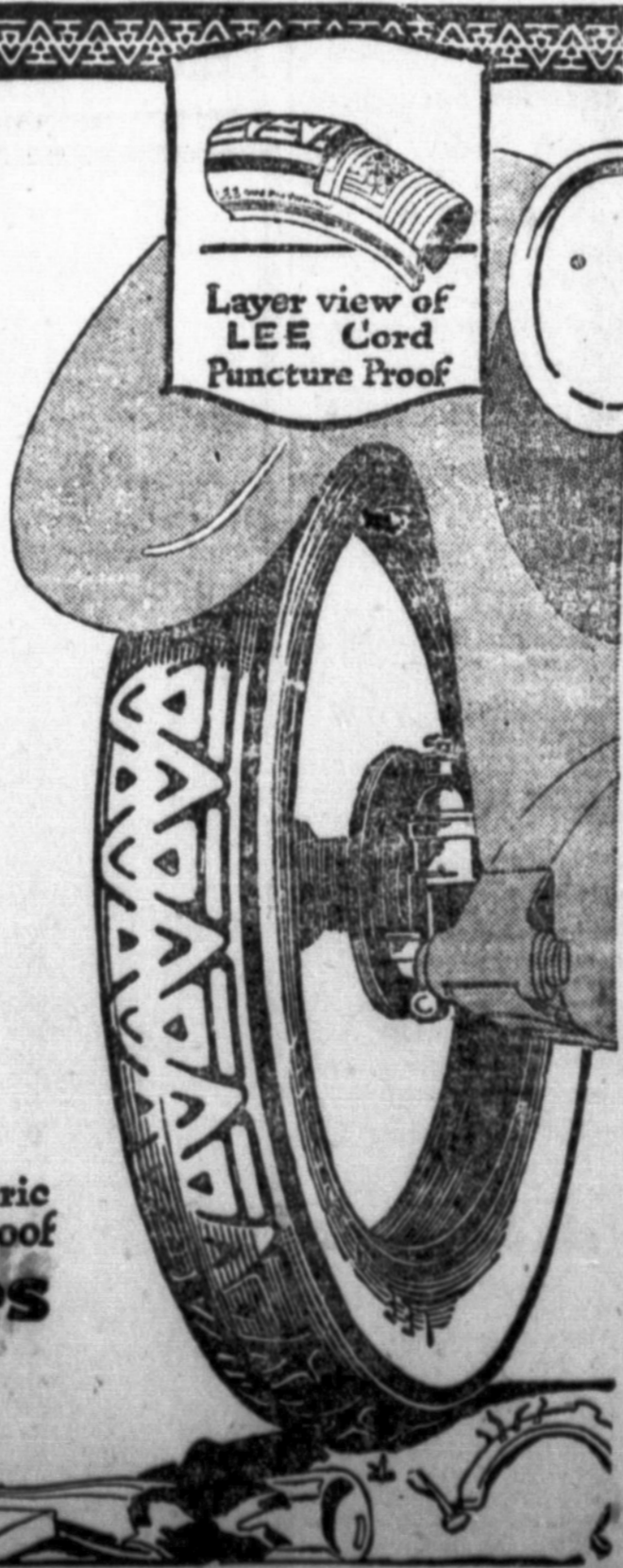

FARM FIRES IN THE U. S.
Farm fires during 1918 and 1919 according to the national board of fire underwriters, amounted to 38,266 fires causing a loss of \$18,166,701. The average claim paid was less than \$500, representing not more than 29 per cent. of the fire losses. The largest number of fires was caused by defective chimneys and flues and sparks falling on roofs. Matches carelessly thrown around and smoking was next. Spontaneous combustion due to the heating of hay etc., took a fairly heavy toll. Most of these fires could have been prevented. Farmers owe it to themselves to study the methods of lighting control by properly rodding buildings. These have been worked out by the United States department of agriculture. Bulletins on the subject can be had free. Before winter sets in remedy the defects in the chimneys and flues throughout the house. It will afford some protection and preserve the roof to fireproof the roofs of the buildings with some of the fireproof fluids or paints now on the market. There is no excuse for the fire starting from matches or cigarettes carelessly thrown down. Enforce caution on the farm, and let the first precautionary steps be the insuring of the building for a fair value.—Progressive Farmer.

SCHOOL OPENS MONDAY
