Feb. 21 Is Last Day For Bobcat Tagging

February 21 is the last day for tagging bobcat pelts for sale, according to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department. However, February 15 is the last day for taking bobcats for the purpose of sale of their pelts.

The new tagging system established for the first time allows Texas hunters and trappers to sell their bobcat pelts on the international market.

The tags are placed on bobcat pelts by the department personnel each Tuesday from November 15 to February 21 at various tagging stations across the state.

Bill Brownlee, head of the department's nongame program, said there apparently is a considerable harvest of bobcats so far this season. "Our Abilene station reported more than 200 pelts tagged during December, and at Alpine we tagged more than 100 during one week," Brownlee said, adding that there may be some other stations with even higher totals.

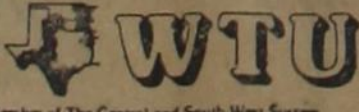

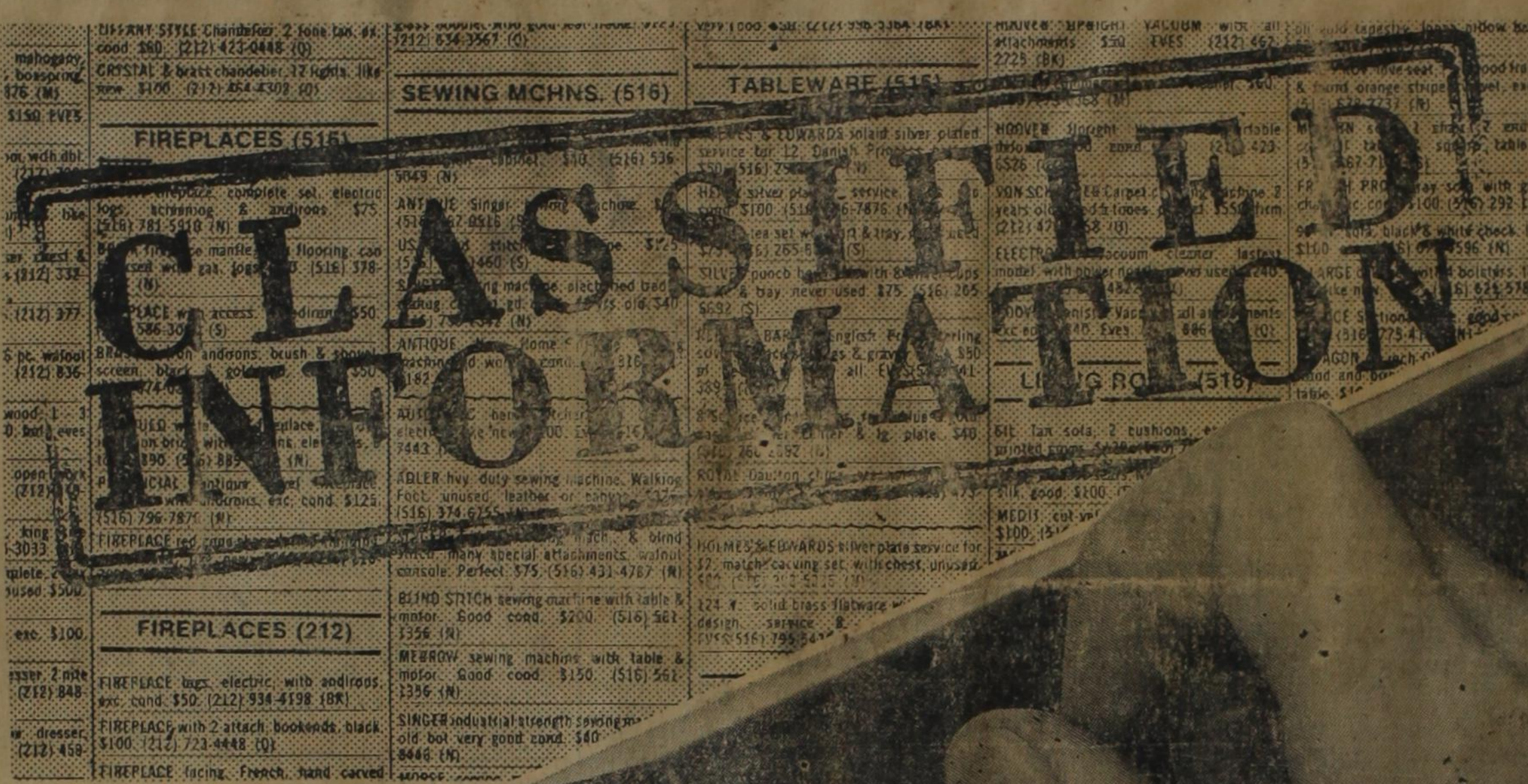

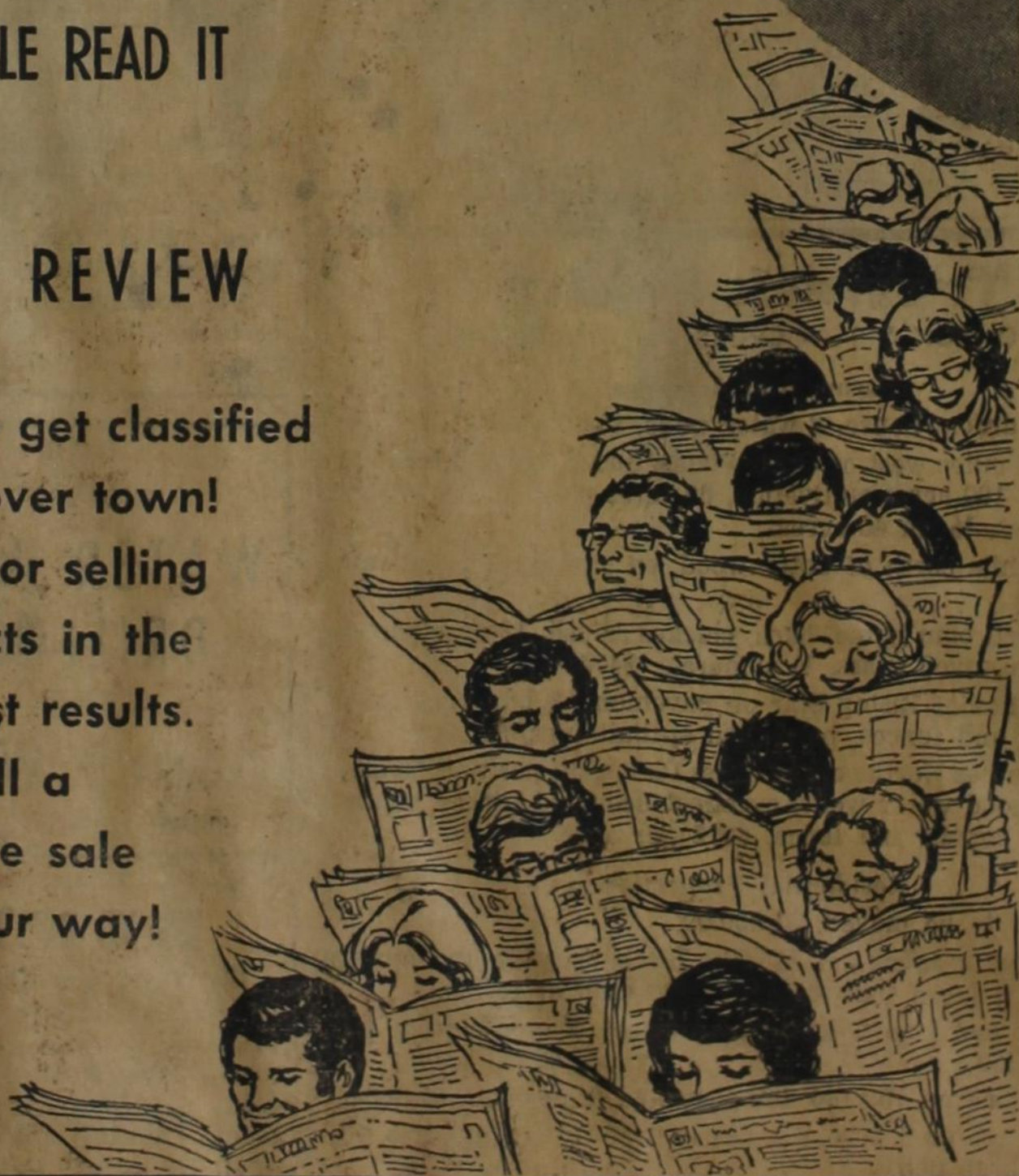
