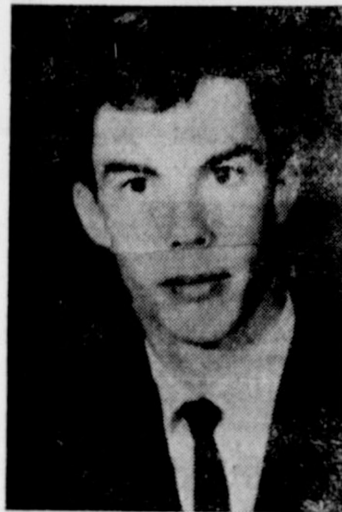

Baird School Board Announces Teaching Assignments for 1974-75

BAIRD — School days are fast approaching for another 10-months session. Many hours have been spent in preparation and teachers begin official duties at 9:30 a. m. Monday in the Junior High Library with a general faculty meeting. They will have two days of in-service training at Cisco Junior College and one day in Clyde before registration of students on Friday, Aug. 16.

Registration of kindergarten students will be at 10 a. m. Friday in the cafeteria. Seniors will begin registration at 10 a. m. too, followed by the juniors at 11 a. m., sophomores at 1 p. m. and freshmen at 2 p. m. Grades 1-8 will begin registering in their classrooms at 1:30 p. m. Expected registration is about 400 students.

A number of changes in staff have taken place for this new school term. Both buildings have new principals. Gerald Jennings has moved into the high school position. He obtained his B. S. in 1954 and M. Ed. in 1965 from McMurry. He taught in Noodle before moving to Eula in 1963. He comes to Baird from Eula. His wife, Betty Jo, will be working in the grade schools as special education aide. They have three children: Jerry, 18, a senior; Gary, 16 a junior and Jodi, 12 in the 7th grade.

Weldon Moore is the new grade school principal and director of the Big Red Band. He taught in Lefors before going to Ballinger as band director. He obtained his B. S. from McMurry and M. Ed. from ACC. He and his wife are active members of the Methodist church. They have two sons, age 9 and 6.

The coaching staff is complete with Bob Bearden as head coach. Bob is not new to Baird, as he was here during the 1972-73 school year. He obtained his B. S. Ed. from ACC in 1972 and has done graduate work at Texas Tech. His wife, Becky, works in Abilene during part of the year. They have one daughter, Emily, not quite two years old. Charles Copeland is already familiar to most of the students as he managed the swimming pool all summer and umpired for a number of baseball games. He taught in Abilene during the last semester while completing his B. S. Ed. degree at ACC. He will be track coach.

Harold Scott taught in Westbrook R.H.S.D., Borden Co. I.S.D., and Alvarado before moving to Baird. He obtained his B.S.E. from ACC in 1970, is married,

and has one daughter Crystal, age 3. He will be basketball coach. The junior high school coach will be Quinn Connally, a 1973 graduate of Angelo State. He taught physical education and math at Meridian last year. His wife, Brenda, will be a teachers' aide in the schools here.

Mrs. Roma Howard will teach third grade. She is a 1962 graduate of ACC and has done graduate work on the American Heritage Scholarship. She has previously taught in Abilene, Lakewood and Genoa in Colo., Timbo, Ark., and Putnam. Her husbands farms at Cottonwood. They have three children.

Ann Ramage, formerly of Clyde, will be the new county librarian.

Sandra Carter, 1974 graduate of McMurry, will teach junior high English and girls athletics. She taught P.E. at Cooper High in Abilene last semester. While a student at McMurry, she was listed in Who 'Who in American Colleges & University, a member of Kappa Delta Pi (president), Sigma Tau Delta and Alpha Chi. She was student representative on the Teacher education committee, and received the highest scholastic award for McMurry varsity athlete.

Kindergarten will be taught by Mrs. Harold (Cinda) Scott. She is the daughter of the Cleve Youngs of Clyde. She has her B.S.Ed. from ACC in 1968 and has done graduate work at Tarleton University under an American Heritage Fellowship. She taught at Eula, Sweetwater, ACHS and Alvarado before coming to Baird.

