Next meeting will be on February 1 in the home of Mrs. Hughes.



Cancer Soc. Education Drive

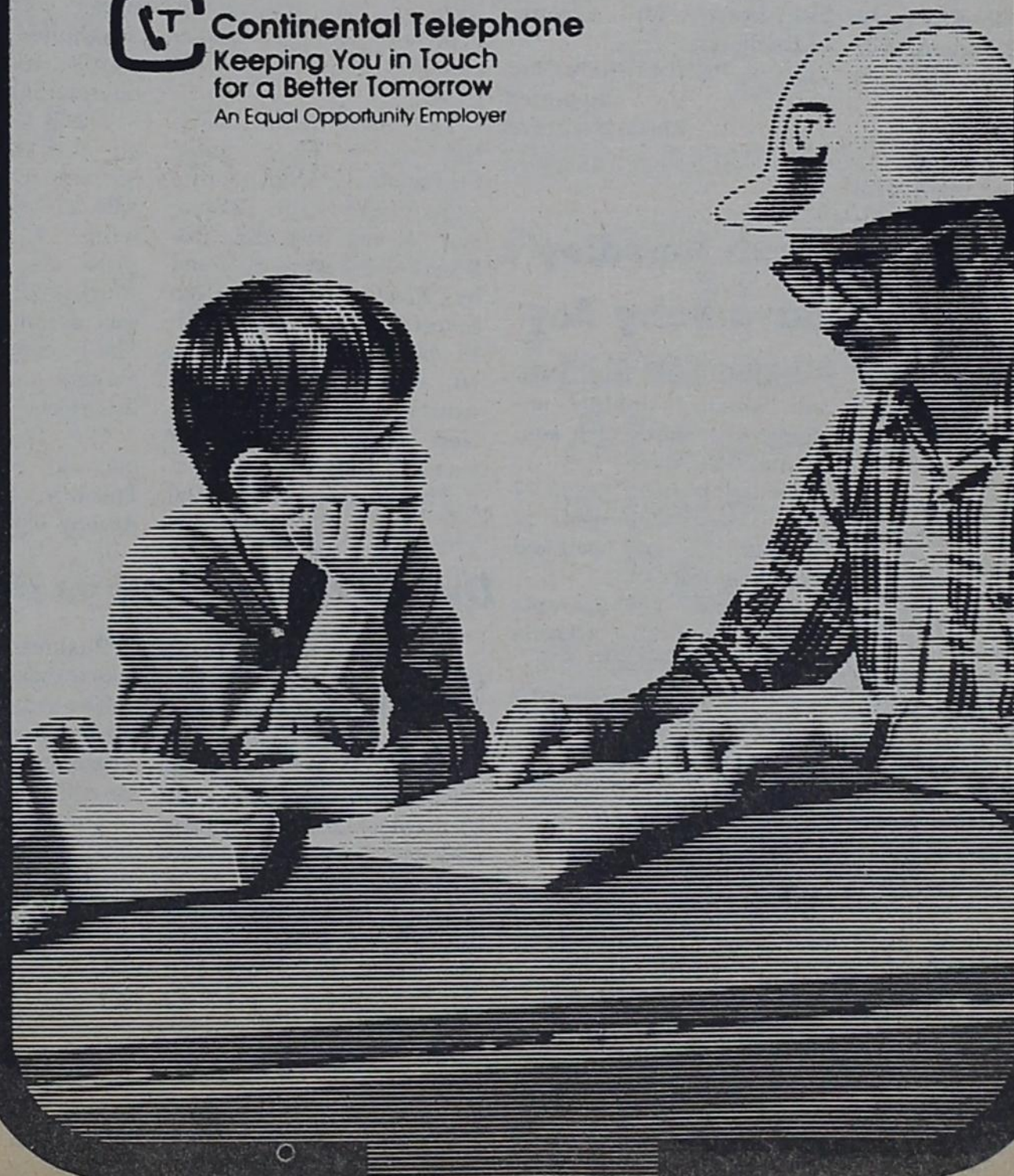
