Local Students Attend Leadership Conference

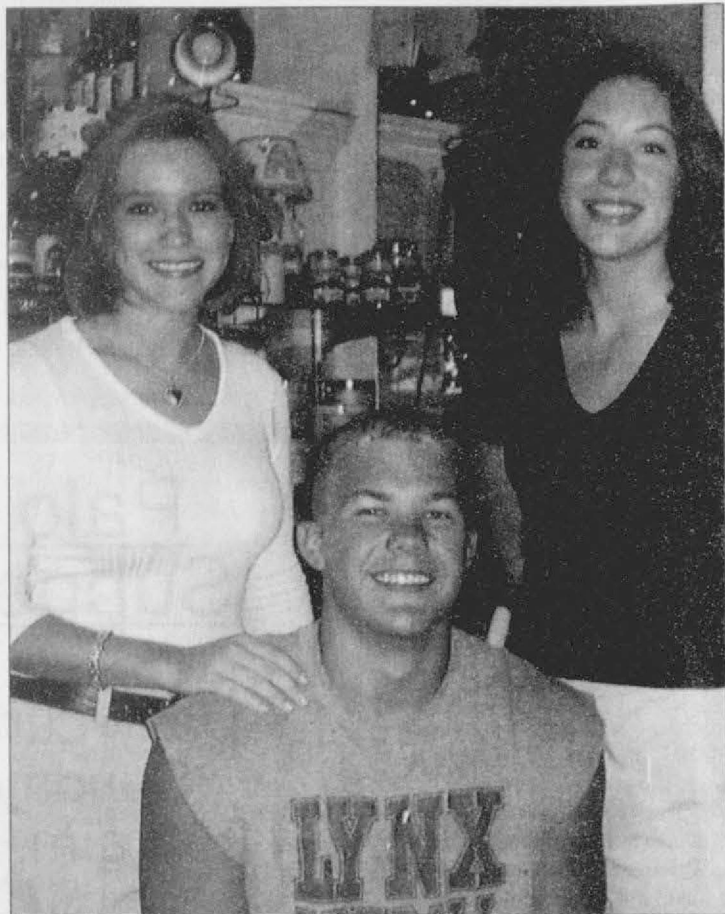

Whitewater, Wisconsin is a small town not unlike Spearman. It is the campus for Whitewater College and is in the middle of nowhere with just a few restaurants and stores lining its streets. As the week began, I could see that this was going to be one of the most unique experiences of my life.

Our days were quite routine. In the mornings we all walked to breakfast and then on to morning seminar. Seminars consisted of a speaker that talked on a specific topic, a world affair that he/she specialized in. After his talk, there would be a question and answer period where the students were encouraged to ask about anything they did not understand. After Seminar, we would break up into small groups and discuss in detail the speaker, the issues, and what we could do to help with this problem.

So for hours on end the girls in my dorm would congregate in the basement, order pizza and soft drinks, and visit about our geographical location, the kinds of lifestyles we led, and the funny accents everyone else had. I guess I really didn't realize just how severe my accent was until I heard everybody else speak. I constantly heard giggles after I talked aloud in a group. It didn't bother me though, learning about other cultures and lifestyles

was one of the most enriching aspects of the trip.

Needless to say, after a week of staying up late and getting up early to go to seminar in the morning, Kelsey, Syd and I were quite beat. The plane ride home was quiet this time, with each of us absorbed in our thoughts and memories of the trip. It was an educational camp, yes, but it wasn't just lessons in politics and the environment that I learned. Of all the different types of individuals around the world, there is a tie that binds: the fact that we are all living on Earth and we are all faced with the same problems. As I looked over an auditorium full of 1500 high school seniors concerned with the future of their world, I became comforted by the thought that all we need is people that want to make a difference, and the rest will fall into place.

