City accepts changes for swimming pool

Summer business drew the attention of the Muenster City Council at the Monday, April 6 meeting.

It was the recommendation of the Muenster Park Board to again hire Shirley Hess as pool manager. They recommended increasing her salary to \$9.50 per hour since she hadn't had an increase in some time and the minimum wage is going up to \$7.25 on July 1. Beginning salary for life guards is \$6.55 per hour. An additional 25¢ per hour is added for each year that a life guard returns.

Life guard training will cost \$180 per life guard if the training can't be given locally. This training is required before anyone can serve as a life guard. It was suggested that the City might reimburse that cost to anyone who stays on the job through the summer.

The Park Board recommended keeping the admission fee to the pool the same, but suggested an increase for hourly pool rental. That amount last year was \$50 and the suggested increase

is to \$60 an hour (includes two life guards). All recommendations of the Park Board were approved.

Muenster Water District asked the City Council to consider allowing the Water District to use City employees for minor repairs and maintenance at Muenster Lake. City Administrator Stan Endres stated that the Water District Board has been contracting out when anything needs repairs, which is expensive since most have a minimum labor time that is charged. "As long as it's something that wouldn't be more than just a few hours, I don't see any reason that the Council couldn't approve that the City employees help the Water District out like that," Endres said. "It would be each individual thing that might come up. If our guys are free, they could go try to repair it for them. If we have a big job we are working on, we would have to delay it or tell them no."

Dwayne Rohmer of the Water Board explained the reasons for the request. "We'd just like to work up

some kind of reimbursement program for a city employee or two to do the work and we'd reimburse them for their time," he said. "We've paid \$50 to \$75 for some of that work." His goal is to cut some of those expenses by 50%.

No objections were voiced to the proposal. Mayor John Pagel suggested that Endres work up a rate proposal that would be fair. It will be presented at the May meeting and voted on at that time.

Steve Gilland gave the audit report for FY 2007-08. He noted that it was an unqualified or clean audit report with no internal weaknesses identified nor were there any significant deficiencies, and no material non-compliance. "That's what we like to see from an auditor's perspective," he said.

Looking at the General Fund, Gilland commented on the taxes receivable of \$3,342. "That's a very small amount for the City to have," he remarked. "The primary reason is that the tax collections have been historically good and continue to be so."

The City Council unanimously accepted the report.

Endres asked the Council if they still favored the purchase of a new Skagg mower. It is smaller than the one now being used. A smaller one would make mowing in places with many trees such as the City Park, Library, and Muenster Museum much easier. Also, a second mower will allow the employees to finish more of the mowing in a more timely manner. The purchase of a mower at \$6,983 was approved.

Reporting on City projects and activities, Endres explained that there had been a change in the manor that the City sewer line was to be brought from Sixth Street to the Fleitman Subdivision. Normally the City puts in the first 100' of any expansion. At the last meeting, the City thought that they would give \$1,000 to the Fleitmans who would do the work themselves instead of the labor. Fleitmans decided that the \$1,000 was insufficient, so the City laid the

Norman J. Luke
1921 - 2009

Norman John Luke, 87, departed this life on April 7, 2009 following a brain hemorrhage.

He was born on Nov. 22, 1921 to Joseph and Bertha Margarethe (Bettie) Luke in Muenster. He graduated from Gainesville High School. Following his graduation from Gainesville Community College in 1941, he enlisted in the Navy Air Corps in February 1942. Norman was a naval aviator in the Pacific Theatre during World War II, flying PBYS. He received numerous awards including the Distinguished Flying Cross, four Air Medals, and two Commendation Ribbons. Following his discharge from active duty in January 1947, he served in the Naval Reserves until his retirement as a Lieutenant Commander in 1981.

Norman completed his college education at North Texas State University (now the University of North Texas) in Denton. After graduating with a Bachelor of Business Administration-Accounting, he joined the auditing department of Deloitte Haskins & Sells in the Dallas office. He was a Certified Public Accountant in Texas. While on assignment at United Gas Pipeline Company in Shreveport, Louisiana, he met his wife, Evelyn Lavina Schaefer. They married on April 29, 1950.

