

BIG TRUST CONFERENCE.

Chicago, Sept. 12 .- To-morrow morning at 10 o'clock the conference called by the civic tederation of Chicago to distion established head-quartes servant, at the Great Norehern hotel. Attorney General T. S. Smith said in an interview;

"It is a mistake to suppose the Texas people here are opposed national legislation a-gainst trusts. We want state and national legislation. for only national laws can be used to fight truts. When inter state comerce is concerned. Our new Texas law, which goes into effect in January, embodies about my ideas of the best way of deeling with the trust prob-lem. We who try to collect debts due a trust and put such obligations on the same basis as a gambling debt. We cannot prevent them doing bus iness in our state, but we keep them from setting up there and from establishing branches. As fast as the licenses or the charters of these organizations which we know to be trusts expire, we will refuse to rerenew them .