Approximately 800 Attend Callahan County Pioneer Reunion Saturday

CROSS PLAINS — Around 800 people gathered at the Callahan County Old Timers Reunion, held at Treadaway Park, Saturday. More than 500 of those attending had lived in the county for more than 35 years.

Fourteen old timers were presented ribbons for longevity. Fred Purvis of Cross Plains, and Mrs. H. D. Driskill of Baird were the earliest pioneer man and woman attending. Purvis since 1884 and Mrs. Driskill since 1889.

Adolph Brandon of Clyde was named the earliest cowboy in county (1910) while J. P. Purvis of Cross Plains was recognized as the earliest pioneer man with continuous residence.

W. D. Peavy of Cross Plains was the oldest native-born man (1887) and Mrs. V. E. Hill of Baird was the oldest native-born woman (1883). Mr. and Mrs. Raymond McCowan of San Diego, Calif., traveled the farthest distance to attend the reunion.

Mr. and Mrs. J. P. Smedley of Baird was the longest married couple attending (1916). Mr. and Mrs. A. W. Franke of Cross Plains were the longest married couple with continuous residence in the county (1920).

James Paul Shanks was elected president of the Callahan County Pioneer Assn. Other officers elected were: Burrus Miller of Eula, 1st Vice President; Ben Atwood of Cross Plains, 2nd Vice President; Wendell Smith of Admiral, 3rd Vice President, and Maggie Cook of Baird, Secretary-Treasurer.

CLYDE SCHOOL BOARD CALLS BOND ELECTION

CLYDE — The Board of Trustees of Clyde Public Schools has called a bond election for Saturday, August 31, for the purpose of providing funds to provide facilities for the school. The bond issue, if approved, will be in the amount of \$750,000.00. This election is the culmination of several months study by the board and the Citizens Advisory Committee.

Twenty-six persons served on the committee to make recommendations to the board. These recommendations were received and accepted on July 23.

After receiving the recommendations and considering all facets of the program, the board called the election for the purpose of:

- Building a new elementary school
 - Remodeling the present buildings on the present campus
 - Adding a new science facility for the high school
 - Adding a new library for the high school
- This program will be explained in detail at a meeting called for August 22 in the school auditorium. This meeting will be held at 8 p. m. with the architect and the financial advisor in attendance to answer

questions. Members of the board and administration will also be present to explain the proposal. All interested persons in the school district are urged to attend this meeting.

Jake Roberts, District Engineer, To Retire After 44 Years Service

AUSTIN — J. C. Roberts, for 23 years the Texas Highway Department's district engineer in Abilene, will retire October 31, State Highway Engineer E. L. DeBerry announced.

Succeeding Roberts as head of Highway Department operations in the 13-county Abilene district will be Roger G. Welsch, now assigned as district construction engineer in Corpus Christi.

Roberts is a 44-year veteran of Highway Department service, and 32 of those years have been as either assistant district engineer or district engineer at Abilene.

He joined the Department in 1930 as an instrument man in Hays County. In 1942 he was named assistant district engineer at Abilene and district engineer in 1951.

"Jake Roberts has been active and concerned with the management and administration of the work in his district, as well as the involvement of highway personnel and the public in highway matters," DeBerry said. "The fine system of highways

in the Abilene district attests to his abilities as an engineer and administrator."

Roberts' last day on the job will be August 31. He will be on earned leave and vacation through the end of October.

The Abilene district includes Borden, Callahan, Fisher, Haskell, Howard, Jones, Kent, Mitchell, Nolan, Scurry, Shackelford, Stonewall and Taylor Counties.

Welsch will become acting district engineer on September 1 and district engineer on November 1. The 40-year-old New Braunfels native attended public schools at Solms and New Braunfels. He is a graduate of Texas A&M.

He joined the Highway Department in 1953 as a roadman in the San Antonio district and has served in various engineering capacities in the San Antonio and Corpus Christi districts and also worked part-time in the Bryan district while attending A&M during 1957-59. Presently, he is district construction engineer at Corpus Christi. He and his wife, Mary Lee, have a daughter and a son.
