

## Cross Plains Asked To Apply For Funds

The Civil Aeronautics Administration's district engineer. J. D. Church, of Big Spring, has invited Cross Plains city officials to submit application for federal funds for improvement and enlargement at the local air port.

Church furnished the City Council with a CAA publication listing airports and their needs estimated for a three year period.




