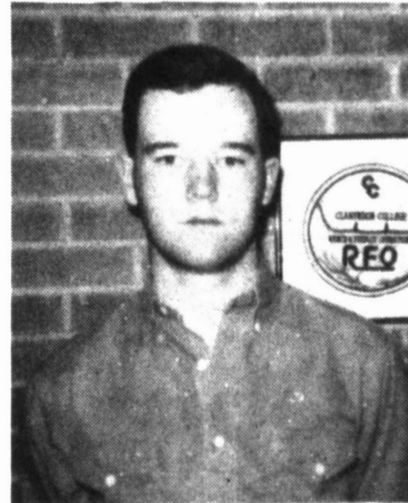

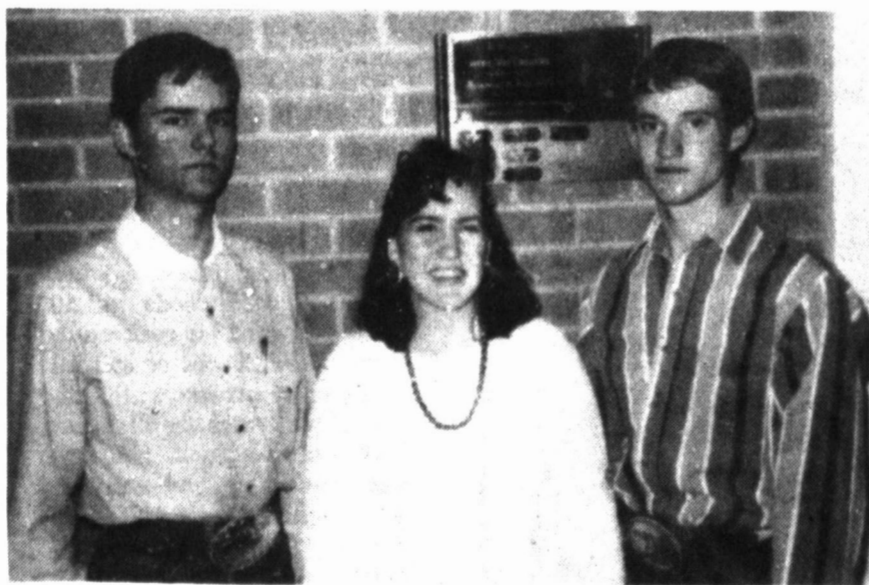
When we were dealing with environmental matters as serious as changes in our climate, we need to find possible solutions for the

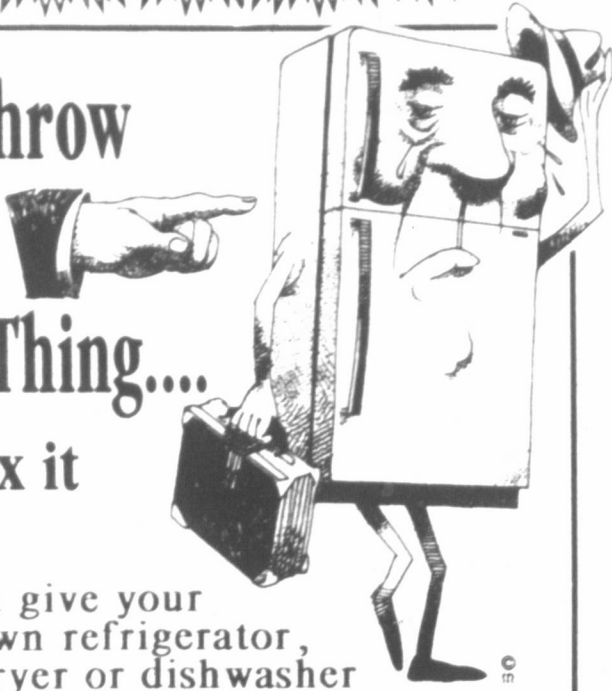

Digitalis Side Effects: What to Look For

Digitalis is a common name for a group of medicines that have been prescribed for over 200 years to treat congestive heart failure. It was not until the 1940s that the mechanism of action of the digitalis medicines became known. The most commonly prescribed of the digitalis medicines is digoxin.

Digitalis causes an increase in the output of the heart without causing a corresponding increase in blood pressure. Digitalis commonly is used with diuretic medicines (water pills) for the treatment of heart failure. One of the problems associated with digoxin use is its so-called "narrow therapeutic index." What this means is that the difference between an effective blood level and a toxic blood level of medicine is very narrow. If digitalis is not taken correctly, adverse effects can result.

Digitalis users should be aware of adverse effects that sometimes can occur. Some persons may experience visual problems, such as altered color perception, flashing lights, or the presence of a yellow halo around objects. Gastrointestinal problems include nausea and vomiting. Other side effects include fatigue, depression, and lethargy. If side effects are suspected, the medicine should be stopped and the prescribing physician contacted.