He joined United Gas Corporation in 1957 as assistant comptroller. When United Gas and Pennzoil Company merged, he was appointed Group Vice President - Accounting. Evelyn and Norman lived in Shreveport for many years until they were relocated to Houston in 1968 with Pennzoil. He was appointed to Pennzoil's Board of Directors in 1982 and served until his retirement when he became an Advisory Director. He retired effective July 1, 1988 as the Group Vice President - Accounting and Finance.

Prior to his retirement, he was an active participant in Pennzoil's four years of litigation with Texaco Inc. over the latter's interference with the Pennzoil-Getty agreement. The lawsuit resulted in the largest jury award to date (1989) of \$10.53 billion. Norman is remembered in Muenster in part for his generous donation which made the new Bettie M. Luke Muenster Public Library possible.

Norman is survived by his three children Karen Luke Chevront and her husband A. Neal Chevront of Baton Rouge, Louisiana, Susan M. Luke of Charlotte, North Carolina, and Norman J. Luke Jr. of Dallas. His grandchildren include Sarah Elizabeth Conly of New York, New York, W. Cullen Conly of Los Angeles, California, Hampton Luke Conly of Arlington, Virginia, Lauren Wampold Margolis and her husband

Alex Margolis of Steamboat Springs, Colorado, Meghan Louise Wampold of Denver, Colorado. His step-grandchild is Christa Chevront of Florence, Alabama who has a daughter Alexis Westhausen. He is survived by many dear nieces, nephews and cousins.

Norman was preceded in death by his beloved wife Evelyn Schaefer Luke on Jan. 22, 2009; his parents Joseph and Bettie Luke; and sisters Alma Marie Luke and Gwendolyn Luke.

Funeral Mass will be celebrated at St. John Vianney Catholic Church, 625 Nottingham Oaks Trail in Houston on Tuesday April 14 at 11 a.m., followed by a luncheon reception at the church. Visitation will be held at the church prior to Mass from 10 - 11 a.m. Interment will be at the VA National Cemetery, Houston, at approximately 3 p.m. His wife's remains will be buried with him.

According to Endres, quite a few people request that they be able to pay fines or water bills with credit card. He found a company that set the City up to accept VISA, MasterCard, and Discover. He said the company supplies the machines needed to do it at no charge. There is a \$10 a month service charge plus a fee of about 1.5% of the cost each time it is used for a transaction. He felt that it would help fine collections.

Discussion was held as to whether a fee could be added to the fine to cover the cost of the transaction. Endres said he would check into that possibility. They can cancel the machine service if they don't like it, he said.

Some property owners on Mesquite and Magnolia decided to wait for curbing until the economy picks up.

Restrooms in City Hall are completed. Doors are being painted by people doing community service.

TCEQ approved the lagoon closure.

Endres showed figures sent out by the Texas Comptroller's Office showing sales tax collected year-to-date by cities in Cooke County. "Muenster right now is almost 3% up from what it was last year at this same period," Endres noted. "Gainesville is 15% under and Lindsay 3% under. Oak Ridge and Valley View are just 3% and 6% over. As of this time, our sales tax are still holding up. Last month they were down 8%, but over all the year they are still hanging in there."

Year-to-date in Cooke County \$2,074,384.81 in sales tax were collected. That is down 14.19% from the same period in 2008.

In other business conducted at the April 6 meeting, the City Council:

- Approved payment of bills totaling \$73,659.06.
- Approved request by Muenster Chamber of Commerce to sell alcoholic beverages in the City Park during Germanfest.

- Approved closing of Maple Street from Cross Street to Hwy. 82 during Germanfest, April 24, 25, 26 as requested by the Chamber of Commerce.

- Certified the three candidates for City Council and canceled the May 9 election since there is no opposition in the three open positions.





USDA extends DCP, Counter-cyclical and ACRE sign-up deadline

Secretary of Agriculture Tom Vilsack announced recently that USDA has extended the sign-up deadline from June 1, to Aug. 14, 2009, for both the Direct and Counter-cyclical Program (DCP) and the forthcoming

Average Crop Revenue Election (ACRE) Program. This action extends the sign-up deadline by 10 weeks to give producers ample time to decide whether to participate in ACRE or remain in DCP.

