EL PASO — R. W. Harris, 62, of El Paso, a native of Baird and senior Vice President of El Paso Natural Gas Co., and an unidentified man were killed Wednesday, May 16, in the crash of a light plane south of Prudhoe Bay, Alaska.

Funeral for Mr. Harris was held at 11 a. m. Monday at the Hardin-Orr, McDaniel Funeral Home's Montana Ave. Chapel in El Paso with Rev. Jack Wallace, pastor of Western Hills Methodist Church in El Paso, officiating. Graveside rites were at 11 a. m. Tuesday in the Clyde Cemetery.

Mr. Harris had recently moved to Alaska, where he was consultant and manager of El Paso Natural Gas in Anchorage.

A native of Baird, he lived most of his life in Clyde and graduated from Clyde High School. He attended Texas Tech before joining El Paso Natural Gas Co., where he was employed 42 years.

Survivors include his wife, the former Alice Bailey of Clyde; two daughters, Mrs. Charles W. Hagen of Tucson, Ariz., and Mrs. Donald D. Gray of Washington, D. C.; his mother-in-law, Mrs. Cordie Bailey of Clyde; two aunts, Miss Jennie Harris of Baird and Mrs. P. C. Steen of Clyde; and five grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents, one brother, a sister and a son.
