WHAT DID US POOR MORTALS SPRING FROM

The Review received this week an interesting letter from Rev. H. G. C. Hallock, missionary at Shanghai, China. The letter is more interesting as historical romance than otherwise, yet it contains facts concerning religious conditions in China up to the present day. The letter follows: Shanghai, China, June 5, 1928. Editor Review:

I have just read articles by missing link seekers. In one was reproduced a photo—an ape's foot much like a human foot. The author said it proved our ape ancestry. Recently I handled a snap—shot of an islander with a tail nearly 4 inches long. Another proof! But a few years ago I saw in Japan a stuffed calf with a human face—a strong proof that we've sprung from cows! So what are we to think? The articles amused as they said believers in their theory were of "up-to-date," "modern" mind. But their "new ideas seem like plagiarisms. These superior-minded men say we came up from the monkey and are even in some sense divine! The Chinese of old say a monkey excepting his face—became not only man but also a god! has his temples and is worshipped in China.

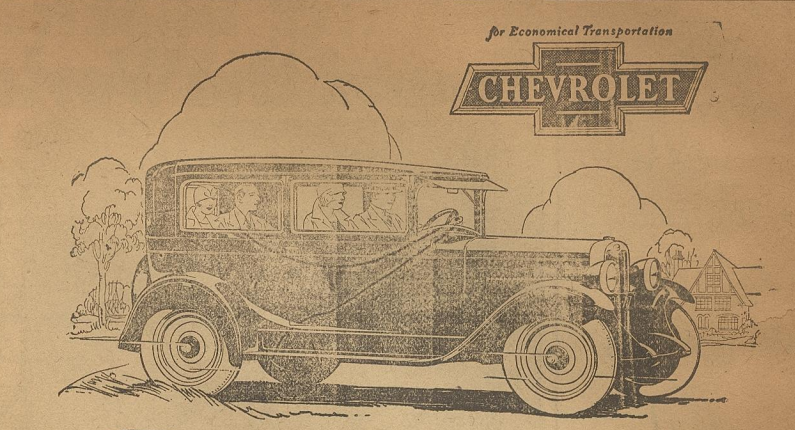
The Chinese say he was hatched, by gentle zephyrs, from a stone egg on a rocky mountain, to be a delight to the upper god. But, alas, he was a trouble-maker. He was ambitious and his exploits caused him to be acclaimed king of the animals and to wax strong. Thro Long—Whing he got an iron rod which he could expand at will to span the sky or contract so as to fit in his ear-magic wand! Pu-ti taught him how to fly and how to change himself into 72 different shapes. What he could not do is hard to say. But as he gained in power, and his friends said he was worthy to rule heaven, he wished to do so. Many kings made league with him and celebrated it with feasting. But our monkey got drunk, and while unconscious he was taken to hell. He awoke, overcame the powers of hell and escaped. 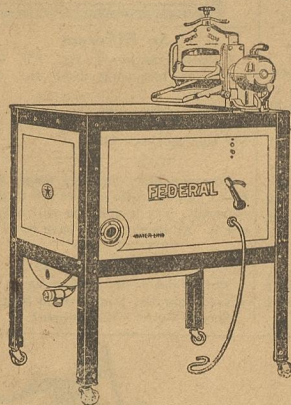

Automobile Races At Abilene July 4th

Not less than twenty-five drivers including the most experienced, and daring automobile racing pilots of the Southwest, will line up before the starter's flag at the annual July Fourth automobile races to be staged on the West Texas Fair Park Speedway at Abilene, in the opinion of D. H. Jefferies, Southwestern representative of the American Automobile Association under whose auspices the races will be staged.

Eight drivers already have signed and returned entry blanks which were sent to them several days ago by Mr. Jefferies. The list is swelling steadily and by the time the lists are closed the afternoon before the races Mr. Jefferies is confident it will exceed twenty-five and possibly will set a new record for entry totals.

Drivers who already have entered are: M. T. Wells and, M. L. Brooks, San Antonio, Two cars; Harry T. Mildurn, Fort Worth; C. E. McCathern, Breckenridge; George W. Barringer, Wichita Falls; Sam Jewell, Duncan, Okla.; J. F. Miller, Abilene, S. L. Miller, San Angelo.

Prizes totaling \$3,000, plus 20 per cent of all gate receipts in excess of \$6,500, have been offered by the West Texas Fair Association to winning

drivers. Five events, in addition to the time trials, have been arranged. The standing award of \$50 to the driver breaking the record set by the late Frank Lockhart of 65 seconds for two laps of the five-eighths mile track will be offered again this year. A prize of \$25 will go to the driver making the fastest time in the trials for place and who fails to set a new track record. A 25-mile race, to be known as the West Texas Sweepstake, will be the feature event. This race will be open to first and second place winners in the four preceding events. Guaranteed prizes for the race total \$1,350, of which \$700 will go to winner of first place, \$350 to second, \$200 to third and \$100 to fourth place.

The four preceding events are 10 and 15-lap races. The program will open at 1 o'clock on the afternoon of July Fourth with the time trials.
