HOW CLEOPATRA NEEDLEWASS

New Process Invented to serve Surface of Marble in Central Park

HIEROGLYPHS OBLITERATED

Rigors of Western Climate Khedive's Gift to Disappearance of Obelisk Painting Ancient Obelisk Special Preparation to arrest Decay—Ruined Portions Restored.

New Yorkers awoke one day to find in their breakfast paper a news item that a zealous park employee had discovered signs of disturbance on the surface of the city's most antique—Cleopatra's Needle. Hieroglyphs revealed that the needle, large pieces of sandstone had fallen from the tall shaft with them part of the hieroglyphs.

London's twin sister of Cleopatra Needle was reported as resting comfortably and enduringly on the shore of the Thames, and the river doubted whether a preparatory found to stay the attack of harsher climate.

THE OBELISK.

The Obelisk was presented to New York by the Khedive of Egypt in 1851. It was a year's effort, obtained possession of it and moved it to its present position, at an expense of nearly \$100,000. It was finally swung into position at noon, January 22, 1881.

The height of this monument, from base to tip, is 69 feet, 2 inches. The measurement of the base, square through its sides is 17 feet, 4 inches. The entire weight of the monolith is 219½ tons.

Since it was quarried near the top of the zone, it has traversed the entire length of 2,774 feet, most of the Mediterranean Sea and the Atlantic Ocean—a distance of 400 miles—proving itself a first rate traveler for one whose age has exceeded thirty-five centuries. In the course of its existence it has seen Pharaohs and has stood witness to their destruction in the Red Sea; Silexak marching to the conquest of Jerusalem; Cambyses desolating the land; Herodotus, Plutarch and other Greek students engaged in pursuit of Egyptian lore; Alexander the Great on his victorious march through the land of Goshen; and a half century of Roman sovereignty and Christian struggle at Alexandria; all the long line of Moslem rulers since Caliph Omar; and now, leaving together its native land, it stands looking upon the million dwellers in this metropolis, whose site was unknown to the Eastern world at a time when the Obelisk had been in existence for two thousand years.

PAINT PROTECTION AND ITS ECONOMY

The preservation of structural materials, which may be obtained through the application of paint, constituting the most vital means of furthering the preservation of our natural resources, is, moreover, the most economical method of sustaining the appearance and general upkeep of any property.

A structure coated with sheets of dia rubber would not be as well protected from decay as a structure coated with a good oil paint. This is the fact that a sheet of rubber film, when applied, dries to a continuous elastic film containing finely divided particles of metallic wear-resisting pigments. A square foot of this film upon a wooden surface costs but a penny, yet it will beautify and protect a dollar's worth of surface many years. This is a low rate of insurance.

Dwellings, barns, outbuildings, posts, fences, stock enclosures, waggon implements, windmills and other structures, whether of wood, iron or steel, should be preserved, through the application of paint, from rapid decay. High quality paint may be used successfully for such purposes. Colored paints will found the most advisable, the color matter in the paint adding from three to five years to the life of the structure.

SUN DANCY IS A PRODUCE

COMMITTEE READY FOR CAMPAIGN TO RAISE S. A. FUND

Kirby Pleased With Organization for Pushing Drive Throughout State.

ELKS PROMISE HELP FOR STATE WORKERS

Soldiers Fall into Line When Asked to Head District and Local Units.

With the appointment of his executive committee complete John Kirby, state chairman for the \$600,000 home service fund drive in Texas, September 29, outlined a vigorous policy to its members at Dallas Saturday.

"I am pleased with the success that has been met in perfecting a strong committee to get the money that is required for placing the Salvation Army on a firm basis in Texas for all time," Mr. Kirby told the committee. "In this work we have the cooperation of virtually every soldier who was 'over there'. We are getting the support of religious and fraternal organizations."

Elks Help in Drive
The order of Elks promised support of the campaign in the following telegram from Frank L. Rain, exalted ruler of the organization:

"I earnestly co-operate with you and the good people of my native State. We are behind you in your home service campaign."