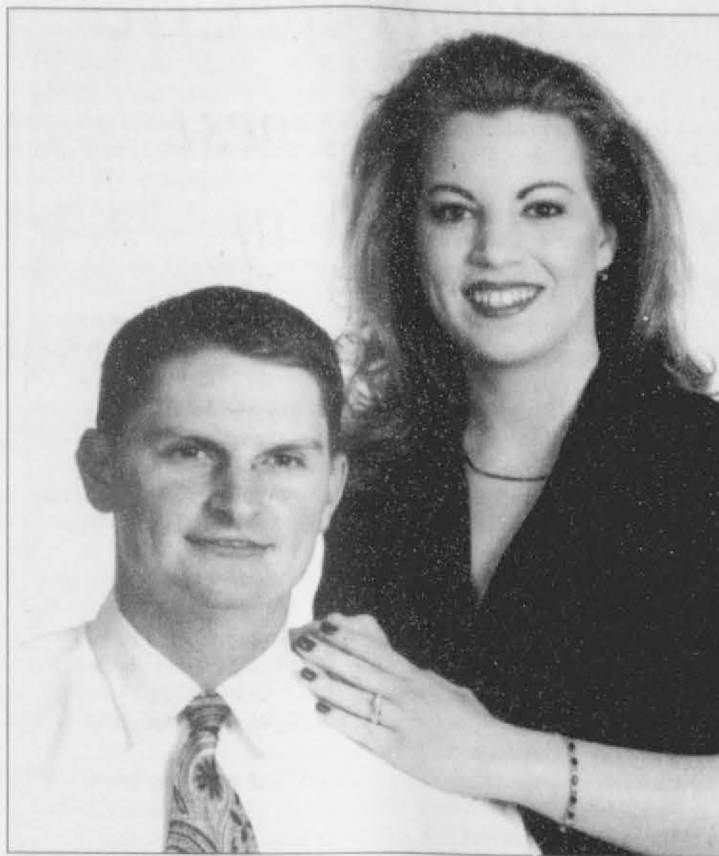
How to Shower like a Woman

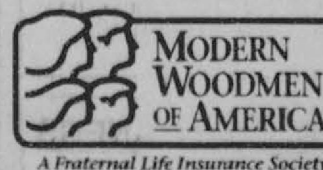

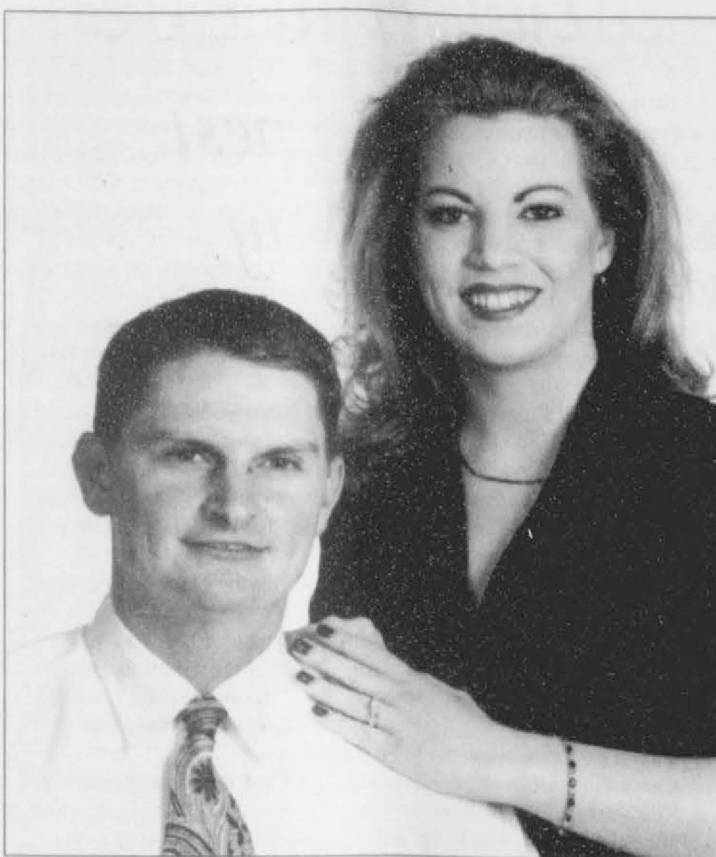
How to Shower like a Woman

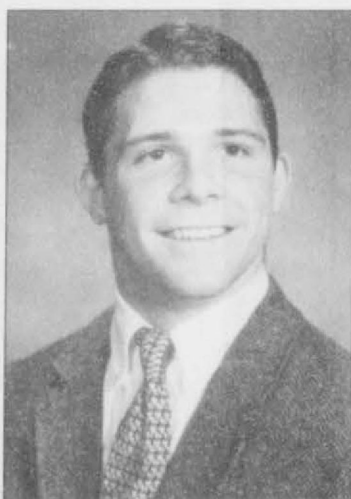

Last week Irene Baker of Spearman told me about having a strange animal eating their cat food on the patio some time ago. Friends told them they were seeing a 'possum. The next morning after I talked to Irene, Marguerite Nelson told me about going over to the Lake the night before. They saw deer, turkeys, herons, and egrets, but the real surprise was when they got home to Gruver that night and found a 'possum on their driveway. It was a first for Archie to see one of these animals in Hansford County.

This made me wonder about the 'possum population of our county. Joel Stavlo said he used to trap them on the Palo Duro, and I can remember as a child, my father killing a female with the little tiny

