(Matt. 15:14)

As husband and wife are one (Gen. 2:24; Eph. 5:31) and Christians are one (John 17:11; Gal. 3:28); so also are the Father, son and Holy Spirit one, but all are different persons. How? They speak, think, feel, hear, reason and execute the whole of reality on the highest level of perfection. There is one exception and possibly two, and even they prove there is more than one person in the Godhead. One: the Eather is supreme (John 14:28; I Cor. 15:27, 28) Two; Jesus said, "But of that day and that hour knoweth no man, no, not the angels which are in heaven, neither the Son, but the father." (Mk. 13:32). The latter may have changed with the announcement in Matt. 28:18. The Holy Spirit may Know (I Cor. 2:10). These exceptions serve only to acknowledge the rightful position and supremacy of Jehovah God the Father. They in no respect take away from the oneness of the Godhead. Notice the undeniable pluvality of Jesus statement; "...but now have they both seen and hated BOTH Me and My Father." (John 15:24). Anyone that can understand anything, surely can't help but see that there is more than one persons in the Godhead. But it takes an honest heart to accept it, for some people will choch to be ignorant willingly (II Pet. 3:5). Among the many Bible statements describing such people; none is more graphic than the apostle John's "Who is a LIAR but he that DENIETH that Jesus is the Christ? (John 13:3; 16:28: 17:11). If HE was and is the only person in the Godhead, then such absurd ideas are true.