Commander Evangeline Booth told us in our recent convention at Atlantic City that if it had not been for the Elks the Salvation Army would not have achieved the success that it did in the great war.

"Great good" is being done by the Salvation Army along a line that can not be accomplished by any other organization. We as an order have always aided the Salvation Army and the Elks from coast to coast are assisting them in their present drive. Here's hoping that 'you' go over the top in Texas, Oklahoma and Louisiana."

Chairman Kirby is expected to appoint the full number of his executive committee this week, according to Lieut. Col. George Wood, commander of the Southwestern District. Five members of the state committee have been appointed. The number probably will be brought to fifteen.

County Units Are Formed

County organizations are rapidly swinging into line for the intensive week of work that is planned to cover the campaign work. Field men of the Salvation Army corps report success in each county in which they work.

"By far the most gratifying feature of the campaign is the support that the returned soldier is giving the Salvation Army," Mr. Kirby told the executive committee at its last session. "I find that this sympathy for the Salvation Army is deep and sincere. The boys really want to help."

Richard Burgess of El Paso who was one of the first Texas soldiers to go overseas, has been appointed to lead the campaign in the El Paso district. Burgess returned to America with the rank of colonel.

Soldier Ready to Help

"I am not too busy to show the Salvation Army the attention that is due it by every returned soldier," Mr. Burgess said in accepting the position offered him on the state committee.

Definite plans for the campaigns in each county are now in the hands of the state central executive committee. The state committee is the nucleus of an organization of workers that extends down to the last publicity man and county chairman in the state.

"There are to be no loafers on the state committee," Mr. Kirby said in announcing his appointees. "Each man nominated for a place who accepts will have a definite work to perform. Each district chairman will be responsible for the men in his district who are able to give substantial sums of money. Each county chairman will be responsible for the men who are able to give freely in his community. By this plan it is the hope of the Salvation Army that the drive may be brought to a speedy close."

Halls Built on Border

Construction work on two recreation halls for the Salvation Army at Santa Helena and Lajitas in the Big Bend district will begin at once according to a letter received last night from Colonel G. T. Langhorne of the United States cavalry by Lieutenant Colonel George Wood, commander of the southwestern division of the Salvation Army.

Colonel Langhorne acknowledged receipt of a check from Lieutenant Colonel Wood for \$4,000. The money was sent the first of the week from the Dallas office of the Salvation Army.

"I take this opportunity to thank you," Colonel Langhorne wrote, "and express the gratitude and appreciation of the officers and soldiers for your consideration of them"

