Stinson Charged With Assault Wednesday

BAIRD- Anthony Wayne Stinson, about 37, was charged with aggravated assault Wednesday night after allegedly shooting at Callahan County Sheriff Bill Skinner.

Stinson remained in Eastland County Jail Thursday in lieu of \$2,500 bond set by Justice of the Peace Buddy Rowch.

Investigators said that after Stinson and his wife returned to their home near Lake Leon from a club in Eastland, Stinson had threatened his wife. Mrs. Stinson said she called her parents in Clyde, who in turn called the Callahan County sheriff's office.

Callahan County Sheriff Bill Skinner and Deputy Sheriff Ed Duncan contacted Eastland County Sheriff Ronnie White and then went to Eastland County by White's request to investigate the complaint.

They said when they arrived, Stinson fired a gun at Skinner. Duncan returned the fire, grazing Stinson on the neck, investigators said.

Stinson was treated at Eastland Memorial Hospital before being jailed. Texas Ranger George Fraser was called to assist in the arrest.

BAIRD- The Hardwick Oil Co. Giants picked up a pair of close victories in the last week to grab first place in the Baird Little League.

The Giants beat the Callahan Paving Yankees, 13-11, last Thursday, then came from behind Monday night to beat the Lions Club Braves, 8-6.

The Yankees remained a game behind Monday night by thumping the Bears Den Tigers, 20-12.

In games Thursday night, the Braves, improving with each game, take on the Yankees at 6:30 p.m., and the Giants play the Tigers in the second game.

The Braves scored 15 runs in the fourth inning to beat the tigers, 18-5. Brian Tollett scored four runs on three walks and a triple, while most of the runs came on walks and errors. For the tigers, Eddie Gunter tripled and Jeff Holland doubled.

Woman Claims Pregnancy, Charged With DWI

CLYDE- A young accident victim who was rushed to Hendrick Medical Center in Abilene Monday night when she appeared about to give birth turned out to be nothing more than "fat and drunk," law enforcement officials said Tuesday.

The woman was charged with driving while intoxicated in Callahan County Court Tuesday after her labor pains proved to be false, Texas Department of Public Safety Officer Bill Russell said Tuesday.

Russell and partner Phil Dean were called to an accident scene two miles west of Clyde on Interstate 20 shortly after 10 p.m. where a woman was believed to be going into labor.

They found the young woman lying on the ground and hollering.

"She stated she was pregnant and

about to have a baby," Russell said.

A Clyde ambulance service rushed the woman to the emergency room at the Abilene hospital but upon arrival she refused to let medical technicians attend to her.

"She had finally calmed down when she got there and you could tell then that she wasn't pregnant. She admitted that later on," Russell said.

Russell said Officer Dean advised the woman in the emergency room that charges would be filed against her the following day in Callahan County Court for driving while intoxicated. The woman was then released.

The accident occurred when the woman lost control of her vehicle on I-20 and cut across the Interstate several times before the car ended up broadside on the roadway with two left tires blown out.

Stuart Bell Fund Begun

BAIRD- Stuart Bell, almost 4, is in Cancer Research Hospital in Dallas. He is the younger son of Kenneth and Peggy (Gordon) Bell who live at 526 Arch in Baird, and the grandson of Woody and Jean Gordon. Stuart entered the Callahan General Hospital about May 30 and his illness was diagnosed as leukemia on Thursday, May 31.

On Friday, June 1 he was taken to Dallas for tests and treatments. The

doctors in Dallas are optimistic that Stuart's condition can be controlled and possibly arrested. He will be undergoing chemotherapy for a month then possibly can be brought back to Baird. His parents are staying in Dallas with him.

On Sunday a fund was started for Stuart with approximately \$1,000. This is set up as the Stuart Bell Fund at the First National Bank in Baird and anyone wishing to contribute may do so by turning in your do-

nation at the bank.

Stuart's leukemia is of the lymphatic type. It is estimated that this month's treatments could cost a quarter of a million dollars. Most of this will be paid through insurance and foundation funds but the family will bear a portion of it. Their living expenses in Dallas are not included in the insurance or foundation funds.

Paul Faulkner of Abilene Christian University officiated. Burial was at Ross Cemetery annex.

