

## BAIRD SCHOOL CHANGES CLASS ROOM TIME FOR 3 MONTHS

BAIRD — During the months of January, February and March the Baird school will begin classes at 8:45 a. m. and dismiss at 3:55 p. m. On April 1st, the regular schedule will be resumed.

Beginning January 8th, the time schedule will be as follows:

8:40 - first bell  
8:45-9:40 - first period  
9:43-10:39 - second period  
10:41-11:36 - third period  
11:39-12:34 - fourth period  
12:34-1:04 - noon  
1:04-1:59 - fifth period  
2:02-2:57 - sixth period  
3:00-3:55 - seventh period.

Other energy saving measures to be taken are:

A 15 percent reduction in energy consumption.

Set all thermostats at 68 degrees during cold weather and at 78 degrees during warm weather.

Reduce the setting of all thermostats to 65 degrees a half hour prior to the departure of students from a building and reset the thermostats to 68 degrees one hour prior to the arrival of students in the morning.

Turn off all unnecessary lighting.

Close off and reduce heat to the minimum in all portions of buildings not necessary to the

## CHARLES FINNELL ANNOUNCES FOR STATE SENATOR 30th DIS.

AUSTIN — State Representative Charles Finnell of Holliday, Thursday became the first candidate to file officially for office of State Senator from the 30th District which includes Callahan County.

"That makes it official; we're off and running!" Finnell said. "This is a good way to start the new year; I look forward to bringing our campaign to all

parts of this district and to working closely with the citizens of Callahan County."

In compliance with the new Texas election laws, Finnell filed with the State Democratic Executive Committee and paid the filing fee although the fee is no longer a legal prerequisite.

The 30 year-old legislator has served four terms in the Texas House of Representatives where he has represented eight Northwest Texas counties. Last month the constituents of the eight counties honored Finnell and wife, Merrill, with an Appreciation Dinner which attracted more than 500 area supporters.

The Texas Farm Bureau Insurance Companies pay volunteer fire departments this sum when the department works at a fire in rural areas involving property insured by them.

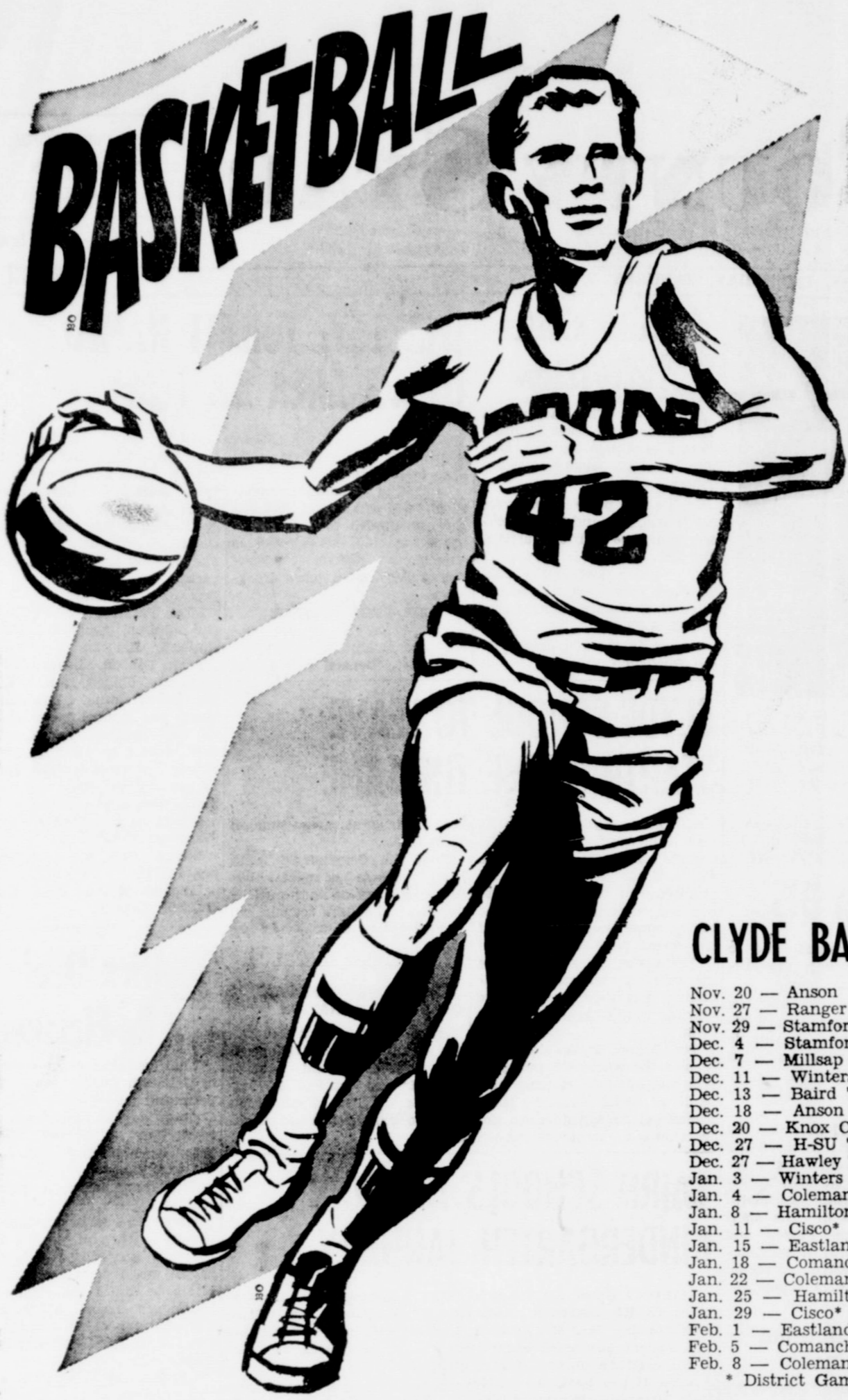

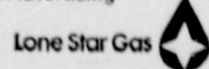

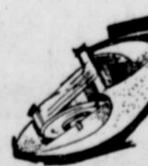
