New Traffic Laws

This is one of a series of articles furnished by the Texas Department of Public Safety on the traffic laws passed by Texas' 62nd Legislature.

REMOVAL OF MOTOR VEHICLE INSPECTION STICKER

If a motor vehicle, trailer, semi-trailer, pole trailer or mobile home registered in this state is damaged in a motor vehicle accident to the extent that it would require repair before passing state inspection, the investigating officer shall remove the inspection certificate from the vehicle windshield and shall give the operator of the vehicle a dated receipt. Within thirty (30) days of the date indicated on the receipt, the vehicle shall be re-inspected. The vehicle may be driven during this thirty day period with the receipt.

RIDING IN HOUSE TRAILERS

No person shall occupy a house trailer while it is being moved upon a public highway.






