

For hundreds of feet the canon at this point, has been worn through the solid granite. On either side are the perpendicular walls nearly a thousand feet high, and at one place but feet apart, barely giving room for the creek and roadway be-tween them. Indeed, the whole space was originally occupied by the stream, which had to be crowded from its bed. A short distance beyond the pillars of Hercules, on the left, is Observatory point.
