It is highly important that the disciple of Christ should realize that he is a citizen as well as a Christian. Intelligent Christians will show loyalty to the state as well as to the church. In fact, the better the Christian, the better the state. The fallure to recognize this truth has brought Christianity into disrepute in many quarters. 1. The Christian's Obligation to the

State (vv. 1-7).

1. Obedience to the Rulers (vv, 1-4) This obligation is upon all Christians. The reason this obligation is universal is that civil government is ordained of God and the rulers are His representatives. It is God's purpose that man should live under authority. It is His purpose because man's highest good demands it. To refuse obedience to civil authority is to resist God. This of course does not mean that a Christian at the behest of the state should do that which is morally wrong, just as parental authority does not imply that the child is under obligation to do that which is morally wrong at the command of parents, but it does demand submission as the law of the be-Hever's life. The Christian frequently has need to call upon the rulers for help and personal protection (Acts 18:12-17: 19:35-41: 22:25).
