and conservation.

Jones is serving his second term as president of the Baird Luncheon Club.

He is president and teacher of the men's Sunday school class, and a member of the official board of the First United Methodist Church. He has been a member for more than 50 years, and is the only living member of the 1922 building committee, responsible for erecting the present church.

Jones has been a civil servant with the Post Office for 44 years, first as a rural mail carrier (34 years, 5 months) and then as postmaster of the Baird Post Office (9 years, 7 months). He retired in 1962.

He and his wife, Lillie Mae, reside at 606 West 3rd Street in Baird. They have two children, both married.

Numerous fires have been reported due to dry conditions, so let's be a little more careful.

During the first four months of the year we recorded 12.04 inches of rain, as follows: January .02; February, 2.27; March, 3.07; April, 5.02; May, 1.66; June, 0; July 0. I would assume that this means a long, hot, dry summer.