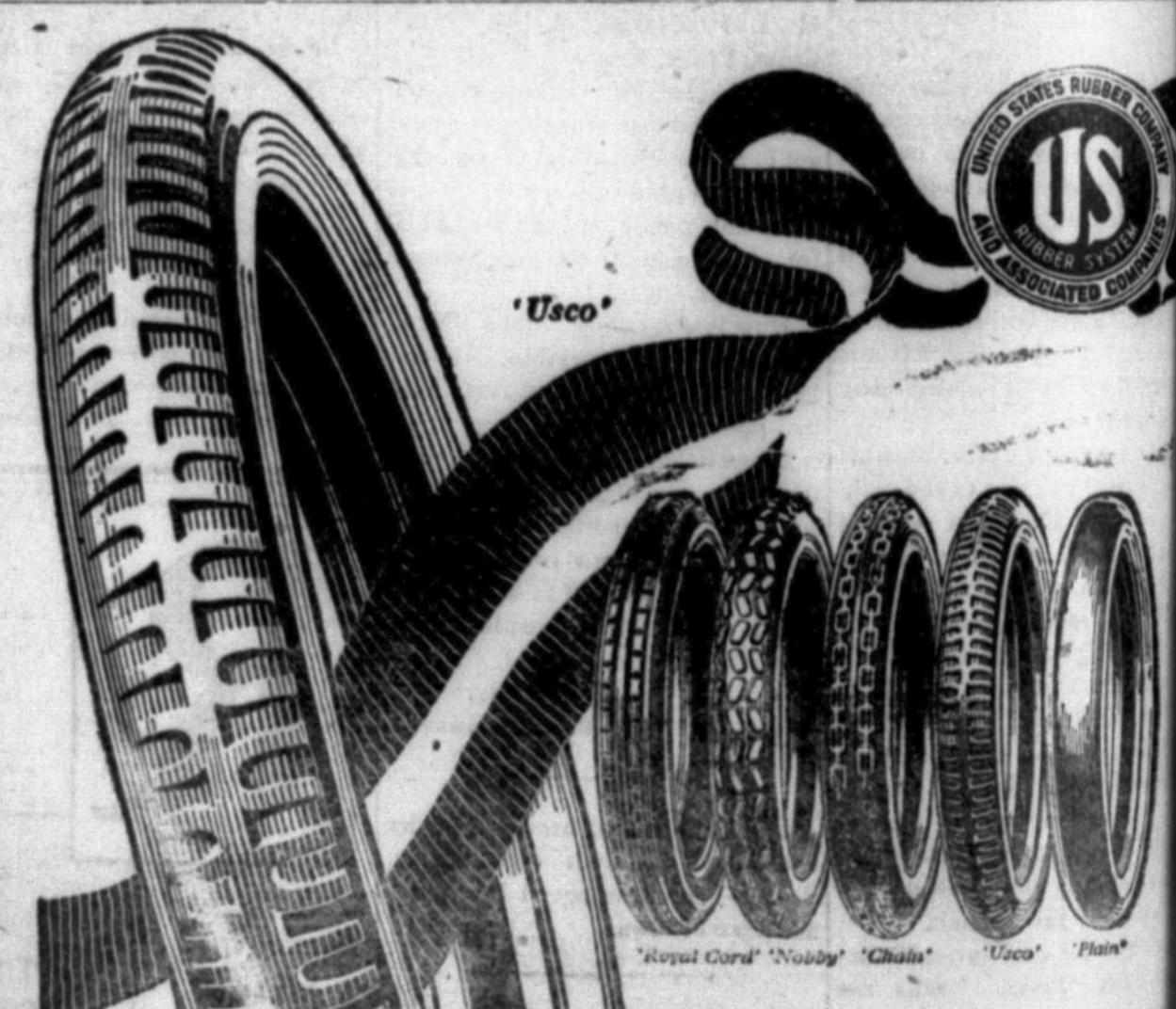

