

The Health Fair will be April 17th from 9 a.m to 4 p.m.



Was Joe Bailey perfect? Not by a long shot. (Of course, none of us are.) He had his faults, some of them pretty serious, but they were not part of my world with him. As an adult, I have seen the terrible outcomes of some of his weaknesses, but as a kid-----

In my heart, he will always be the Uncle who took me to the grcoery store and tried to fill me up on all the cokes and candy I could consume. He never did.

I think I impressed him that day, too.

So with that memory, I say "So long, Uncle Joe Bailey, I'll miss you."
