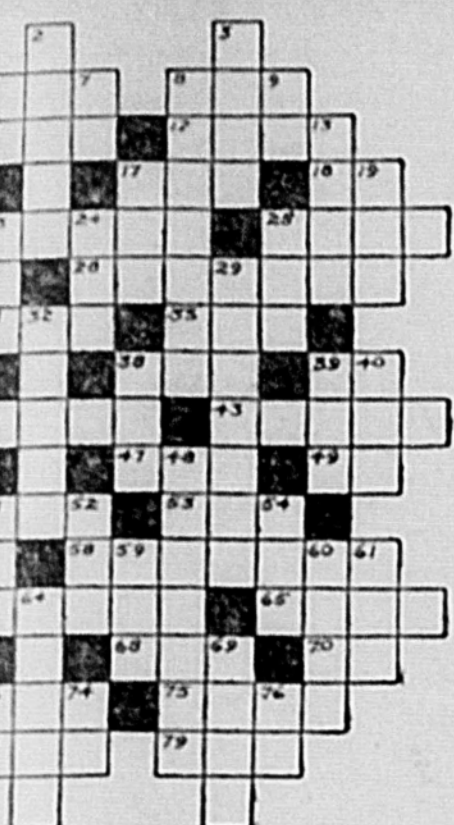
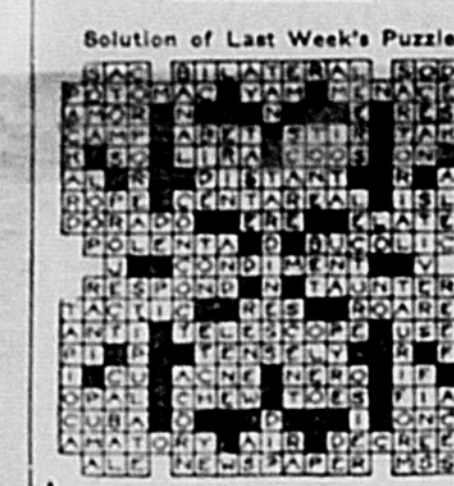

Austin, Texas.—Hazing at State schools was condemned by the House which adopted a resolution demanding that students discontinue any practices of this kind at the State-supported institutions by a vote of 76 to 25.

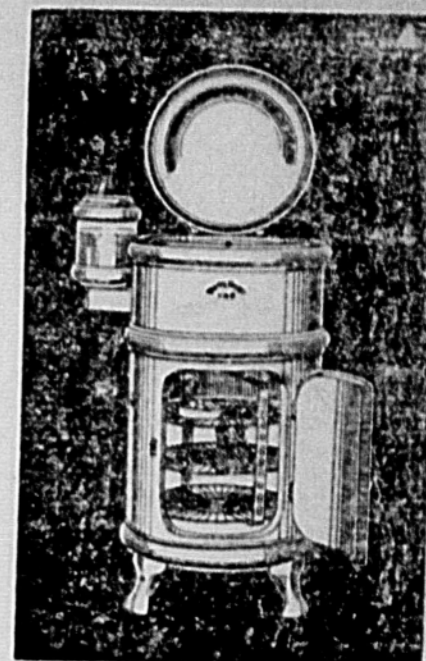

In the District Court of Callahan County, Texas, March Term, A. D. 1925.

To the Hon. W. R. Ely, Judge of Said Court:

We your Grand Jury for the above term beg leave to submit this our final report. We have been in session for three days and have examined about 30 witnesses and have found and returned into court three bills of indictments, all felonies.

We find that a large amount of Jamaica Ginger and other patent medicines are being sold for beverages, altogether we have not ascertained enough facts to return indictments. We recommend that all good citizens cooperate with the officers in the enforcement of the law against same, and we call on all parties handling such medicines to tract the law with reference to same.

We recommend that all officers charged with the enforcement of the law hold courts of inquiry before the different Justices of Peace in the County when any crime, whether felony

or misdemeanor is committed. We feel that this is very important and should be followed strictly.

We recommend that the stock law of the county be enforced.

We thank all of the officers of the Court for their co-operation with us in our work.

We have finished our labors and beg to be discharged.

TERRITORY ADDED TO CROSS PLAINS INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT

At a meeting of the County School Board of Callahan County on the 21st of February, a strip of territory containing some three square miles and adjacent to the Cross Plains Independent School District on the east was added to the Cross Plains district.

This territory was known as the old Board Flat district which was discontinued for school purposes some ten or fifteen years ago. Under the present conditions, it was impossible to legally enumerate the children residing in the territory for school purposes. A tax of ten cents on the \$100 taxable valuation was collected on this territory and has accumulated to the credit of Board Flat district and is on deposit in the County Depository. This amount may be transferred to the credit of the Cross Plains District.

The addition of this territory to Cross Plains District will not increase the rate heretofore collected in Board Flat district.

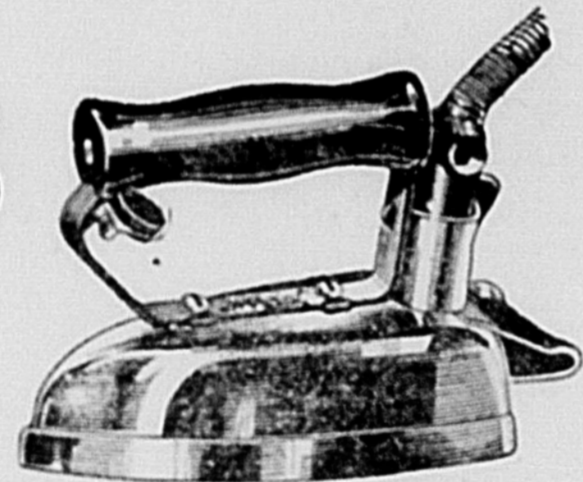