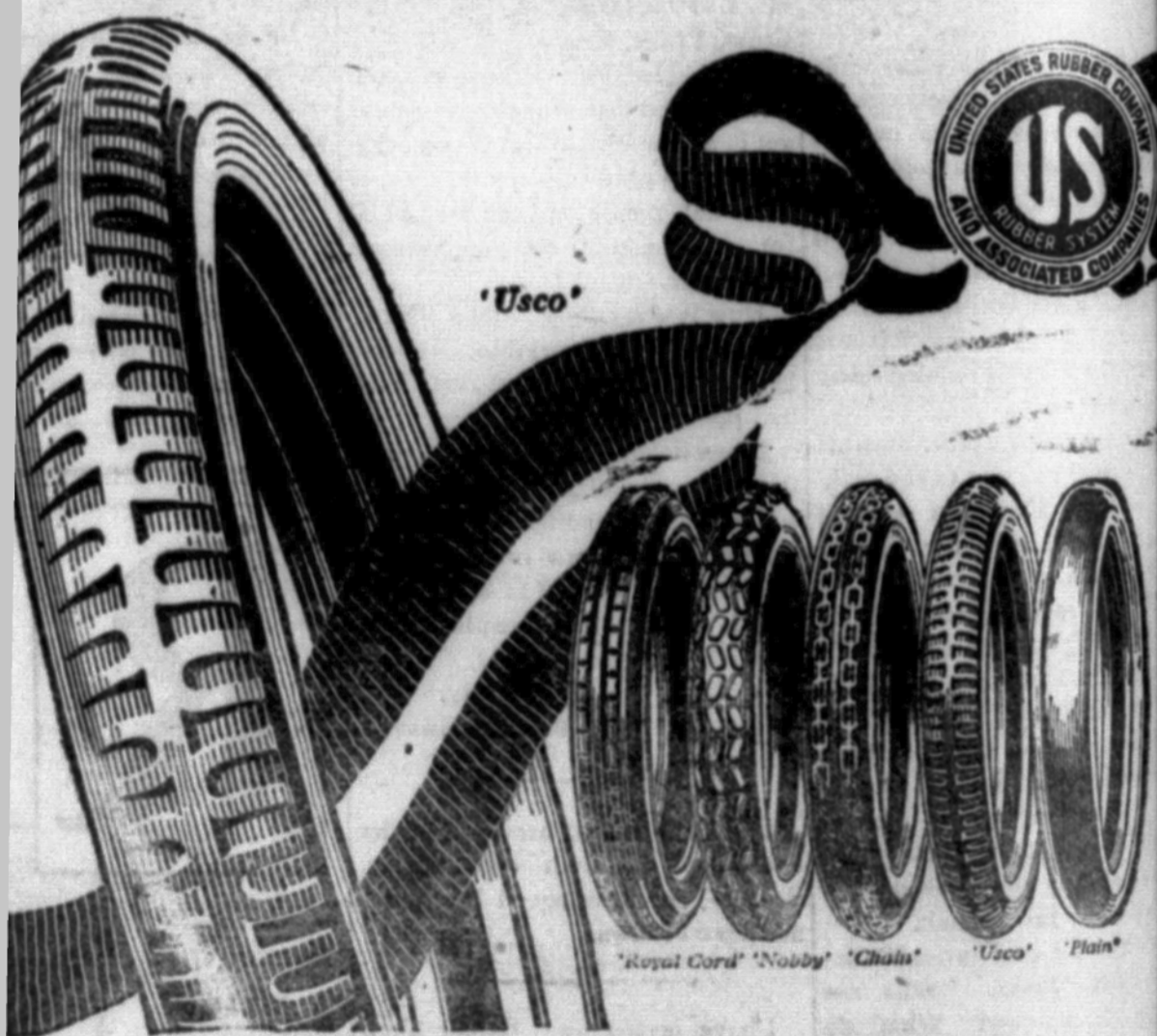

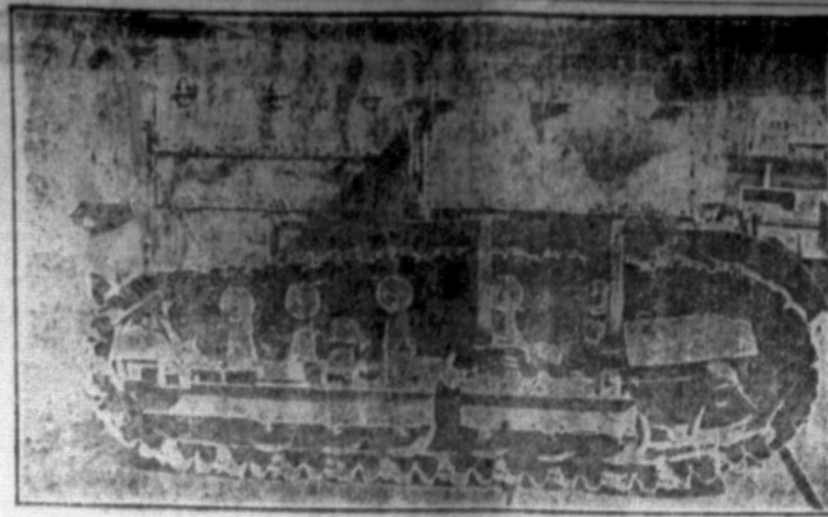