hairless babies clinging to her. Jim has never seen one at the Park, and my grandchildren that live on the creek have yet to see one there.

Slightly larger than the average house cat, the opossum is America's only native marsupial. After 12 days of gestation the tiny bean-sized babies crawl from the birth canal up to the mother's pouch, where the lucky ones latch on to nipples that swell and hold the babies in place. There may be up to 23 young with only 13 nipples, so the strongest survive. They stay in the pouch for more than 2 months. When about mouse size, they crawl out and ride around on the mother's back with times out for refreshment. When their legs are strong enough to hold up the little fat bodies, they toddle beside their mothers until large enough to go it alone.

Jan Williamson made a motion, with a second from Jim Younger, to accept the financial statement and pay the July bills. Motion carried.

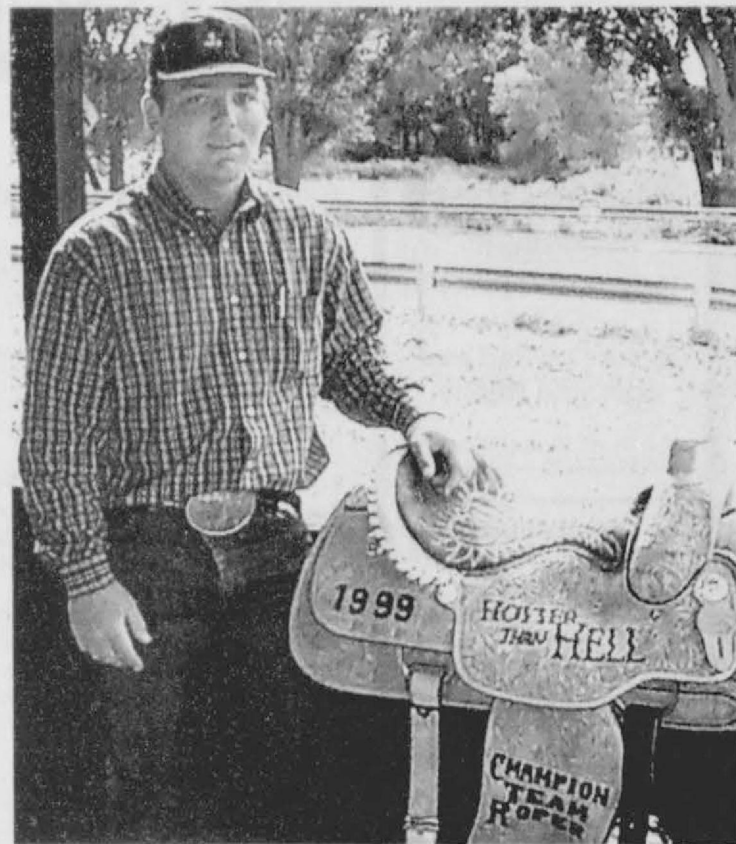
