On another page will be found synopsis of the opinion rendered by Independent School District, fury $\mid$ ed by theattorneys for the district. The court holds that Independen Schoo: Districts cannot levy over 2
cents on the hundred. If that is the cents on the hundred. If that is the law every school district in Texa will be seriously hampered and the school reduced to only the state and county funds where bonds have been issued. Clyde and Cottonwood, the other two districts that have issued bonds, we believe voted a 50 cent tax According to this decision they have exceeded the limit by 30 cts . Baird voted a maximum of 75 cts for bonds and manntenance tax, but only levied 53 cents for this year. Just whether we can collect even 20 cts for this year is a serious question with us just now. If we cannot our school will soon be forced to close,