"Extending the DCP and ACRE sign-up deadline will help ensure that America's farmers have enough information and time to determine whether to participate in the ACRE Program. The DCP and ACRE programs play a critical role in the farm safety net and it is vital that we act to support the hard work of the farmers we depend on," Vilsack said.

Sign-up for ACRE is expected to start in late April, with an official sign-up announcement to be made in the coming weeks. Producers can elect ACRE at their FSA county office after the sign-up period commences. The original June 1 deadline may have forced producers to rush their decision, which is why this extension gives producers more time to make an informed decision about staying with DCP for 2009 or participating in ACRE for crop year 2009 and beyond through 2012.

Freeze Damage to Small Grains

Based on the weather station reports and personal observation, some of the wheat crop in Cooke County may be injured due to freezing temperatures. Depending on the growth stage, freeze damage can be very detrimental to yields. The more mature the plant, the greater the yield impact. Cooke County has suffered several days where freeze injury may have occurred.

Some low lying locations have had noticeable damage prior to last Tuesday's freeze. With temperatures dropping below freezing earlier this week, it is probable that more damage has occurred. It is still too early to note the extent of that damage, as it is usually at least seven days before the level of injury can be accurately assessed. The following information has been taken from the Texas AgriLife Extension Service Publication, "Freeze Injury in Wheat."

Injury symptoms of wheat resulting from freezing temperatures

Listed by growth stage; 2 - approximate injurious temperature (2 hours); 3 - primary symptoms; 4 - yield effect.

Tillering; 2- 12 F (-11 C); 3 - leaf chlorosis; burning of leaf tips; silage odor; blue cast to fields; 4 - slight to moderate.

Jointing; 2 - 24 F (-4 C); 3 - death of growing point; leaf yellowing or burning; lesions, splitting, or bending of lower stem; odor; 4 - moderate to severe.

Boot; 2 - 28 F (-2 C); 3 - floret sterility; spike trapped in boot; damage to lower stem; leaf discoloration; odor; 4 - moderate to severe.

Heading; 2 - 30 F (-1 C); 3 - floret sterility; white awns or white heads; damage to lower stem; leaf discoloration; odor; 4 - severe.

Flowering; 2 - 32 F (0 C); 3 - floret sterility; white awns or white heads; damage to lower stem; leaf discoloration; odor; 4 - severe.

Milk; 2 - 28 F (-2 C); 3 - white awns or white heads; damage to lower stems; leaf discoloration; shrunk, roughened, or discolored kernels; moderate to severe.

Dough; 2 - 28 F (-2 C); 3 - shriveled, discolored kernels; poor germination; 4 - slight to moderate.

Productivity appraisal helps reduce property taxes on farms and ranches

Farmers and ranchers may be eligible for property tax relief on their land. They may apply to the Cooke County Appraisal District for agricultural productivity appraisal, a lower appraisal of their land based on what it will produce, rather than what it would sell for on the open market.

There are two types of agricultural productivity appraisal, 1-d-1 and 1-d, named for the sections of the Texas Constitution that authorize them. Most property owners apply for 1-d-1 appraisal. To qualify, the owner must use the land for agriculture or growing timber. This form of appraisal does not restrict ownership to individuals and does not require agriculture to be the owner's primary business. Owners must show that the land has been devoted principally to the qualifying use for at least five of the preceding seven years.

The qualifications for 1-d are more stringent. Under 1-d, the owner must file an application for productivity appraisal each year. The owner must be an individual — not a corporation, partnership, agency, or organization. The land must have had an agricultural use for at least three years. The owner's primary job and source of income must be agriculture.

The deadline to apply for productivity appraisal is April 30. Those who must file include owners of land qualified for 1-d appraisal, landowners whose property did not previously receive 1-d-1 appraisal, and new owners of qualified land.

If the AG property is located in a taxing unit that overlaps into Cooke County, the owner need only apply for productivity appraisal at the Cooke County Appraisal District.
