Before Beery began work in "Port of Seven Seas," showing as a midnight preview Saturday night and Sunday and Monday at the Liberty Theatre, Director James Whale had a conference with the star.

"Wally," he said, "let's try and get through this picture without an accident. I appreciate the fact that you throw your heart and soul into your pictures, but try to keep the realism down to a point of safety."

In "The Bad Man of Brimstone," Beery accidentally shot himself in the leg. In "The Good, Old Soak" he caught his hand in a slot machine, and while doing the fishing sequence in "Old Hutch," he had to have a fishhook cut from his hand.

"China Seas" found him in excellent form. He didn't get hurt. But his luck didn't carry into "O'Shaughnessy's Boy" when an elephant stepped on his foot and a tiger barely missed clawing him.

During "Viva Villa" while riding over the hills of Mexico at the head of his bandit band, he strained his right leg badly when his horse fell and rolled on him.

As "The Champ" he took real punishment during the fist fight in which he was supposed to take a terrific beating for eight rounds. More than a hundred punches were tossed at him from a professional fighter and many struck home. After wrestling in "Flesh," he carried around a cracked rib for a month, not to mention a body covered with black and blue spots.

As far as Beery is concerned, a dangerous hunting trip in India would seem almost like a picnic after some of the pictures in which he has appeared.

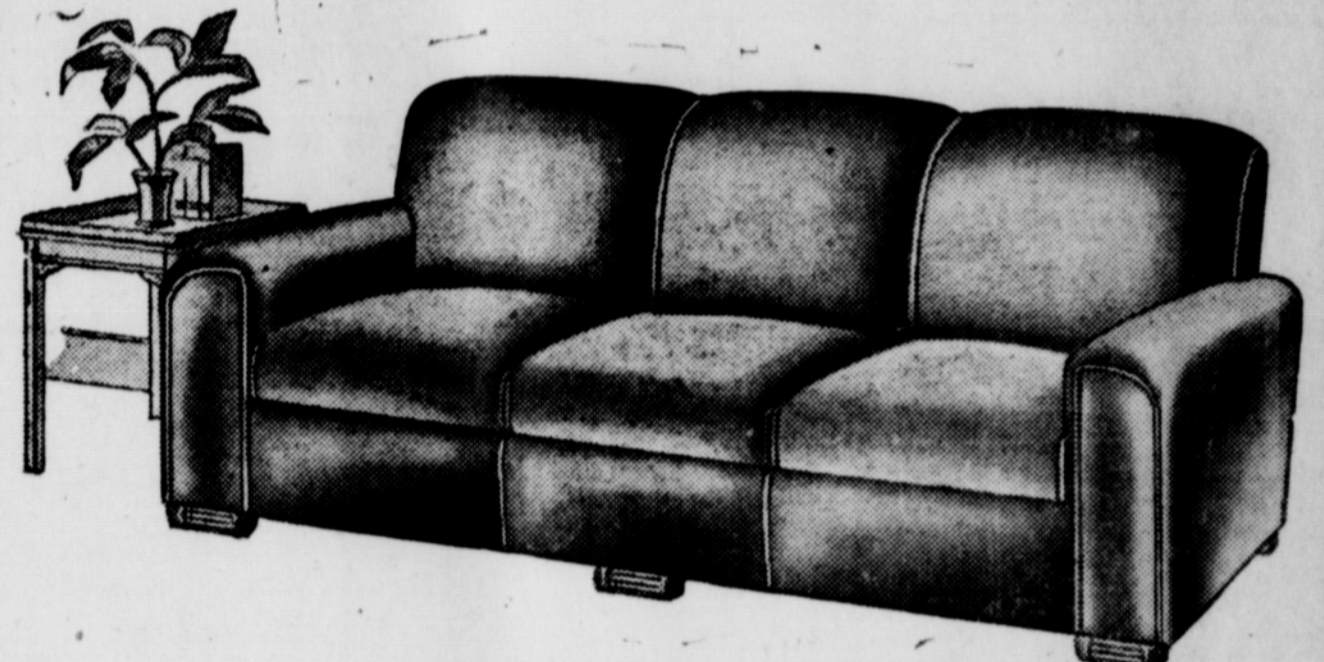

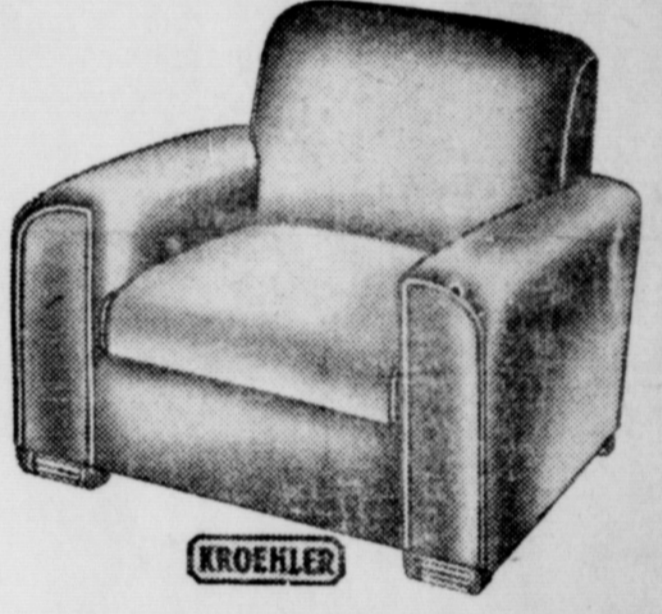

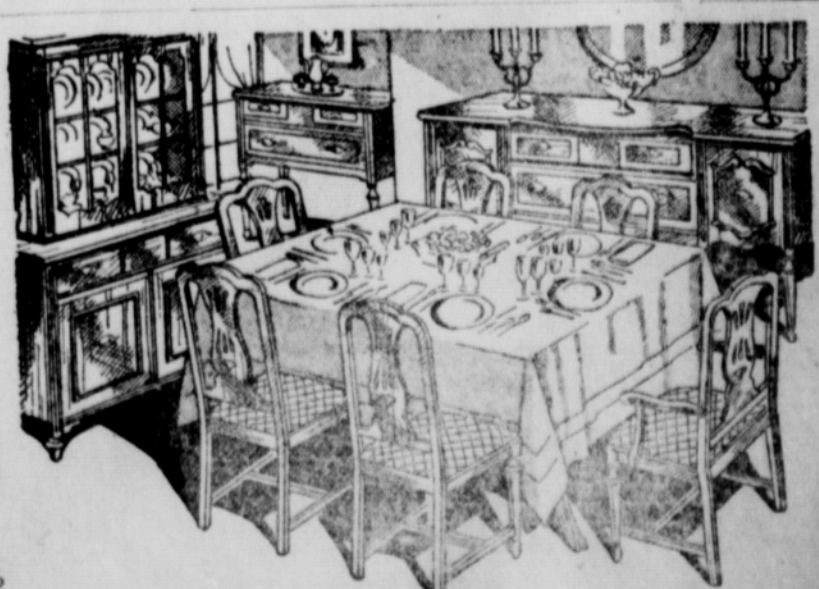