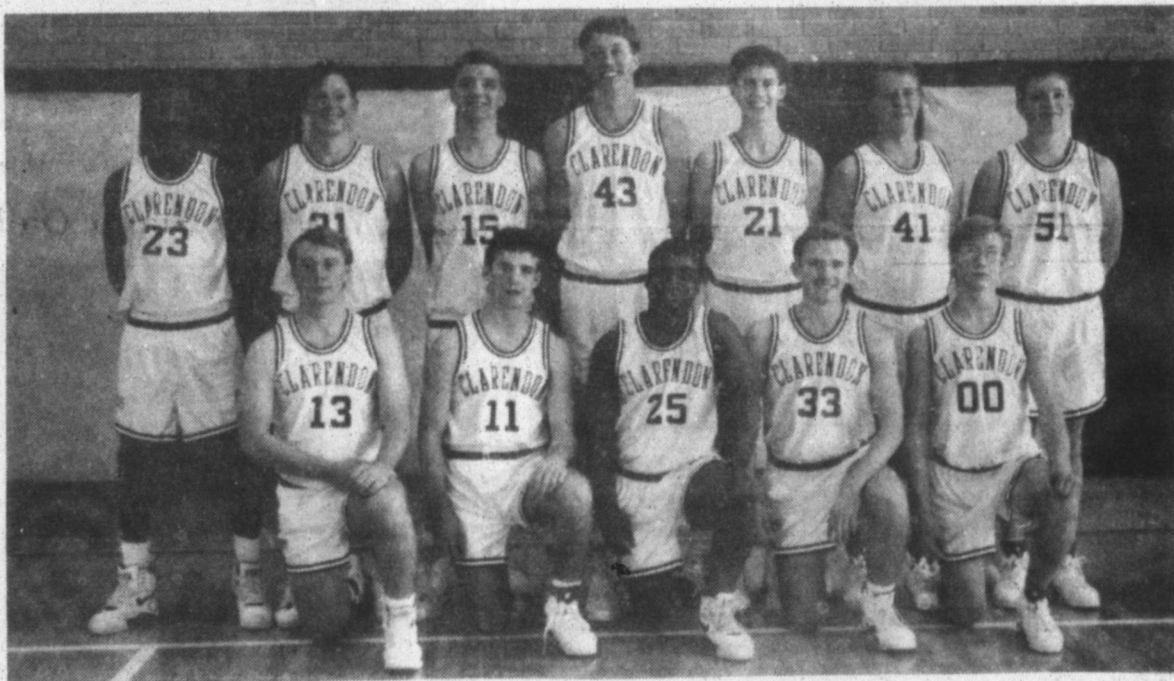

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Clarendon recognizes the validity of the Texas Property Tax Code, specifically, Section 11.01(a) "all real and tangible personal property . . . is taxable unless exempt by law" and Section 11.14(c) "The governing body of a taxing unit by resolution or order . . . may provide for taxation of tangible personal property . . . subsequent to a public hearing pursuant to Section 11.14(c) held December 28, 1989.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Commission of the City of Clarendon that all automobiles, vans, trucks, recreational vehicles, motorhomes, travel trailers, trailers, motorcycles, and aircraft required to be registered and licensed for use in Texas or the United States shall be assessed and taxed on their market value in this tax district.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY TO DEFRAY COSTS OF COLLECTION OF DELINQUENT TAXES.

WHEREAS the City Commission of the City of Clarendon deems it necessary to have a declared policy regarding the expense of collecting delinquent taxes due the City of Clarendon, and

WHEREAS the City Commission of the City of Clarendon is of the opinion that said expense of collecting said delinquent taxes should be borne by the delinquent

properties and their owners who are responsible for causing such expenses.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Commission of the City of Clarendon:

Section 1: Whenever any accounts for delinquent taxes owed the City of Clarendon are given to its tax attorney for collection, on or after July 1 of the year they become delinquent, the City of Clarendon shall be entitled to, and shall collect, an additional penalty of fifteen (15%) percent of the delinquent taxes and penalty (including any interest owed) due on each delinquent property at the time of collection, either before or after suit and or foreclosure sale, as provided by Section 33.07 of the Texas Property Tax Code.

Section 2: In addition to the collection expenses provided for in Section 1 above, the City of Clarendon shall be entitled to collect the actual expenses incurred by the Donley County Appraisal District in providing all data and information as to the name, identity, and location of necessary parties and the legal description of property necessary parties and the legal description of property necessary to the filing of any suit for delinquent taxes.

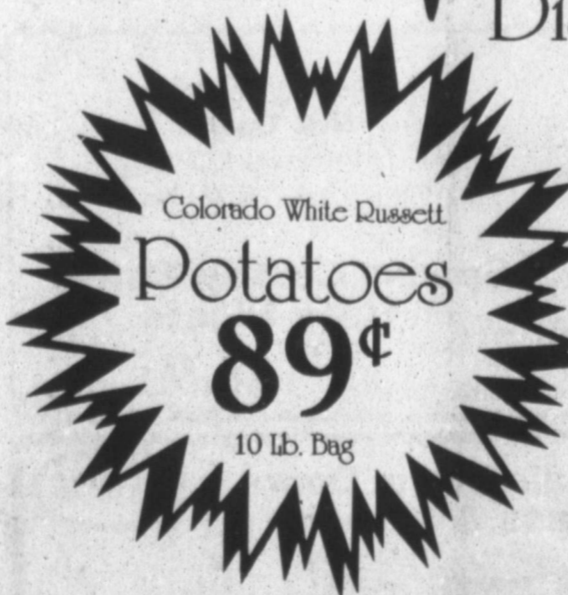
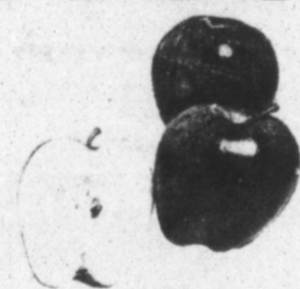
