Mrs. Vernon Townsend called the meeting to order and presided for a business meeting.

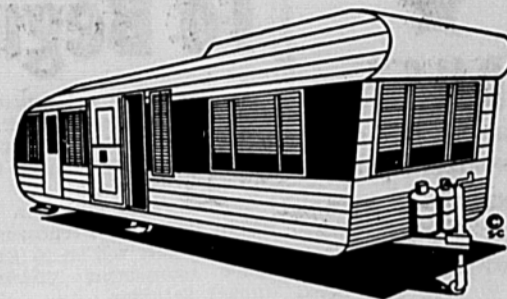