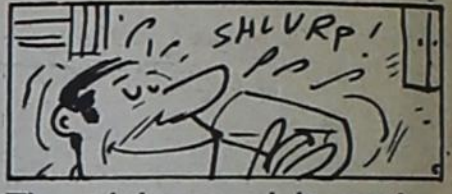

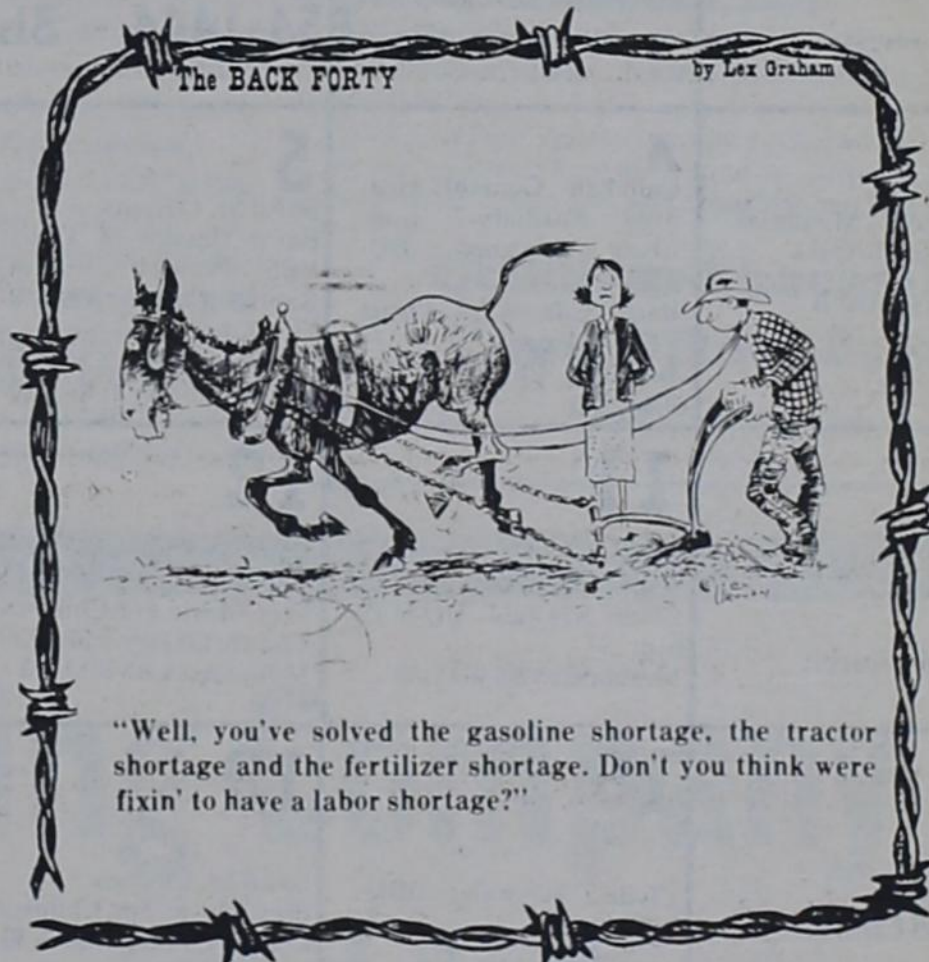
Barry Williams Attends FFA Camp

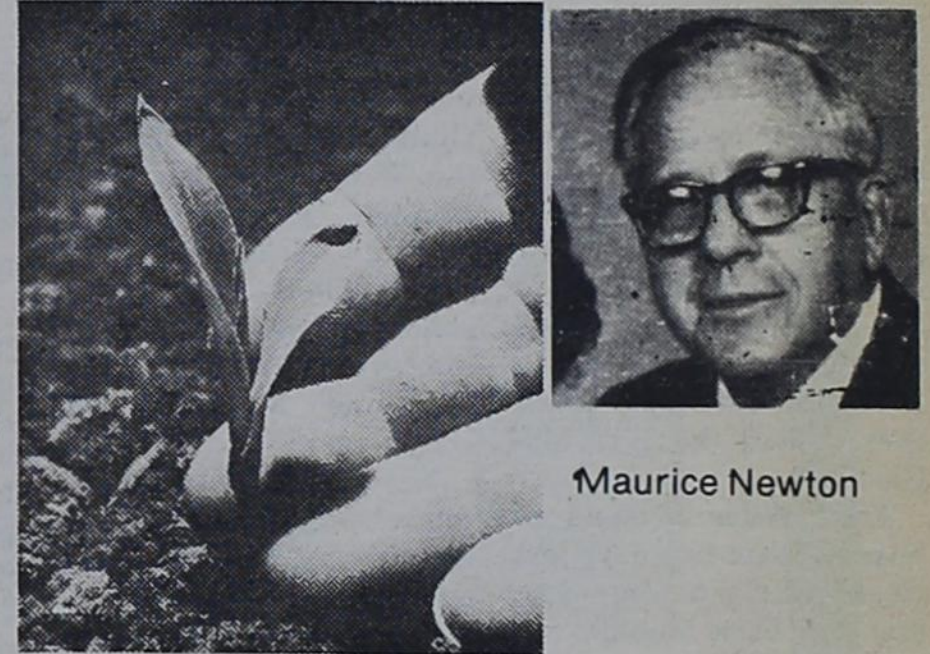

Mrs. Clayton declined to comment Wednesday on the upcoming hearing.

A petition was circulated in Clyde by parents of schoolchildren calling for the removal of Mrs. Clayton. A number of elementary schoolteachers signed the petition and ten teachers who served under her wrote letters to school district attorneys.

School board president Sapaugh said school board members have tried to re-



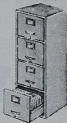

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN BY CALLAHAN COUNTY OF ITS RENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Landlords and persons who live in rental property are urged to contact the Housing Authority of Callahan County concerning participation in a program designed to assist our citizens to secure decent, safe, and sanitary housing.

The program benefits landlords and owners by providing financial assistance during vacancy and certain depository and damage guarantees. The program aids eligible renters by providing financial assistance on the basis of need.

Persons that wish to apply for rent assistance must make application for eligibility and subsequently provide proof of income. Applicants must be a family or head of household. If an individual applies he or she must be 62 years of age or handicapped or disabled.

Cost of housing occupied by the applicant must be within the limits set forth in a fair market rent schedule. Fair Market rents are based on standard market housing, however any standard unit falling within the Fair Market schedule is eligible.

Participation in the rent assistance program is voluntary on the part of owners/landlords and renters.
