Applications To Transfer Students Must Be Filed By July 15

The State Board of Education announced in a letter to all school districts, dated June 10, 1969, that all applications for transfer of students from one district to another must be filed on or before July 15, 1969. Senate Bill No. 435 passed by the Texas Legislature, changed the procedure for filing transfer requests It is now necessary that parents file an application for transfer with the school district to which the students are transferred. It is no longer necessary to file these requests with the County Superintendents.

The July 15 deadline will be for the 1969-70 school year only, The deadline for subsequent years will be June 1. The only exceptions to these deadline dates will be for extreme. In ariship cases Hardship transfer applications may be filed until October 1, and they must be filed directly with the Texas Education Agency.

Applications for transfer of students are available in the file of the superintendent of all Callahan County schools, Parents are urged to make this application prior to the deadline because there will be no extension of the deadlines.
